



It's a Boy

On 29 September at 11:33 A.M., a Richmond citizen called 911 as his wife had gone into labor and they were not going to be able to make it to the hospital. As Communications Supervisor Deana Koyl was answering their call the baby's head was already visible. Using Emergency Medical Dispatch Protocols Supervisor Koyl walked the father through the delivery of the child, how to support the baby boy's head, making sure the umbilical cord was not wrapped around the baby's neck, and providing directions on how to tie off the umbilical cord. She continued to provide reassurance to the family until the fire department arrived seven minutes later.

Today, the family had the opportunity to stop by the Richmond Communication Center to meet and thank Supervisor Koyl. They shared a great conversation and met the precious baby boy.

Richmond dispatchers are trained in National Academics of Emergency Dispatch Standards and are certified as Emergency Medical Dispatchers, which prepares them for these types of situations. The efforts of Supervisor Koyl are a perfect example of the excellent service provided every day by all the dispatchers in the Communications Center.

The application process is now open to represent the City of Richmond on the Contra Costa Mosquito and Vector Control District's Board of Trustees. The [Contra Costa Mosquito and Vector Control District](#) is a tax-funded office that provides free services to all county residents for mosquitoes, rats and mice, ground-nesting yellowjackets, ticks, and skunks. The Richmond representative on the District's [Board of Trustees](#) will represent the city's interests on matters related to mosquito and vector control. The first term of service will be two years and additional terms of service will be two or four years. Regular board meetings are held on the second Monday of every other month starting in January. Meetings are held at the District office, [155 Mason Circle in Concord](#) at 7:00 p.m., and the meetings are open to the public. Trustees are not compensated for service but will be paid up to \$100 per month for official business expenses. Mayor Butt has been tasked with nominating an applicant for the trustee position and that individual must then be confirmed by the Richmond City Council. Contra Costa County Housing Authority Announces Opening of the Listed PBV Waitlist

The Housing Authority of the County of Contra Costa (HACC) announces the opening of the listed Project-Based Voucher (PBV) waiting list. The waiting list will be open from Monday, November 2, 2020 at 10:00 A.M. through Thursday, November 5, 2020, at 4:00 P.M. From November 2nd through November 5th, pre-applications will be accepted for the property listed below only. Completed pre-applications must be submitted by 4:00 P.M., Thursday, November 5, 2020. Please note that this is not for the Housing Choice Voucher Waiting List.

Note: There will not be any on-site applications and HACC office locations will not be distributing pre-applications. All pre-applications must be submitted online.

Incomplete pre-applications or partially completed pre-applications will not be accepted. Pre-applications received after the 11/05/2020 deadline will not be accepted.

Eligible families will be referred to units subsidized with Section 8 Project-Based Vouchers from the Housing Authority of the County of Contra Costa in partnership with non-profit housing owners. The housing assistance is only available at the designated properties for families meeting the property restrictions as indicated in this notice. After twelve months of residency, families will be eligible for a Housing Choice Voucher, subject to availability.

All requests for Reasonable Accommodation will be considered. Pre-Applications are available in foreign languages. All questions can be directed to (925) 957-7081.

- To apply, you must be 62 years of age or older.
- Large households for three and four bedroom units are highly encouraged to apply.
- All non-elderly applications will be rejected.






Special One-Day Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection Event

On Saturday, September 19th, through a partnership between RecycleMore, Republic Services, and the City of Richmond, a special one-day household hazardous waste collection event was held for West Contra Costa County residents. 806 residents attended the free event to properly dispose of paints, mattresses, aerosols, electronic waste (e-waste), batteries, and oil to keep our communities clean and safe. There were 450 mattresses and approximately 52,751 lbs. of HHW collected at the event.

A special thank you to the Richmond Police Department who were in attendance.






Transparent Richmond aims to accomplish the following:




Tableside Service Update

10. **Police Department**

Badge #44

Meet Officer Steve Purcell. Officer Purcell has been an officer here at RPD for 19 years and today we'd like to share a special story about him.

Officer Purcell followed in his father's footsteps, as his dad was a Richmond Police Officer for 31 years. Officer Purcell's father (Steve Purcell, Sr) was hired in 1969 and wore badge #44. Just one year after he was hired, Purcell Jr was born. Officer Purcell, Sr was a well-respected patrol officer, working almost every investigator position imaginable. Just one year after his retirement in 2001, Purcell, Jr. was hired at RPD.

Purcell, Jr. inquired about wearing his retired father's badge number #44 when he was sworn in but unfortunately it was back in circulation and assigned to another officer. Purcell Jr, being a new officer, didn't pursue it beyond that and never looked back. Kind of surprising because Purcell, Jr. was #44 when he played baseball as a youth and

even now as a softball player for Team Richmond. Purcell Jr. is a decorated pitcher who has led our team to many championships. In Steve's own words, "#44 was my lifetime favorite number."

At some point, unbeknownst to Purcell, Jr, badge #44 was retired again and placed back into circulation. It was issued to lateral Officer Chip Waters. At some point, Officer Purcell noticed that Officer Waters was wearing badge #44, so he educated Officer Waters of the rich 31 year history of badge #44.

On March 1, 2016 Officer Waters put a plan in motion to transfer badge number #44 to Officer Steve Purcell, Jr. On a morning like so many others, Steve walked into morning briefing ready to start his shift. But he was surprised when he was called up in front of lineup and presented with badge #44. How he held back tears is still a mystery as he was so moved by the gesture. In Officer Purcell Jr's words, "It was a complete surprise!!!! What an honor, I wear that badge proudly!!!"

Recently, Purcell assembled his new vest carrier and needed a new name tag. Purcell Jr., in possession of Sr's original 1969 cloth name tag, added Velcro to it and attached it to his new vest. Purcell Jr said, "It was meant to be."

Purcell Jr, explained when he told Purcell Sr of his uniform changes, Sr was overwhelmed with emotions. And for those who know Sr., overwhelming him is hard to do.

The Purcell's have a combined service to the City of Richmond, of 50 PLUS years! We are excited that badge #44 made it back onto the uniform of a Purcell and who knows, maybe one day one of Officer Purcell's daughters will represent the badge number as well.





A DUI Leads to a Cache of Illegal Items

On October 9, at 6:28 A.M., officers responded to the 12000 block of San Pablo Avenue for a report of a car accident. A driver crashed into two parked cars while driving intoxicated. The driver was arrested for DUI. The suspect's car was impounded and marijuana, Xanax pills, \$10,000 in counterfeit money, and a loaded handgun were found in the vehicle.

Paving crews paved on Virginia Avenue, performed base repairs on 24th Street, addressed complaints and worked from the outstanding pothole list.




