





Parents, you are the first and primary teachers of your children. Here are a few reading tips for you to consider when helping your children become great readers.

1. Read to preschool children at least 20-30 minutes a day. Have older children read to you. Reading is the most basic of the basic skills. Make reading a natural part of your child's daily routine.
2. Add to your children's enjoyment of reading by discussing each book they read. It helps them learn to express themselves. You'll enjoy the conversations, too.
3. Make sure your children see you read for at least 20-30 minutes a day. Remember, you're their primary role model.
4. Limit TV viewing and monitor what your child watches. Studies show that excessive television viewing is directly linked to poor school performance.



Richmond Wellness Trail Project

Along Marina Way South between Cutting Boulevard and Maine Avenue, the general contractor is finishing the brace walls and irrigation sleeves. The general contractor plans to do temporary paving from Cutting Boulevard to Virginia Avenue and open this block to traffic and parking by mid-October.

The general contractor is preparing the concrete formwork for the stormwater planters along Marina Way South between Maine Avenue and Florida Avenue. The raingardens and stormwater planters will separate the two-way bike lane from the parking lane and traffic lanes, as well as filter and clean stormwater. It is anticipated that work along Marina Way South between Florida Avenue and Ohio Avenue in mid-October and is working to update residents on the plan for modified parking.

Ghilotti Bros, Inc. (GBI) continued demolition of curb ramps, sidewalk and curbs and gutters along 8th Street near Lincoln and Lucas Avenues. GBI also continued to place concrete curbs, ADA ramps and sidewalks along 8th Street near Lincoln Avenue. They continued installation of storm drain manholes and pipe near Lucas Avenue.

The contractor continues to demolish concrete curbs, sidewalk and existing ramps at the north end of the project. GBI's electrical subcontractor, JB Electric, is continuing to install conduit for future street lighting from Ohio Avenue to Bissell Avenue. JB Electric has also laid out the locations of traffic signal poles and cabinets at Macdonald and Barrett Avenues.



The City of Richmond recommends obtaining estimates from at least three (3) contractors.

Eligibility:

- Parcels served by the City of Richmond Sanitary Municipal Sewer District.
- Sewer lateral replacement must be completed **BEFORE** applying for the Sewer Lateral Grant Program.
- A full line replacement must be completed.
- If you have previously received a Sewer Lateral Grant reimbursement, you will not be eligible to apply.

Required Documents:

- Only Lateral Grant Applications dated 6/30/2021 or newer will be accepted.
- Contractor's final paid in full invoice.
- Proof of payment (copy of canceled check, credit card receipt, or bank statement are accepted).
- Certificate of Lateral Compliance (issued by the City after encroachment permit inspections are approved).
- Grant Deed (change of ownership takes place within last 3 months and/or if property is under a Trust).
- Tax-exempt organizations must submit proof of tax-exempt status.

Award Limits:

- > Each fiscal year the City allocates sewer lateral grant funds to be awarded for private sewer lateral replacement.
- > This program can be suspended at any time without prior or advanced notification or posting.

- > No applications will be accepted after the sewer lateral grant funds are exhausted.
- > Reimbursement may take approximately 5 weeks from the date the completed application is received and approved by the City.

High Priority Critical Improvements Projects

The City of Richmond and Veolia Water (Veolia) are implementing High Priority Critical Improvements Projects at the City's Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP), which is managed and operated by Veolia. The purpose of the projects is to replace aging and unreliable infrastructure, improve treatment operating efficiency, comply with future discharge regulations and improve the functionality of the existing WWTP. The improvements were identified through previous planning efforts, including the 2010 WWTP Master Plan and the 2016 WWTP Facility Plan, to construct the following elements of the WWTP Critical Improvements Projects: (1) New screening and grit removal facilities; (2) Aeration upgrades; and (3) Demolition of existing facilities and site clearing in preparation for future WWTP Facilities. The projects are expected to take approximately 2 ½ years to complete.

Shimmick continued work on the bypass operation; they also installed the bulkhead in channels 1 and 2 of the primary sedimentation tanks (PST), to avoid back feeding once the old grit building is demolished. Shimmick also worked on the return activated sludge (RAS) piping bypass in aeration basin 4.

Veolia is continuing to monitor the sustainability of the concrete support on the PST column retrofit during construction.

First Street Relief Sewer Project

The First Street Relief Sewer and Pipeline Rehabilitation Project is the final of four design projects from the comprehensive 2016 Collection System Design Project, which also included the construction of the Cutting/Carlson and Hoffman Project (originally two projects), and the Macdonald and Virginia Wet Weather Improvement Project. The Project consists of approximately 3,743 lineal feet of open cut replacement of existing 6-inch sewer, approximately 1,696 lineal feet of open cut replacement of existing 8-inch sewer, approximately 631 lineal feet of open cut replacement of existing 10-inch sewer, and approximately 125 lineal feet of open cut replacement of existing 18-in sewer. This project began in July 2021 and is expected to be completed in July 2022, which is ahead of the Baykeeper due date of July 2023.

Marina Bay Parkway Force Main Extension Project (NEW)

The Marina Bay Parkway Force Main Extension Project extends and reconnects the existing Marina Bay Parkway forcemain to a new manhole at the Intersection of Pierson Avenue and Marina Bay Parkway and installs a new gravity sewer pipeline from the Pierson/Jetty Drive intersection, across Marina Bay Parkway, to the new manhole. This project is required to eliminate sanitary sewer overflows that occur from depressed manholes located at the intersection of Marina Bay Parkway and Pierson Avenue.

The project went out to bid on March 15, 2021. Nine (9) prospective bidders attended the Mandatory Pre-Bid conference held on March 29, 2021. Bids were received at the City Clerk's Office on April 23, 2021. Four bids were submitted. After review of the bids was conducted by the City and Veolia, Richmond-based, local contractor W.R. Forde was determined to be the lowest, responsive bidder at \$357,200.00.
