


1. **Meeting Notes**




Transparent Richmond aims to accomplish the following:

Richmond Fund for Children and Youth FY 2021-24 Request for Proposals and Grant Application Now Available!

On June 5, 2018, Richmond voters approved Measures E and K, known as the Richmond Kids First Initiative, which approved a City of Richmond Charter amendment (Article 15) to require that a portion of the General Fund be set aside to fund youth programs and services. The total projected amount available for FY 2021-2022 grant awards is approximately \$1.5 million in the initial year.


Tablesides Service Update

The Literacy for Every Adult Program (LEAP) Highlights Twila Tillis

Twila Tillis is one of our recent graduates from the Career Online High School Program (COHS). COHS is an 18 month online program designed for students to earn an accredited high school diploma while gaining real-world career training. By enrolling in the Career Online High School Program, students graduate ready for work in a career of their choice. Twila was able to not only earn her high school diploma but also earned an associate’s degree in Child Care.

Twila knew childcare was the field she wanted to pursue as she always took pride in caring for others and it aligned with her career goals as she currently works as a Teacher’s Assistant for Special Education at Kennedy High School. However, Twila’s

journey didn't come easy. At a young age, Twila wasn't able to complete high school and dedicated herself in taking care of her family members. Twila recalls stepping away from taking classes at Contra Costa College in Early Child Care Development because of her challenges in taking care of her mother and husband from 1998-2016.

Once the pandemic hit last year and what felt like the world suddenly stopped, Twila took advantage of the time and decided to pick up where she left off and pursue her high school diploma. Her friend, a LEAP graduate, recommended she reach out to LEAP and enroll. Twila describes the experience as beautiful and friendly. She had 18 months to complete the program but as the deadline approached she still had 7 lessons left to complete. LEAP staff knew she could do it and paid for additional time for her to finish the course. Twila appreciated the chance and it took her only 2 months to finish the lessons and graduate.

Twila is grateful to the teachers and staff at LEAP and makes sure to recommend anyone she knows to the program. Twila's next goal is to grow her teacher skills in educational opportunities and continue to take summer classes in Early Childhood.

Transportation: Grants for E-bikes Announcement

Scrap your old clunker car for zippy fun e-bikes!

The Bay Area Air Quality District (BAAQMD) is providing grants of \$7,500 under the Clean Cars for All program for income-qualified Bay Area residents of Disadvantaged Communities to retire an older high polluting car and replace it with E-bikes.

www.BAAQMD.GOV/CleanCarsforAll.

The grant can be used for up to one e-bike per household member and accessories like helmets, lights and cargo equipment. The remaining grant amount can be converted to Clipper public transit card credit.

Applicants must have income at or below 400% of the current Federal Poverty Level and live in zip codes that include Disadvantaged Communities (DACs) defined by the state of California as most affected by many sources of pollution. Qualifying Richmond zip codes are 94801, 94802, 94804, 94805, and 94806.




8. **Public Works**

Abatement

Parks and Landscaping

General fund crews removed debris from parks in the central area of Richmond, removed debris from the right of ways, repaired fencing at Nicholl and Hilltop Parks, removed illegal dumping from Carlson Boulevard, removed homeless encampment debris from 3 locations, performed maintenance at John F. Kennedy Park, demolition of water tanks at Nicholl Park, weeded Cutting Circle, removed debris from the Greenway, assisted the Tree crew and weeded at Burg Park.



Street Sweeping crews swept the third Tuesday through Friday in the following neighborhood council areas: North Richmond, Iron Triangle, North Belding Woods, Atchison Village, South Belding Woods, Santa Fe, Coronado, Marina Bay and Point Richmond as weather permitted. Monday was not swept due to the observance of President's Day.

The City of Richmond was in your neighborhood working to keep the sewer lines clean, which helps prevent sewer overflows that can pollute our creeks, rivers, and groundwater. Help us fight future sewer backups in your area.

By following a few simple steps, you can help prevent sewer backups and spills:

1. Pour cooled fats, oils and grease into a covered, disposable container and throw it into your garbage can. Never pour fats, oils or grease down sink drains or toilets. COOL IT, CAN IT, TRASH IT.
2. Soak up remaining oils and grease with an absorbent material such as paper towels, and throw it into your garbage can.
3. Before you wash dishes, scrape food scraps, fats, oils and grease into your garbage can.
4. Use sink strainers to catch any remaining food waste while washing dishes.

The City of Richmond recommends obtaining estimates from at least three (3) contractors.

Eligibility:

- ◆ Parcels served by the City of Richmond Sanitary Municipal Sewer District.
- ◆ Sewer lateral replacement must be completed **BEFORE** applying for the Sewer Lateral Grant Program.
- ◆ A full line replacement must be completed during the fiscal year July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021.
- ◆ If you have previously received a Sewer Lateral Grant reimbursement, you will not be eligible to apply.

Required Documents:

- ◆ Only Lateral Grant Applications dated 6/30/2020 or newer will be accepted.
- ◆ Contractor's final paid in full invoice.
- ◆ Proof of payment (copy of canceled check, credit card receipt, or bank statement are accepted).
- ◆ Certificate of Lateral Compliance (issued by the City after encroachment permit inspections are approved).
- ◆ Grant Deed (change of ownership taken place within last 3 months and/or if property is under a Trust).
- ◆ Tax-exempt organizations must submit proof of tax-exempt status.

Award Limits:

- Each fiscal year the City allocates sewer lateral grant funds to be awarded for private sewer lateral replacement.
- This program can be suspended at any time without prior or advanced notification or posting.
- Property owner(s) are eligible for **ONE (1)** sewer lateral grant reimbursement award in a lifetime on a first come, first served basis until all sewer lateral funds are exhausted.
- Starting July 1, 2020 and ending June 30, 2021, the complete sewer lateral grant reimbursement amount is \$1,500 per application.
- Incomplete applications will **NOT** be accepted.
- Applications will be accepted via email and mail at this time. This is subject to change.
- No applications will be accepted after the sewer lateral grant funds are exhausted.
- Reimbursement may take approximately 3 weeks from the date the completed application is received and approved by the City.

PLEASE NOTE

Sewer Lateral Grant Program for Fiscal Year 2020-2021
ONLY work completed during the fiscal year (7/1/20-6/30/21)
 will be eligible for sewer lateral grant reimbursements.






