

2. **Coronavirus (COVID-19) Updates**

The following information is an ongoing list of resources and significant updates regarding COVID-19.



COVID Vaccines available at Richmond Auditorium on Tuesdays through Saturdays

Contra Costa County Health Services and its healthcare partners have set an ambitious goal of delivering 1 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines by Independence Day (July 4, 2021). To achieve this goal the City of Richmond and Contra Costa Health Services (CCHS) through a collaborative effort have launched a COVID-19 vaccine distribution site in the Richmond Memorial Auditorium. The site will be administering vaccines Tuesday through Saturday, 8:00 A.M. – 5:00 P.M.

Vaccines are available to Contra Costa County and Richmond residents over 16 years old. To receive a vaccine you may schedule a time with CCHS by first filling out an [online appointment request form](#).

CCHS also has a vaccine-appointment phone line – 1-833-VAX-COCO (1-833-829-2626). Those who are unable to schedule vaccine appointments online can call CCHS and book an appointment Monday-Friday, 8:00 A.M. – 8:00 P.M. Eligible residents seeking appointments are encouraged to use the online form unless they do not have internet access or have difficulty using the online form.

Other local resources, including links to other healthcare providers in the community now offering vaccine, are available at www.coronavirus.cchealth.org/get-vaccinated CCHS also has a new data dashboard on its COVID-19 web page, www.cchealth.org/coronavirus, which provides daily updates for the county's vaccination campaign.








Transparent Richmond aims to accomplish the following:



Virtual Easter Celebration





Borrow a Laptop and WiFi Hotspot

One Year Later – Children’s Services

In the spring of 2020, when the Library closed due to the Shelter-in -Place order, Librarian Sheila Dickinson started offering her Preschool Storytime on Wednesdays at 10:30 a.m. on Facebook. When library staff returned to the Main Library location in June, we expanded to daily Facebook offerings. On Thursdays, we post a short science activity or craft. During the summer, we hosted a virtual family music series with *Cascada de Flores*, as well as a special event with storytellers Ruth and Emilia. We assembled and distributed 200 STEM kits to DeJean Middle School and Nystrom Elementary in July. Librarians purchased books and distributed 950 books to families at Peres and Verde Elementary schools in the summer and fall. With no in-person art and science programs at the Library, we initiated activity kit giveaways with crafts and other fun items for 40 to 50 kids monthly.


Tableside Service Update


Facilities Maintenance

Stationary Engineers performed daily pool maintenance and Civic Center Plaza boiler inspections, replaced the contactors on the air conditioners at 450 Civic Center Plaza, fixed shower heads at the Swim Center, replaced air filters at the Auditorium, fixed the feeder hose and fittings at the Plunge, repaired the air conditioner at the Richmond Visitor Center and rerouted the gas line for a water heater at Station #62 for safety standards.

Utility workers pressure washed the Transit Center and the Main Library courtyard, removed debris from the Employment and Training parking lot, removed broken glass and, recycled metal from the Main Library, assisted the Housing Authority with maintenance, sanitized common areas and cleaned 29 City owned facilities.

Parks and Landscaping

General fund crews removed litter and debris from right of ways of the central area, performed pest control at five parks, weed whipped Castro Ranch Road medians, weeded around the Recreation Complex, performed maintenance Kern Park and Humphrey Playlot, removed a barbecue pit and repaired the irrigation at Nicholl Park, removed graffiti from multiple locations, repaired a table at Booker T. Anderson Park, abated weeds at South 55th and Creely Avenue, performed maintenance on the Cypress Street median and cleaned up an encampment on the Greenway.

Tree crews cut or trimmed trees at/on: 28th Street, Arizona Street, Carlson Boulevard, Regatta Boulevard and Wilson Avenue.

Marina District crews removed vegetation debris from the Bay Trail, cut and edged lawns at Lucretia Edwards and Barbara J. Vincent Parks, emptied all refuse cans throughout the district, manually pulled weeds in parking lots, refilled dog waste containers, and checked and repaired irrigation.

Street Sweeping crews swept the first Monday to Wednesday and the second Thursday and Friday in the following neighborhood council areas: Parchester Village, Hilltop Bayview, Hilltop Green, Fairmede/Hilltop, Carriage Hills North, El Sobrante Hills, Greenbriar, Hansford Heights, Via Verda, San Pablo Dam Road, Bristole Cone, Clinton Hill IV and Richmond Heights.

Signs and Lines crews fabricated 12 new signs, continued installing new signs along Nevin Avenue, replaced nine pole extensions, installed white pavement markings and painted red and blue curbs in various locations.

Water Resource Recovery Division

Trash Capture Project, Cutting Boulevard and S. 3rd Street

In 2017, Caltrans and the City of Richmond collaborated to implement the Trash Capture Project. The Contech Engineered Solutions CDS system is a below-ground, flow-through treatment device that uses multiple treatment processes including swirl concentration and continuous deflective separation (CDS) to screen, separate and trap trash, debris, sediment, hydrocarbons and other pollutants from stormwater runoff. Veolia Water, in conjunction with the City of Richmond, successfully installed three such devices in 2017, 2018, and 2019; another device is being installed on Cutting Boulevard and S. 3rd Street.

2. Soak up remaining oils and grease with an absorbent material such as paper towels, and throw it into your garbage can.
3. Before you wash dishes, scrape food scraps, fats, oils and grease into your garbage can.
4. Use sink strainers to catch any remaining food waste while washing dishes.
