



Abatement

Abatement crews, in collaboration with Contra County staff, hosted the Shields-Reid/North Richmond Neighborhood Clean-up event and collected 26 40-yard dumpsters of debris, provided assistance for seniors and residents with disabilities, abated vacant lots including housing properties, abated weeds from public right of ways, removed illegally dumped debris and graffiti from various locations throughout the City.

Engineering

Castro Ranch Road Project

This past week, the contractor continued work on many concrete areas like sidewalks, curbs, gutters, light pole foundations, and ramps. All work will appear to be too high by about 2 inches. The reason for this – the concrete areas are getting placed in preparation for the last 2 inch layer of hot mix asphalt, which will bring the roadway grade up 2 inches to meet the concrete areas. The work of placing the last layer of hot mix asphalt began on Thursday, June 9, 2021. It is expected to take four working days to complete the paving, project wide. Soon after, the utilities in the roadway will be raised to meet the new roadway elevation and permanent striping will be painted.

Workers have been finishing up with work to clear vegetation from the sides of the road. White survey paint marks on the pavement were placed in three areas of the project where changes/corrections to the road elevations will be performed to help give the road a smoother surface. The white paint shows elevation points and the measurement we will be making to raise or lower the roadway at that point. The measurements are made to a tolerance of 1/100th of a foot.


Richmond Yellow Brick Road Pedestrian and Bicycle Improvements Project

The groundbreaking ceremony was held June 9th at 12:00 NOON and attended by the community, project stakeholders, local political representatives, Mayor Tom Butt, and the POGO Park staff. Currently, preconstruction tasks include contractor submittal

reviews, coordination with POGO Park, preparing Caltrans Local Assistance forms, and planning a coordination meeting with the local utilities. Ghilotti Bros, Inc. (GBI) plans to begin setting best management practices for stormwater pollution prevention, and layout for potholing in the coming days.

The project area is generally on 8th Street from Ohio to Lincoln Avenues, on 7th Street from Ripley to Pennsylvania Avenues and from 4th to 9th Streets. The scope of the work includes installation of pedestrian and bicycle safety improvements: street lighting, new ADA curb ramps, sidewalks, driveways, medians, traffic circles, curb bulb-outs, bio-swales, traffic signal modifications, pedestrian hybrid beacons (PHB), bike lanes, bike boulevards, raised asphalt intersections and crosswalks, including colored and stamped “yellow brick” asphalt, slurry seal, new storm drain facilities and signage and striping.

Building Maintenance

Stationary Engineers performed daily pool maintenance and Civic Center Plaza boiler inspections, repaired the toilet in the men's room on the 2nd floor of 450 Civic Center Plaza, installed condenser units at Fire Station #63, cleared the sewer line at the Family Justice Center, fixed a leaking toilet at the Westside Library Branch and replaced a fan belt at the Main Library.

Utility workers hung new window blinds at the Recreation Complex, completed room set up at 440 Civic Center Plaza, pressure washed the Main Library courtyard, installed lighting clips at the Police Department, cleaned the windows at the Senior Center, removed debris from the Richmond Main Street Initiative (RMSI) building area, assisted the Housing Authority with maintenance, sanitized common areas and cleaned 29 City owned facilities.

Parks and Landscaping

General fund crews installed a water spigot at Central Avenue and Rydin Road, continued with debris removal from Boorman Park, mowed turf, performed weed abatement on Ells Pathway and various other parks, repaired a sprinkler head at State Court and Booker T. Anderson Parks, cleared trails in High Fire Severity Zones, repaired the wind screen on the Nicholl Park tennis courts, removed debris from the Greenway and removed green waste from Mira Vista Park.

Marina District crews performed weed abatement along parking lots and in front of the Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E) building, removed graffiti at parks, replaced flags at Barbara J. Vincent Park, hand pulled weeds in planters on Sand Beach, began shrub pruning and removal along Marina Bay Trail, manually watered landscape, refilled dog waste bags and emptied all refuse cans throughout the district.
