




**The rental vacancy rate is the proportion of the rental inventory that is vacant "for rent." It is computed by dividing the total number of vacant units "for rent" by the sum of the renter-occupied units, vacant units that are "for rent," and vacant units that have been rented but not yet occupied; and then multiplying by 100.

Percent Spending More Than 30% of Income on Rent





Percent Spending More Than 30% of Income on Mortgage













Chart x: Number of Teen Births for Selected Contra Costa Cities 2008 - 2010






Chart x: Number of Teen Births for Selected Contra Costa Cities 2008 - 2010

Residents 25 years and older with less than a high school degree, 2010









Chart x. Richmond: Number of Violent Crimes (2005-2012)

Percent Drop in Violent Crime by Beat





Chart x. Richmond: Number of Homicides (2000-2012)

Number of Property Crimes by Beat




Chart x. Richmond: Number of Property Crimes (2004-2012)








Food Retail Environment Index by neighborhood




Number of residents within a ¼ mile of a healthy food outlet by census block




Number of healthy food outlets by neighborhood




Number of residents within a ¼ mile of an unhealthy food outlet by census block





Communities within ¼-mile of parks and open space, 2010



Transportation landscape—routes and car ownership














Median household income, census tract, 2010




Median household income by race/ethnicity, Richmond 2010




Percent of population living below 200% FPL, census tract 2000

Percent of population living below 200% FPL, with elementary school catchments shown, census tract 2010




Percent of linguistically isolated households, census tract, 2010






Proportion of Latinos by Census Block, depicting neighborhoods



Proportion of African Americans by Census Block, depicting neighborhoods




Proportion of Non-Hispanic Whites by Census Block, depicting neighborhoods
