**Hope and Healing Memorial Virtual Event: Monday, March 22**


In memoriam of the 82 lives lost to COVID-19 in the City of Richmond and the 700 plus in Contra Costa County, the City of Richmond will participate in the county-wide virtual Hope and Healing Memorial on Monday, March 22, 2021.

A year ago, Contra Costa lost its first member to COVID-19. Over the coming year, that tragedy was to repeat itself more than 700 times, each time claiming a beloved soul and

leaving an ever-widening hole in our community. On this night of hope and healing, we pause as a county, as cities and as individuals to remember those we've lost, to comfort those left behind and to collectively heal and begin the process of moving forward.

Remembrances, words of hope, testimonials and musical tributes will be played throughout the 30-minute memorial event. This evening of Hope & Healing will culminate with a telecast of city centers throughout Contra Costa County emerging from the dark and lighting their city centers in a glow of golden light.

The ceremony will be telecast over CCTV throughout Contra Costa County and simultaneously staged at city centers throughout the county on Monday, March 22<sup>nd</sup> from 8:00 P.M. to 8:30 P.M. 

## **Richmond Youth Council Discussions, March series: Let's talk about Feminism**


The Richmond Youth Council is excited to introduce their March series: Let's Talk About Feminism, dedicated to both learning and sharing experiences about feminism!




### Tablesides Service Update

**The Literacy for Every Adult Program (LEAP) Makes a Difference!**

LEAP makes a positive difference in the lives of individual people and in the community at large. It's a proven fact. During our current fiscal year (i.e. since July 2020), LEAP has aided 14 individuals in earning their GED or High School Diploma. This success is

despite the challenges of COVID, the difficulty of remote learning, and the economic hardships placed on our students.

In the early months of the shelter-in-place order. LEAP staff remained resilient and creative. They adopted a student first teaching philosophy. They worked with the situation that COVID created, listened to their students, and created remote environment of collaboration, community, and learning. After some trial and error, these efforts created success. Students graduated. Since July, LEAP now has 14 graduates, and nine more students who have completed three of the four GED tests, and three more students who are more than 85% complete with their High School Diploma. "It's important to remember the impact," LEAP GED instructor John Adams stated. "Success isn't just about graduation, it's about better jobs, more food on the table, college participation, and most importantly confidence. When you talk to these students, they tell stories of how their success ripples through the community."

LEAP plans to continue to build success and service the community with excellence. A graduation ceremony celebrating the success of these remarkable students is being planned for late May. 
### **Detectives Improve Community Safety**

Based on complaints from community members, Richmond Police Department Criminal Intelligence Unit started investigating allegations of illegal and violent activities in the city's Southern District.

Detectives received information regarding an individual who was in possession of an illegal firearm. K9 Officer Hodges saw the suspect in a car, in the city's Southern District, and conducted an enforcement stop based on a vehicle code violation. During their investigation, Officer Hodges and detectives found – you guessed it! – a loaded gun in the vehicle. The suspect was arrested without incident.

Later that evening, detectives saw a known gang member and parolee driving in the city's Southern District. Detectives conducted an enforcement stop for multiple vehicle code violations and later found a loaded 9mm gun and illegal drugs in the car. The driver was arrested and taken to jail.

The department is proud of our detectives' continued efforts to improve our community's safety and quality of life. Great work, detectives!



### **Tip Tuesday: Robbery Prevention**


The department has been working on preventing a recent spate of robberies. You can help by following the tips below and sharing with neighbors.

**The Crime:** Theft of personal property from a person or place by force or threat of force.

**What Thieves Look For:** People who are walking alone with valuables, especially those who aren't paying attention, or listening to music through earbuds.

**How to Prevent It:** Pay attention when walking, especially when listening to headphones. Do not carry large amounts of money, flash electronics or other expensive items. Be observant. Walk in well-lit areas. Be cautious when getting in and out of your car.

**If Confronted:** No amount of property is worth your safety. Turn it over and seek help.



### **Officer Gault and K9 Major sniff another gun off the street!**

While on patrol in the Central District, Officer Gault conducted a traffic enforcement stop for a vehicle code violation. The driver fled from the vehicle stop and crashed into an innocent motorist.

With the help of residents, Officer Gault located the driver who fled nearby. Using his K9 partner Major, a loaded firearm was recovered in a nearby driveway. Great job Officer Gault and K9 Major!



### **Please Designate A Sober Driver!**

Last Saturday, officers arrested numerous suspected DUI drivers, all within a 4-hour time span.

At approximately 8:00 P.M., a motorist reported a suspected DUI driver in the 4000 block of Fieldcrest Drive. Officers found the car as it pulled into a nearby driveway. The driver was arrested after a series of field sobriety tests and provided a breath sample registering .377, which is OVER FOUR TIMES the legal limit!

Several minutes later, at around 8:15 P.M., paramedics flagged down an officer when they observed a suspected DUI driver. Officers contacted the driver and, after a series of field sobriety tests, he was ultimately arrested. The driver's blood alcohol content was over twice the legal limit, at .20!

At approximately 11:00 P.M., officers responded to a 911 call regarding a rollover traffic accident, with someone trapped inside the car, in the 2300 block of Garvin Avenue. Arriving officers rescued the driver through the car's rear window. The driver was taken to the hospital for his injuries, but he appeared to have been driving under the influence.

It doesn't end there! At around midnight, officers responded to the 600 block of Harbour Way regarding a car that had crashed into another parked vehicle. Upon contact, the driver appeared to be under the influence of alcohol. After a series of field sobriety tests, the driver provided a breath sample of nearly three times the legal limit, at .22! He was subsequently arrested.

The department is relieved that no one was injured or killed by the irresponsible actions of these drivers. Richmond PD is committed to protecting our community, with a zero-tolerance approach if you are caught driving under the influence.



## 9. **Public Works**

### **Abatement**

Abatement crews abated encampments blocking sidewalks, cleared debris near homeless encampments, removed illegally dumped debris and graffiti various locations throughout the city.

## **Facilities Maintenance**

Stationary Engineers performed daily pool maintenance and Civic Center Plaza boiler inspections, installed a water meter, repaired the toilet in a handicapped stall and replaced a float switch at the Plunge, repaired a toilet at 450 Civic Center Plaza, fixed the security gate at Richmond Police Activities League (RPAL), repaired the showers at the Swim Center, and installed a new tankless water heater at the Richmond Swim Center.

## **Parks and Landscaping**

General fund crews mowed and removed debris from parks in the central area of Richmond and from right of ways, repaired fencing in multiple locations, removed litter from soundwalls, cleared fallen tree branches and fixed a broken pipe at Booker T. Anderson Park, weed abated around the Swim Center, removed trees at Mira Vista Park, removed debris from 13<sup>th</sup> at Macdonald Avenue, performed pest control at two parks, cleared weeds at multiple city facilities and repaired the header board at Kern Park.

1. Pour cooled fats, oils and grease into a covered, disposable container and throw it into your garbage can. Never pour fats, oils or grease down sink drains or toilets. COOL IT, CAN IT, TRASH IT.
2. Soak up remaining oils and grease with an absorbent material such as paper towels, and throw it into your garbage can.
3. Before you wash dishes, scrape food scraps, fats, oils and grease into your garbage can.
4. Use sink strainers to catch any remaining food waste while washing dishes.

The City of Richmond recommends obtaining estimates from at least three (3) contractors.

**Eligibility:**

- Work owned by the City of Richmond (Sanitary Municipal Sewer District)
- Sewer lateral replacement must be completed **BEFORE** applying for the Sewer Lateral Grant Program.
- A full line replacement must be completed during the fiscal year (July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021).
- If you have previously received a Sewer Lateral Grant reimbursement, you will not be eligible to apply.

**Required Documents:**

- Only Lateral Grant Applications dated 6/30/2020 or newer will be accepted.
- Contributor's final paid or full invoice.
- Proof of payment (copy of cancelled check, credit card receipt, or bank statement are accepted).
- Certificate of Lateral Compliance (issued by the City after encroachment permit inspections are approved).
- Grant Deed (change of ownership takes place within last 3 months and/or if property is under a Trust).
- The correct information must submit proof of their current status.

**Award Limits:**

- Each fiscal year the City allocates sewer lateral grant funds to be awarded for private sewer lateral replacements.
- The program can be suspended at any time without prior or advanced notification or posting.
- Property owners are eligible for **\$50,000** sewer lateral grant reimbursement award in a lifetime on a first come, first served basis until all award money funds are exhausted.
- Starting July 1, 2020 and ending June 30, 2021, this complete sewer lateral grant reimbursement amount is **\$25,000** per application.
- Incomplete applications will **NOT** be accepted.
- Applications will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis at this time. This is subject to change.
- No applications will be accepted after the sewer lateral grant funds are exhausted.
- Reimbursement may take approximately 3 weeks from the date the completed application is received and approved by the City.

**PLEASE NOTE**  
Sewer Lateral Grant Program for Fiscal Year 2020-2021  
will not be available during the fiscal year (7/1/2020-6/30/21)  
and the eligible for sewer lateral grant reimbursements.



The project is approximately 78% complete and the contractor is working on plant system programming upgrades and Piping and Instrumentation Diagrams (P&IDs).




## **Trash Capture Devices**

To reduce the amount of trash and pollutants entering the bay and to comply with State stormwater regulations, the City of Richmond will be installing an additional hydrodynamic separator trash capture devices, on Cutting Blvd near South 3rd Street. The device will clean the surface runoff before reaching the bay on South 8th Street north of Hoffman Blvd, and near the intersection of Marina Bay Pkwy and Regatta Blvd. Because this drainage area include parts of Interstate 580, Caltrans has provided funding for design and construction.

Construction begins March 22, 2021 and will require lane closures on Cutting Blvd for the duration of the project.

The City and our contractor Veolia Water will be responsible for maintenance and the periodic cleaning and removal of the collected debris. Existing trash capture devices are located on South 8th St near Hoffman Blvd, near the intersection of Marina Bay Pkwy and Regatta Blvd, and at the top of the Meeker Ditch on Regatta Blvd.

## 10. Richmond Police Activities League

### Be A Mentor

Richmond Police Activities League (RPAL) serves low-income, at-risk youth ages 7-18 offering them recreational, educational, cultural and social activities that build positive character and help them transition from adolescence to adulthood. Many are living with parents and grandparents or other family members and 85% are eligible for reduced lunch.

Richmond Police Activities League (RPAL) provides both 1:1 and small group mentoring. They meet with mentees for an hour each week virtually via

our Be A Mentor platform or as part of structured activities such as coaching sports, fishing, dirt bike riding, community service events, and outings to sporting events and performances (prior to and after Covid 19).





