




1. **Meeting Notes**


Contra Costa Health Services sets goal of 1 million COVID-19 vaccines by Independence Day

Contra Costa County Health Services and its healthcare partners have set an ambitious goal of delivering 1 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines by Independence Day (July 4, 2021). To achieve this goal the City of Richmond and Contra Costa Health Services (CCHS) are pleased to announce the collaborative effort to launch a COVID-19 vaccine distribution site in the Richmond Memorial Auditorium. The site will be administering vaccines Monday through Friday, 8:00 A.M. – 5:00 P.M., beginning Monday, January 25, 2021.

Vaccines will become available to residents based on the California Department of Public Health Allocation guidelines, prioritizing supply and availability based on age, occupational risk exposure, and residence in vulnerable communities. To determine if you are eligible for a vaccine, please visit [the CCHS Vaccine distribution page](#). To receive a vaccine, you may contact your primary healthcare provider for information about how to get notifications of eligibility, or you may schedule a vaccine with CCHS by first filling out an [online appointment request form](#). CCHS will review the application. Those who are eligible for a vaccine will receive instructions on how to enroll for a vaccine.

This week, CCHS also launched its new vaccine-appointment phone line – 1-833-VAX-COCO (1-833-829-2626). Those who are unable to schedule vaccine appointments online can call CCHS and book an appointment Monday-Friday, 8:00 A.M. – 8:00 P.M. Eligible residents seeking appointments are encouraged to use the online form unless they do not have internet access or have difficulty using the online form.

CCHS also has a new data dashboard on its COVID-19 web page, www.cchealth.org/coronavirus, which provides daily updates for the county's vaccination campaign.

Richmond Fund for Children and Youth FY 2021-24 Request for Proposals and Grant Application Now Available!

On June 5, 2018, Richmond voters approved Measures E and K, known as the Richmond Kids First Initiative, which approved a City of Richmond Charter amendment (Article 15) to require that a portion of the General Fund be set aside to fund youth programs and services. The total projected amount available for FY 2021-2022 grant awards is approximately \$1.5 million in the initial year.




Transparent Richmond aims to accomplish the following:



Senior Yoga Classes

We are starting a new 8-week session of yoga class, free of charge on the Senior Launchpad.

This course will be an introduction to Mindfulness and its role in helping us to navigate the ups and downs of everyday life. For many of us, meditation is not easy. Our bodies are active, which makes it difficult to sit still and focus inwards. Therefore, a good complement to a meditation practice is yoga asanas. Yoga asanas are exercises designed to increase circulation throughout the body, lengthen, and strengthen the muscles resulting in flexibility and calming the nervous system. This enables the body to relax in a meditative practice and allows for a mindful state of awareness in everyday life.

This course is offered for FREE on Zoom and each class will consist of 15-20 minutes of lecture and 60 minutes of gentle yoga asanas. 
Tablesides Service Update



The Literacy for Every Adult Program (LEAP) Hosts a Virtual Booth for 2021 Education Fair

This week the Literacy for Every Adult Program (LEAP) was among the many resources for students and their families during the Community Organization Open House for the 2021 Education Fair. We hosted a virtual booth to provide information about adult literacy services and answer questions for our West Contra Costa County families. LEAP has had the good fortune of working with adult learners who are parents and adjusting to their children attending school online. LEAP is among community organizations that help parents become connected to the digital world and be a greater support to their children.

The 2021 Education Fair, put on by the West Contra Costa Unified School District and Enroll WCC, aims to help parents come together to wrestle with hard questions about how to select a school to meet their child's needs. This year's event gave parents and caregivers a chance to explore their children's unique needs and learn about the incredible opportunities available in our West Contra Costa schools and community. From January 16th to 23rd, families attended virtual sessions to both meet representatives from the schools in our community and engage in panel discussions around specific topics like special education, African American student achievement, dual language immersion, mental health services, the benefits of a large, comprehensive high school compared to those of a smaller high school, the difference between a traditional middle school and a K-8 model, and much more.




The City of Richmond recommends obtaining estimates from at least three (3) contractors.

Eligibility:

- Parcels served by the City of Richmond Sanitary Municipal Sewer District.
- Sewer lateral replacement must be completed **BEFORE** applying for the Sewer Lateral Grant Program.
- A full line replacement must be completed during the fiscal year July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021.
- If you have previously received a Sewer Lateral Grant reimbursement, you will not be eligible to apply.

Required Documents:

- Only Lateral Grant Applications dated 6/30/2020 or newer will be accepted.
- Contractor's final paid in full invoice.
- Proof of payment (copy of cancelled check, credit card receipt, or bank statement are accepted).
- Certificate of Lateral Compliance (issued by the City after encroachment permit inspectors are approved).
- Grant Deal (change of ownership taken place within last 3 months and/or if property is under a Trust).
- Tax-exempt organizations must submit proof of tax-exempt status.

Award Limits:

- Each fiscal year the City allocates sewer lateral grant funds to be awarded for private sewer lateral replacement.
- This program can be suspended at any time without prior or advanced notification or posting.
- Property owner(s) are eligible for **ONE (1)** sewer lateral grant reimbursement award in a lifetime on a first-come, first-served basis until all sewer lateral funds are exhausted.
- Starting July 1, 2020 and ending June 30, 2021, the complete sewer lateral grant reimbursement amount is \$1,200 per application.
- Incomplete applications will **NOT** be accepted.
- Applications will be accepted via email and read at that time. This is subject to change.
- No applications will be accepted after the sewer lateral grant funds are exhausted.
- Reimbursement may take approximately 5 weeks from the date the completed application is received and approved by the City.
