



1. Meeting Notes

2. Coronavirus (COVID-19) Updates

The following information is an ongoing list of resources and significant updates regarding COVID-19.



Contra Costa County Micro-Enterprise Relief Fund Grants

Renaissance Richmond is administering the Contra Costa County Micro-Enterprise Relief Fund, funded by the Contra Costa County Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). The program aims to provide relief to micro-enterprises impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Eligibility Criteria:

- No more than 5 employees,
- Maximum of \$100,000 in annual revenue,
- Registered and operating in Contra Costa County cities (except for Walnut Creek, Concord, Pittsburg, and Antioch)

Grants of \$1,000 - \$10,000 are available to cover costs such as COVID-19 precaution supplies (PPE), safety remodeling (plexi-glass, spacing tape, construction labor), facade improvements and signage, online platform fees and social media marketing, commercial rents, employee salaries, and other operating costs.

Outdoor Dining, Curbside Retail and Special Event Permits

Outdoor Dining, Curbside Retail, and Special Event Permits in Richmond, CA

as of July 16, 2020



The City of Richmond is providing opportunities for businesses impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic to utilize public and privately-owned outdoor areas, including parking lots, for outdoor dining and retail use.

Richmond businesses may apply for a permit to use a sidewalk or parking space in front of their location for business operation by contacting the Community Services Department, Recreation Division at csdregistration@ci.richmond.ca.us or by visiting www.richca-communityservices.org to obtain an application.

All business will be required to complete the following for an outdoor dining permit:

1. Outdoor dining and curbside retail application
2. Site diagram
3. ABC permit (if serving alcohol outdoors)
4. Certificate of liability insurance (if operating on public property)

In addition, special event permits are required for the following: protests, vigils, marches, and large gatherings. Visit the website listed for the process and forms.



Help represent Richmond on the Contra Costa Mosquito and Vector Control District's Board of Trustees!

The application process is now open to represent the City of Richmond on the Contra Costa Mosquito and Vector Control District's Board of Trustees. The [Contra Costa Mosquito and Vector Control District](#) is a tax-funded office that provides free services to all county residents for mosquitoes, rats and mice, ground-nesting yellowjackets, ticks,

and skunks. The Richmond representative on the District's [Board of Trustees](#) will represent the city's interests on matters related to mosquito and vector control. The first term of service will be two years and additional terms of service will be two or four years. Regular board meetings are held on the second Monday of every other month starting in January. Meetings are held at the District office, [155 Mason Circle in Concord](#) at 7:00 p.m., and the meetings are open to the public. Trustees are not compensated for service but will be paid up to \$100 per month for official business expenses. Mayor Butt has been tasked with nominating an applicant for the trustee position and that individual must then be confirmed by the Richmond City Council. Applicants must be a City of Richmond resident and at least 18 years of age. Please use this [link](#) to complete the online application. 




Transparent Richmond aims to accomplish the following:





Eight-Week Yoga Class

We are starting an 8-week yoga class, free of charge on the Senior Launchpad.

This course will be an introduction to Mindfulness and its role in helping us to navigate the ups and downs of everyday life. For many of us, meditation is not easy. Our bodies are active, which makes it difficult to sit still and focus inwards. Therefore, a good complement to a meditation practice is yoga asanas. Yoga asanas are exercises designed to increase circulation throughout the body, lengthen and strengthen the muscles resulting in flexibility, and calm the nervous system. This enables the body to relax in a meditative practice and allows for a mindful state of awareness in everyday life.


Parchester Community Paint Days



Tablesides Service Update

Literacy for Every Adult Program (LEAP): Homage to a LEAP Student

The Literacy for Every Adult Program (LEAP) is an outreach extension of the city of Richmond’s Library and Community Services Department. LEAP has provided services to thousands of Richmond citizens during its history. Many of these citizens have

reinvested their acquired skills, developed at LEAP, into jobs and services that support the city of Richmond.

Tamisha Walker Torres is one of those citizens. Ms. Torres is the Executive Director of Safe Return Project located in Richmond. Ms. Torres came to LEAP after being incarcerated as a result of her personal experience with trauma and poverty growing up in Richmond.

After acquiring her GED at LEAP, Ms. Torres continued her education which includes professional training in research and advocacy, violence prevention, and conflict mediation. As a founding member of Safe Return Project, Ms. Torres has been instrumental in the passage of CA Prop 47, AB 109, and AB 218.

The staff and supporters of LEAP are grateful for the opportunity of assisting in the growth and development of a resident of the City of Richmond who is giving back to her city.

Abatement

Abatement crews in collaboration with County staff hosted the annual Shields-Reid/North Richmond Neighborhood Clean-up event where they collected 25 40-yard dumpsters of debris, provided assistance for seniors and disabled citizens, abated a city owned vacant lot with homeless encampments, removed illegally dumped debris and graffiti from various locations.

Facilities Maintenance

Stationary Engineers performed daily pool maintenance, daily Civic Center Plaza boiler inspections, adjusted the closure mechanism on the doors of 450 Civic Center Plaza, replaced air filters on the dehumidifier at the Swim Center, repaired a freezer at the Police Department in the Property Vault, repaired the water tower drain valve on the air conditioning unit at 450 Civic Center Plaza, filled and balanced pool #1 at the Swim Center and repaired front doors at two locations.

Utility Workers performed pest control at Fire Station #66, removed debris from the Employment and Training parking lot, set tables and chairs for the Planning Department, performed daily disinfecting procedures and maintenance of 29 city owned facilities.

General fund crews mowed west side parks, cleared a v-ditch, removed debris from parks and right of ways, repaired fencing on the Greenway, repaired irrigation in the Civic Center, trimmed vegetation at Booker T. Anderson fence line, trimmed ivy from the fencing at Nicholl Park, edged turf at John F. Kennedy Park, removed concrete from State Court Park, removed illegal dumping from the Booker T. Anderson parking lot, repaired concrete at Booker T. Anderson Park, performed maintenance on Nevin Avenue across from the senior housing and performed weed abatement and pest control at multiple parks.

Tree crews cut or trimmed trees at/on; 32nd Street, Humphrey Avenue, Macdonald Avenue and Montgomery Avenue.

Marina District crews continued maintenance of all parks and parking lots, continued with the leveling of the sand on Sand Beach, cut tree wells, removed weeds from the sidewalks, removed debris throughout the area, maintenance on medians from Bayside Drive to Shimada Park, emptied trash receptacles, cleaned the playground at Barbara J. Vincent Park and added additional COVID-19 signs throughout the district.

Hilltop District crews continued general maintenance around the business area, removed debris from all parks, completed the replanting project at Bay Vista Park, continued shrub and tree removal at Hilltop Lake, removed debris from Hilltop Drive hillside, removed shrubs and trees from Country Club Vista Park, weed abatement at Bay Vista Park and installed mulch on the medians of Robert Miller Drive.




