Only One More Week of Treecycling and Non-Compostable Tree Disposal

The Community Development, Environmental, and Health Initiatives division encourage residents to utilize one of the five ways listed on the flyer for disposing of holiday trees. The information and flyer is also available at www.richmondenvironment.org.

Holiday Treecycling and Non-Compostable Tree Disposal

The Environmental and Health Initiatives Division encourages residents to consider the options below for disposing of Holiday Trees. Information about free treecycling, bulky item, and Household Hazardous Waste programs available to Richmond residents can be found by visiting www.richmondenvironment.org.

Below are the options available for Holiday Tree Disposal:

1. **Curbside Collection:** Cut your tree to fit your organic waste container. Trees must be 6" or less in diameter and cut to 3' in length. Natural trees go in compost. Remove decorations, plastic, cloth, ornaments and stand before composting. No flocked, painted, fireproofed, or artificial trees in compost. Artificial trees go in the trash container.
2. **On Call Bulky Pick-up:** If you have not already used your allocated On-Call Curbside Bulky Clean-Up(s), call Republic Customer Service office at (510) 262-7100 to arrange for no cost curbside pick-up. Trees more than 6' feet tall must be cut in half. Must be scheduled in advance.
3. **For Fee Curbside Collection:** If you are unable to cut your tree to fit in your container, call Republic Customer Service office at (510) 262-7100 to arrange "For Fee" curbside collection \$19.62/tree. Must be scheduled in advance.
4. **Self-Haul (Drop-off):** With proof of residence (driver's license or CA ID), Republic Services customers can take Christmas Trees to Golden Bear Transfer (#1 Parr Blvd, Richmond Monday - Friday, 7:00 AM – 5:00 PM; Sat-Sun, 9:00 AM – 5:00 PM) through the 1st weekend of February for compostable trees for free. There is a \$11.55 disposal fee for non-compostable trees, or no proof of residency.
5. **Donate to Local Organizations:** Local Boy Scouts and youth groups will pick up trees in exchange for a donation.

Compostable Christmas Treecycling and Non-compostable Tree Disposal Options (For City of Richmond)

- 1. Curbside Collection:**
On any of your regular organic waste collection days, cut your unflocked, natural tree to fit in your organic waste container. Trees must be 6' or less in diameter and cut to 3' in length. Remove stand and all decorations. Artificial, flocked, ornament contaminated trees are not compostable. Cut or trim to fit in brown trash container and set out on any regular trash collection day.

IMPORTANT GUIDELINES FOR COMPOSTING CHRISTMAS TREES—PLEASE:

- Remove all lights, ornaments, tinsel, nails and stands.
- No flocked, painted, fireproofed, artificial or trees contaminated with decorations, stands, or plastic or cloth



- 2. On-call Bulky Pick-up:**
If you have not already used your allocated On-Call Curbside Bulky Clean up(s), call our Customer Service office to arrange for no cost curbside pick up. Trees 6' tall or more must be cut in half.



- 3. For Fee Curbside Collection:**
If you're unable to cut/trim your compostable tree to fit in your organic waste container or non compostable tree (artificial, flocked, contaminated with ornaments, stands, plastic, cloth wrapped) in the brown container, call our Customer Service office to arrange "For Fee" curbside collection \$19.62/tree. On Call and "For Fee" pick-ups must be scheduled in advance—call 510.262.7100.



- 4. Self-haul (Drop-off):**
With proof of residency (driver's license or CA ID), Republic Services customers can take Christmas Trees to Golden Bear Transfer (#1 Parr Blvd, Richmond, M.F. 7am-5pm; Sat-Sun, 9am-5pm) thru the 1st weekend in February at no cost for compostable trees; \$11.55 (subject to change) disposal fee for non-compostable trees, or no proof of residency.



- 5. Donating to local Organizations:**
In addition to the above services, some local Boy Scout troops and youth organizations in Richmond collect Christmas Trees in exchange for a donation.

Reciclaje de Árboles de Navidad Compostables y Opciones de Disposición de Árboles que No son Compostables (Para la Ciudad de Richmond)

- 1. Recolección en la Acera:**
En cualquier día de su servicio regular de recolección de desecho verde, corte su árbol natural sin escarcha de tal tamaño que pueda caber en el depósito de desecho verde. Los árboles deben ser de 6 pulgadas o menos de diámetro y cortados a 3 pies de largo. Quite la base y todos los adornos del árbol. Los árboles artificiales, con escarcha y contaminados de adornos no son compostables. Corte o recorte el árbol de tal tamaño que pueda caber en el depósito café y colóquelo para colección en su día regular de recolección de basura.

PAUTAS IMPORTANTES PARA EL COMPOSTAJE DE ÁRBOLES DE NAVIDAD POR FAVOR:

- Quite todas las luces, decoraciones, oropel, clavos y los soportes del árbol.
- No se aceptan los árboles con escarcha, pintados, preparados contra fuego, artificiales o contaminados de adornos, soportes o envolturas de plástico o tela.



- 2. Recogido de Objetos Voluminosos por Llamada:**
Si aún no ha usado su día designado de la Llamada de Limpieza de Objetos Voluminosos, llame a nuestra oficina de Servicio al Cliente para programar una recolección sin costo. Los árboles de 6 pies de altura deben ser cortados por la mitad.



- 3. Recolección en la Acera por una Cuota:**
Si usted no puede cortar / recortar su árbol natural compostable para que pueda caber en su depósito de desecho verde o cortar su árbol no compostable (artificial, con escarcha, contaminado con adornos, bases, envueltos en plástico o tela) llame a nuestra oficina de Servicio al Cliente para programar una recolección "Por Cuota" \$19.62/árbol. La Llamada de Recolección y "Por Cuota" deben ser programadas con anticipación - llame al 510.262.7100.



- 4. De Transporte Propio (Leve su Árbol):**
Con comprobante de residencia (licencia de conducir o identificación de CA) los clientes de Republic Services pueden llevar los árboles de Navidad a la estación de Transferencia Golden Bear (#1 Parr Blvd, Richmond, de lunes a viernes, 7am a 5pm; sábados y domingos, 9am a 5pm) durante el primer fin de semana en febrero, sin costo para los árboles compostables; una cuota de \$11.55 (sujeto a cambios) se cobrará para la disposición de los árboles no compostables, o si no tiene comprobante de residencia.



- 5. Donar a las Organizaciones Locales:**
Además de los servicios mencionados, algunas tropas de Boy Scouts locales y organizaciones juveniles en Richmond recolectan los árboles de Navidad a cambio de una donación.

Opening of Project-Based Voucher Waiting Lists

The Housing Authority of the County of Contra Costa (HACCC) is announcing the opening of project-based voucher waiting lists. Beginning Monday, February 10, 2020, at 10:00 A.M. until Thursday, February 13, 2020, at 4:00 P.M., pre-applications will be accepted for the properties listed below.

Pre-applications can **only** be submitted online at: www.contracostahousing.org. Please note there will not be any on-site applications and HACCC office locations will not be distributing pre-applications. Incomplete pre-applications or partially completed pre-applications will not be accepted. Pre-applications received after the February 13, 2020, 4:00 P.M. deadline will not be accepted.

Eligible families will be referred to units subsidized with Section 8 Project-Based Vouchers from the Housing Authority of the County of Contra Costa in partnership

with non-profit housing owners. The housing assistance is only available at the designated properties for families meeting the property restrictions as indicated above. After twelve months of residency, families will be eligible for a Housing Choice Voucher, subject to availability.

Fiscal Year 2020-2021 ECIA Grant Program Applications are Available!

In 2014, the Richmond City Council approved the Chevron Environmental and Community Investment Agreement (ECIA), which invests \$90 million dollars into the Richmond community over 10-years. \$6 million of those dollars have been set aside for a competitive grant program, designed for non-profits who serve Richmond in the areas of community, youth, and youth sports. The ECIA has grant awards that range from \$5,000, up to \$50,000.

Important changes have been made to the grant guidelines, especially the eligibility criteria, so please read them carefully. Of special note, organizations awarded grants of more than \$10,000 in FY 19-20 are ineligible to apply in FY 20-21.

With the March primary two months away, the NAACP is stressing the importance of not just the black vote, but the right to vote for everyone.



Ready Together! Organize your Block for Disaster Preparedness Class

We can build community and resilience at the same time and have fun doing it. Join CERTRichmond for a free class called Ready Together! Organize Your Block for Disaster Preparedness.

In this 4-series class you'll learn how to support your community to be better prepared for a disaster. After an earthquake, people will come out in the street, and by taking this class, your block will have a plan of what to do next. This investment in your time will create community and can possibly save lives!

Discussing a block map, including gas shutoffs

Meeting #2: Connecting with Neighbors

All people who sign-up will get a packet of resources to help their block get organized. It will include steps on how to get individualized households prepared and a block emergency toilet plan. Your block will create a map of gas shut offs, know how to support community members with special needs, and have a plan of what to do after you have made sure your family is safe. **We encourage people to take this course with a household member or other neighbor.**







The City of Richmond's Water Resource Recovery Department administers the Sewer Lateral Grant Program. The program reimburses eligible homeowners in the Richmond Municipal Sewer District (RMSD No. 1) for some of the cost to replace their sewer lateral.

The program is open and accepting applications for the 2019-2020 Fiscal Year.

The City of Richmond recommends obtaining estimates from at least three (3) contractors.

Eligibility:

- ◆ Parcels served by the City of Richmond Sanitary Municipal Sewer District.
- ◆ Sewer lateral replacement must be completed **BEFORE** applying for the Sewer Lateral Grant Program.
- ◆ A full line replacement must be completed during the fiscal year July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020.
- ◆ If you have previously received a Sewer Lateral Grant reimbursement, you will not be eligible to apply.

Required Documents:

- ◆ Only Lateral Grant Applications dated 6/05/2019 or newer will be accepted.
- ◆ Contractor's final paid in full invoice.
- ◆ Proof of payment (copy of canceled check, credit card receipt, or bank statement are accepted).
- ◆ Certificate of Lateral Compliance (issued by the City after encroachment permit inspections are approved).
- ◆ Grant Deed (change of ownership taken place within last 3 months and/or if property is under a Trust).
- ◆ Tax-exempt organizations must submit proof of tax-exempt status.

Award Details:

- Each fiscal year the City allocates sewer lateral grant funds to be awarded for private sewer lateral replacement.
- This program can be suspended at any time without prior or advanced notification or posting.
- Property owner(s) are eligible for **ONE (1)** sewer lateral grant reimbursement award in a lifetime on a first come first serve basis until all sewer lateral funds are exhausted.
- Starting July 1, 2019 and ending June 30, 2020, the complete sewer lateral grant reimbursement amount is \$1,800 per application.
- Incomplete applications will **NOT** be accepted.
- All applications **MUST** be submitted in person. Any applications submitted via email or mail will **NOT** be accepted.
- No applications will be accepted after the sewer lateral grant funds are exhausted.
- Reimbursement may take approximately 3 weeks from the date the completed application is received and approved by the City.


Apple version of APP

Using the CORConnect Application on the City's Website:

You can use the **CORConnect** button on the City's website (<http://www.ci.richmond.ca.us/>) to report any comments, questions or concerns regarding the work being done by City staff. The CORConnect issues go directly to the responsible department, and the city manager reviews reported issues on a regular basis to determine if City staff members are responding appropriately. If you do not feel that you have received a satisfactory response, please contact the City Manager's Office at (510) 620-6512.

To access **CORConnect** select the CORConnect button on the homepage of the City website.



Alternatively, you can select the **COR Connect** button on any other webpage on the left hand side of the page.



On the next screen under Report an Issue select Report Issue/Concern to create a report or Search Issue/Concerns to look up a previously reported issue. You can also look up previously submitted issues to check on the current status if you provided you name, phone number or email when you submitted it.



On the page, you can also look up information on a parcel, see permits issued and look up business license information. If you have a current business license you can pay to renew it online with a credit card.

The recommended browsers are: **Microsoft Edge**, or **Microsoft Internet Explorer version 11** using the compatibility mode. It can be found in the upper right corner of Internet Explorer: click on the "gear" icon and select Compatibility View Settings, then add the site to the list and click "Close".
