

## Upcoming Community Services Programs

### **Outdoor Dining, Curbside Retail, and Special Event Permits in Richmond, CA**

*as of July 16, 2020*



The City of Richmond is providing opportunities for businesses impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic to utilize public and privately-owned outdoor areas, including parking lots, for outdoor dining and retail use.

Richmond businesses may apply for a permit to use a sidewalk or parking space in front of their location for business operation by contacting the Community Services Department, Recreation Division at [csdregistration@ci.richmond.ca.us](mailto:csdregistration@ci.richmond.ca.us) or by visiting [www.richca-communityservices.org](http://www.richca-communityservices.org) to obtain an application.

All business will be required to complete the following for an outdoor dining permit:

1. Outdoor dining and curbside retail application
2. Site diagram
3. ABC permit (if serving alcohol outdoors)
4. Certificate of liability insurance (if operating on public property)

In addition, special event permits are required for the following: protests, vigils, marches, and large gatherings. Visit the website listed for the process and forms.

#### **City of Richmond begins art installation, park development honoring Ohlone and Miwok at shellmound site**

**What:** This is a community advisory that the City of Richmond has begun development of an art installation in the park space along Pierson Avenue and South 27<sup>th</sup> Street honoring an Ohlone and Miwok shellmound burial site.

In 2015 when the excavation began for the development of the Officer Bradley A. Moody Memorial Underpass, a shellmound burial ground dating back hundreds of years was discovered and attributed the Ohlone and Miwok Native Americans. To honor the ancestors and historic stewards of the land Richmond residents call home, the city's Arts and Culture Division, Arts and Culture Commission and the Public Art Advisory Committee agreed that the history of the Ohlone and Miwok peoples should be the focus of the public art to be installed at the site, as required pursuant to the city's Percent for Art Resolution.

The City of Richmond has commissioned local and internationally recognized artist Masayuki Nagase to carve eleven granite boulders using symbols and stories shared with him by tribal members. After several years of planning and creating the hand-carved stone boulders, the fabrication of the art is complete and the art is ready to be installed.

## 6. **Community Development Department**

### **Get counted on Census 2020! September 30<sup>th</sup> is the last day to respond.**


Starting on August 11<sup>th</sup>, Census Takers or Census Enumerators will be knocking on doors and collecting Census 2020 responses from households that have not yet responded. If you have not responded to Census 2020, be prepared for a Census Taker to knock on your door. If you respond online or by phone today, a census taker is less likely to have to visit your home to collect your response.

The Census takers:

- Have completed a COVID-19 training on social distancing and safety protocols

- Will be wearing masks and following the County’s public health guidelines
- Work between 9am and 9pm, including weekends
- Will keep your census data confidential and protected
- Have a photo ID, with a U.S. Department of Commerce watermark, and expiration date
- Will provide supervisor contact information/regional office phone number, if asked
- Were hired from the City of Richmond by the Census Bureau or a nearby community
- If no one is home when they visits, the census taker will leave a notice.

As of August 26, 2020, 68.3% of Richmond households have responded to Census 2020. With this response rate, the City has surpassed 2010 census response rate by 0.8%. While this is a great achievement, there is still one third of the city’s population that has not been counted. Every person undercounted will represent a loss of approximately \$2,000 per year. With Richmond’s current response rate, our community could miss out on an estimated \$70.4 million of funding per year over the next ten years.

Every neighborhood in the city has reached a self-response rate over 51%; however, there are still six neighborhoods that are located in the top 10 lowest self-response rate census tracts in Contra Costa County: North Richmond, Iron Triangle, Belding Woods, Coronado, Santa Fe, and Atchison Village. If you know anyone who lives in these neighborhoods, remind them to be counted. Remember, we all lose when someone is not counted! Please help spread the word of the importance of responding to the census!

Even though the response rate has grown for every neighborhood in the City, Richmond did not surpass Oakland's response rate before August 10<sup>th</sup>. Oakland Mayor Libby Schaaf was the final winner of the Census 2020 challenge. The challenge's objective was to get as many residents in Richmond and Oakland counted. Richmond's response rate grew by 2.7% while Oakland's grew by 2.9% during the challenge. As of August 26<sup>th</sup>, Richmond's response rate is 0.3% ahead of Oakland (68.0%).


**¡Cuéntese en el Censo 2020! El 30 de septiembre es el último día para responder.**

Iniciando el 11 de Agosto, las y los enumeradores del Censo estarán tocando a su puerta para recolectar las respuestas del Censo 2020 de los hogares que no han respondido. Si usted no ha respondido al Censo 2020, prepárese para que un enumerador o enumeradora toque a su puerta. Si responde hoy en línea o por teléfono, es menos probable que un enumerador(a) visite su hogar para obtener su respuesta.

Las enumeradoras y enumeradores:

- Han concluido un entrenamiento de COVID-19 en distanciamiento social y protocolos de seguridad
- Usarán cubre bocas y seguirán los lineamientos de salud pública del Condado
- Trabajan de 9am a 9pm, incluyendo fines de semana
- Mantendrán su información del censo confidencial y protegida

Al 26 de Agosto de 2020, 68.3% de los hogares de Richmond han respondido al Censo 2020. Con este nivel respuesta, la ciudad ha superado el nivel de participación del censo de 2010 en 0.8%. A pesar de este gran logro, casi un tercio de la población de nuestra ciudad no ha sido contada en este censo. Cada persona que no se cuente representa la pérdida de aproximadamente \$2,000 por año. Con la actual tasa de respuesta de Richmond, nuestra comunidad puede perder un presupuesto estimado de hasta \$70.4 millones anuales por los próximos 10 años.

Aun cuando la tasa de respuesta creció en todos los vecindarios de la ciudad, Richmond no supero la tasa de respuesta de Oakland antes del 10 de agosto, La Alcaldesa de Oakland Libby Schaaf fue la ganadora de Reto del Censo 2020. El objetivo del reto era lograr que el mayor número de personas en sus ciudades respondiera al Censo 2020. La tasa de respuesta de Richmond creció en 2.7%, mientras que la de Oakland creció 2.9% durante el reto. Al 26 de agosto, la tasa de respuesta de Richmond se encuentra 0.3% arriba de la de Oakland (68.0%).

## 7. **Fire Department**

The Richmond Fire Department takes every precaution to help protect you and your property from wildland fire. However, in a major wildland fire event, there simply may not be enough resources or firefighters to defend every home.

Successfully preparing for a wildland fire enables you to take personal responsibility to protect yourself, your family, and property. In this guide, we provide the tips and tools you need to prepare for a wildland fire threat, to have situational awareness when a fire starts, and to act early as directed by local officials.


This guide works in collaboration with other existing wildland fire public education efforts, but attempts to capture pertinent information into one document for your convenience. Additional resources are listed within this document for further information.

You are a key leader to creating change. You and the members of your community can take simple steps to increase your wildland fire preparedness. Your knowledge and actions may empower others to follow your lead, increasing their safety and potentially decreasing property loss and damage. Being prepared for a wildland fire

is vital, as responders' resources can be spread thin quickly during a wildfire event. Taking advanced personal action can result in improved safety for all involved.

Fire is, and always has been, a natural occurrence. Hills, canyons, and forests burned periodically long before homes were built. Wildland fires are fueled by a build-up of dry vegetation and driven by seasonal hot and dry winds, called "Diablo winds." These winds can quickly spread wildfires, making them extremely dangerous and difficult to control. Many people have built homes in the wildland urban interface, or "WUI," without fully understanding the impact a wildfire may have on their lives. Few have adequately prepared their families and homes for a timely evacuation in the event of a wildland fire.






Transparent Richmond aims to accomplish the following:






## Employment and Training

Kaiser Permanente School of Allied Health Sciences and The City of Richmond, YouthWORKS launched a four-week virtual program to motivate young people to

pursue careers in health care professions. The four week program prepared high school and college students for success through a diverse range of exciting topics in the field of health care and professional development. Activities included engagement with the faculty and staff of the Kaiser Permanente School Allied Health Sciences and discussions with local business owners. Students were offered an introduction to college level curriculum, explored pathways to achieve a career in the field of healthcare, participated in workshops on college essay writing and applying for scholarships, how to write a resume, being prepared for interviews, online research, and tips on finding your inner strength. The students were encouraged to think critically as they selected a medical specialty to explore, interviewed medical professionals in their fields of interest and presented their findings (virtually) to program faculty, staff, and participants' family and friends. Upon completion of the program, students presented PowerPoint presentations on selected medical specialty, and were awarded a Certificate of Completion. Some of the students have decided to pursue and enroll in the Kaiser Permanente School of Allied Health Sciences.




### Tableside Service Statistics


**Draft Ferry to Bridge to Greenway Complete Streets Plan Available for Comment**

We are excited to announce that the Draft Ferry to Bridge to Greenway Complete Streets Plan is now available for viewing and public comment. The Plan is shaped by feedback received from over 500 community members through online surveys

and 15 in-person events held from January 2019 through April 2020. Based on this feedback, the Plan proposes a number of walking and bicycling improvements to promote safe access to the Richmond Ferry, Richmond-San Rafael Bridge Trail, Richmond Greenway and other destinations throughout the City of Richmond.

The Draft Plan will be available for public comments through the month of August – it is available for download on the Ferry to Bridge to Greenway website at: <http://ferry2bridge2greenway.com/draftplan>. We encourage Richmond residents, employees and visitors to comment on the Plan. 


## 10. **Public Works**

### **Abatement**

### Facilities Maintenance





## Wastewater Treatment Plant – Fats, Oils, & Grease (FOG)

Please do not put grease down the drain! Heavy grease has been reported at Richmond's sewer treatment plant. Grease clogs pipes and can be detrimental to the function of the plant.

The City of Richmond was in your neighborhood working to keep the sewer lines clean, which helps prevent sewer overflows that can pollute our creeks, rivers, and groundwater. Help us fight future sewer backups in your area.

By following a few simple steps, you can help prevent sewer backups and spills:

1. Pour cooled fats, oils and grease into a covered, disposable container and throw it into your garbage can. Never pour fats, oils or grease down sink drains or toilets. COOL IT, CAN IT, TRASH IT.™
2. Soak up remaining oils and grease with an absorbent material such as paper towels, and throw it into your garbage can.
3. Before you wash dishes, scrape food scraps, fats, oils and grease into your garbage can.
4. Use sink strainers to catch any remaining food waste while washing dishes.

## Sewer Lateral Grant Program

The City of Richmond's Water Resource Recovery Department administers the Sewer Lateral Grant Program. The program reimburses eligible homeowners in the Richmond Municipal Sewer District (RMSD No. 1) for some of the cost to replace their sewer lateral.

The program is open and accepting applications for the 2019-2020 Fiscal Year. There is limited availability – work must have been completed between 7/1/2019-6/30/2020.

The 2020-2021 Fiscal Year is now open and we are accepting applications for work completed between 7/1/2020-6/30/2021.

Central Hours: Monday-Friday 9:00am-4pm

The City of Richmond reimburses participating contractors from at least three (3) contractors.

**Eligibility**

- Projects served by the City of Richmond Sanitary Municipal Sewer District.
- Sewer lateral replacement must be completed **BEFORE** applying for the Sewer Lateral Grant Program.
- A full line replacement must be completed during the fiscal year July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020.
- If you have previously received a Sewer Lateral Grant reimbursement, you will not be eligible to apply.

**Required Documents**

- Only Lateral Grant Applications dated 4/15/2020 or newer will be accepted.
- Contractor's final bill in full amount.
- Proof of payment (copy of cancelled check, credit card receipt, or bank statement) are accepted).
- Certificate of lateral compliance (issued by the City after associated permit inspections are approved).
- Grant Deed (change of ownership taken place within last 3 months and/or if property is under a Trust).
- Two exempt organizations must submit proof of tax-exempt status.

**Award Limits**

- Each fiscal year the City allocates sewer lateral grant funds to be awarded for private sewer lateral replacement.
- The program can be suspended at any time without prior or advanced notification or posting.
- Property owner(s) are eligible for **ONE (1)** sewer lateral grant reimbursement award in a lifetime on a first come first serve basis until all sewer lateral funds are exhausted.
- Starting July 1, 2019 and ending June 30, 2020, the complete sewer lateral grant reimbursement amount is \$1,500 per application.
- Incomplete applications will **NOT** be accepted.
- All applications **MUST** be submitted in person. Any applications submitted via email or mail will **NOT** be accepted.
- No applications will be accepted after the sewer lateral grant funds are exhausted.
- Reimbursement may take approximately 3 weeks from the date the completed application is received and approved by the City.

Sewer Lateral Grant Program for Fiscal Year 2021-2022  
ONLY work completed during the fiscal year (7/1/20 – 6/30/20) will be eligible for sewer lateral grant reimbursements.






**Using the CORConnect Application on the City's Website:**

You can use the **CORConnect** button on the City's website (<http://www.ci.richmond.ca.us/>) to report any comments, questions or concerns regarding the work being done by City staff. The CORConnect issues go directly to the responsible department, and the city manager reviews reported issues on a regular basis to determine if City staff members are responding appropriately. If you do not feel that you have received a satisfactory response, please contact the City Manager's Office at (510) 620-6512.

To access **CORConnect** select the CORConnect button on the homepage of the City website.



Alternatively, you can select the **COR Connect** button on any other webpage on the left hand side of the page.



On the next screen under Report an Issue select Report Issue/Concern to create a report or Search Issue/Concerns to look up a previously reported issue. You can also look up previously submitted issues to check on the current status if you provided you name, phone number or email when you submitted it.



On the page, you can also look up information on a parcel, see permits issued and look up business license information. If you have a current business license you can pay to renew it online with a credit card.

The recommended browsers are: **Microsoft Edge**, or **Microsoft Internet Explorer version 11** using the compatibility mode. It can be found in the upper right corner of Internet Explorer: click on the "gear" icon and select Compatibility View Settings, then add the site to the list and click "Close".
