DEADLINE to Apply for the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 ECIA Grant Program Applications is Sunday, February 13, 2022

In 2014, the Richmond City Council approved the Chevron Environmental and Community Investment Agreement (ECIA), which invests \$90 million dollars into the Richmond community over 10-years. \$6 million of those dollars have been set aside for a competitive grant program, designed for non-profits who serve Richmond in the areas of community, youth, and youth sports. The ECIA has grant awards that range from \$5,000 up to \$50,000.

The ECIA Grant Application is due on **Sunday, February 13, 2022, at 11:59 PM.**

All grant applications must be submitted online at www.ci.richmond.ca.us/eciagrants. This process is aimed to increase ease of use and minimize risk related to COVID-19.

5. City Manager's Office Economic Development

\$1.3 Million Grant Award to Implement the City of Richmond's Cannabis Equity Program

Earlier this month, the City of Richmond was awarded \$1.3 million in grant funding to support the implementation of the Cannabis Equity program and to support equity applicants start and expand their cannabis businesses. Grant funds will be used to support equity applicants receive technical assistance with establishing and growing their businesses, site and building improvements, and to support with licensing fees. Before beginning to accept equity applicants, City staff will need to finalize preferred technical assistance providers and establish other elements of the Equity program. Over the past year, the City Manager's Office, Economic Development has worked collaboratively with Economic Development Commission, community stakeholders, Richmond residents, and SCI Consulting group to conduct a Cannabis Equity Assessment and adopt an ordinance establishing a Cannabis Equity Program. During the December 7th meeting, Richmond City Council adopted the Cannabis Equity Manual which established a local Cannabis Equity Program. Concurrently The City Manager's Office Economic Development staff members, completed an application for Governors Office of Business and Economic Development (Go-Biz) Type II funding for the implementation of a Cannabis Equity Program.

Sacramento, CA – Today, the Governor’s Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz) announced \$35 million in grant funding through the Cannabis Equity Grants Program for Local Jurisdictions.

The purpose of the program is to advance economic justice for populations and communities harmed by cannabis prohibition by providing support to local jurisdictions as they promote equity and eliminate barriers to entry in the regulated cannabis industry for their equity program applicants and licensees. Jurisdictions will use this funding to develop their cannabis equity programs and assist their equity program applicants and licensees by providing low/no-interest loans or grants, reduced licensing fees or waived fees, and technical assistance, including one-on-one consulting and training, and navigation assistance with cannabis licensing and regulatory requirements.

Over \$29.5 million of the funding, in the form of low/no-interest loans or grants, will be allocated to cannabis equity applicants and licensees specifically identified by local jurisdictions as being linked to populations or communities that were negatively or disproportionately impacted by cannabis criminalization.

“Cannabis Equity Grants will help level the playing field for those that have borne the brunt of past federal and state anti-drug policies while striving to make California’s Cannabis Industry more equitable and accessible to those individuals,” said the Governor’s Chief Economic and Business Advisor and Director of GO-Biz Dee Dee Myers. “These awards bring the state’s commitment to local equity programs to \$90m since the program launched.”

Measure U – Business Resources

Starting January 1, 2022, the City of Richmond began implementing the voter-approved Measure U, which changed the Business Tax calculation methodology. The new progressive tax methodology is based on Gross Receipts in Richmond instead of the number of employees. For example, "highway 101 San Jose" and then place the pin closer to the exact location of the issue. Location services must be allowed on your computer or mobile device for best results. Zoom in or out as needed for more accurate reporting. Marker will become green once placed on a valid state highway location and will automatically populate the location fields below. 

RichmondBUILD is Now Accepting Applications for the Charge Up Contra Costa – Electric Vehicle Equipment Installation and Maintenance Training Program

In February 2021, the [California Energy Commission](#) awarded the Contra Costa Transportation Authority (CCTA) with \$3,467,067 in Clean Transportation Funding to implement community-based strategies identified in the [CCTA's Electric Vehicle Readiness Blueprint](#). The CCTA and partners provided local match funding of \$842,684. The Clean Transportation Funding is designed to help the state attain its climate change policies. The CCTA program called Charge Up Contra Costa will support electric personal mobility and provide educational programs in low-income communities in Contra Costa.

The proposed Electric Vehicle Equipment Installation Maintenance (EVSE) curriculum is based on the fundamentals required to safely install EVSE equipment and to support July 10, 2019, Contra Costa County Workforce Training Program Framework & Strategic Plan. Students will experience hands-on training in installations, repair, troubleshooting, safety methods, and basic electrical code and design layout. The tentative instruction timeline will span approximately 40 to 60 hours depending on the approximate class size of 25 and other classroom factors and variables. The approximate instruction is provided within an 11-week program depending on the number of students recruited. Classes begin February 28, 2022.


Via Verdi Slope Stabilization Project

Last week Ghilotti Bros, Inc. (GBI) performed demolition of old curb ramps and sidewalks along Pennsylvania Avenue near the 9th and 8th Street intersections. They completed the concrete sidewalks, grated line drain and driveways along 7th Street from Ripley Avenue to Elm Avenue.

The electrical subcontractor continued to locate and pothole existing utilities along 8th Street from Ripley Avenue to Lincoln Avenue. The electrical subcontractor also continued to excavate for streetlight pole bases in the Schedule B areas.

This week GBI is continuing to remove concrete, prepare subgrade, form curb ramps and sidewalks, and place concrete curb ramps and sidewalks along Pennsylvania Avenue at 9th and 8th Street intersections. They have also removed the bus pad at 7th Street near Pennsylvania Avenue and are forming the new concrete bus pad.

Their electrical subcontractor is continuing to fill potholes and locate utilities north of Barrett Avenue and is trenching and installing streetlight conduits along the west side of 8th Street across from the Kaiser Permanente Hospital. They will begin horizontal boring at the 5th Street and Pennsylvania Avenue intersection for the traffic signal modifications. They will also continue to place concrete foundations for the streetlights at various locations.





The City of Richmond recommends obtaining estimates from at least three (3) contractors.

Eligibility:

- Parcels served by the City of Richmond Sanitary Municipal Sewer District.
- Sewer lateral replacement must be completed **BEFORE** applying for the Sewer Lateral Grant Program.
- All full law replacement must be completed.
- If you have previously received a Sewer Lateral Grant reimbursement, you will not be eligible to apply.

Required Documents:

- Only Lateral Grant Applications dated 6/30/2022 or newer will be accepted.
- Contractor's final paid in full invoice.
- Proof of payment (copy of canceled check, credit card receipt, or bank statement are accepted).
- Certificate of Lateral Compliance (issued by the City after encroachment permit inspections are approved).
- Grant Deed (change of ownership takes place within last 3 months and/or if property is under a Trust).
- Tax-exempt organizations must submit proof of tax-exempt status.

Award Limits:

- Each fiscal year the City allocates sewer lateral grant funds to be awarded for private sewer lateral replacement.
- This program can be suspended at any time without prior or advanced notification or posting.
- Property owner(s) are eligible for **ONE (1)** sewer lateral grant reimbursement award in a lifetime on a first-come, first-served basis until all sewer lateral funds are exhausted.
- Starting July 1, 2021 and ending June 30, 2022, the complete sewer lateral grant reimbursement amount is \$1,800 per application.
- Incomplete applications will **NOT** be accepted.
- Applications will be accepted via email and mail at this time. This is subject to change.
- No applications will be accepted after the sewer lateral grant funds are exhausted.
- Reimbursement may take approximately 5 weeks from the date the completed application is received and approved by the City.


High Priority Critical Improvements Projects

The City of Richmond and Veolia Water (Veolia) are implementing High Priority Critical Improvements Projects at the City's Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP), which is managed and operated by Veolia. The purpose of the projects is to replace aging and unreliable infrastructure, improve treatment operating efficiency, comply with future discharge regulations and improve the functionality of the existing WWTP. The improvements were identified through previous planning efforts, including the 2010 WWTP Master Plan and the 2016 WWTP Facility Plan, to construct the following elements of the WWTP Critical Improvements Projects: (1) New screening and grit removal facilities; (2) Aeration upgrades; and (3) Demolition of existing facilities and site clearing in preparation for future WWTP Facilities. The projects are expected to take approximately 2 ½ years to complete.

Shimmick placed concrete on part of the foundation of the Pista Grit structure. On the blower building, forms and rebar for the footing were installed. Shimmick also placed and compacted AB for the new Biofilter structure and started construction of a new gate in the Aeration Basins.







First Street Relief Sewer Project

The First Street Relief Sewer and Pipeline Rehabilitation Project is the final of four design projects from the comprehensive 2016 Collection System Design Project, which also included the construction of the Cutting/Carlson and Hoffman Project (originally two projects), and the Macdonald and Virginia Wet Weather Improvement Project. The Project consists of approximately 3,743 lineal feet of open cut replacement of existing 6-inch sewer, approximately 1,696 lineal feet of open cut replacement of existing 8-inch sewer, approximately 631 lineal feet of open cut replacement of existing 10-inch sewer, and approximately 125 lineal feet of open cut replacement of existing 18-in sewer. This project began in July 2021 and is expected to be completed well ahead of the Baykeeper due date of July 2023.

To date, D’Arcy & Harty Construction has completed replacement of the entire 6,195 total lineal feet of sewer main line piping included in the project scope. Pipe replacement work was completed in December 2021. Currently, the Contractor is completing filming of the last few segments of NASSCO compliant CCTV video documenting all newly replaced pipes prior to scheduling final street restoration. The first set of post CCTV videos was provided in January 2022. Review by VW Housen Associates Team started in February 2022.

High Priority Sewer Line Replacement Project

The High Priority Sewer Line Replacement Project replaces eight pipelines with a combined length of around 2,700 lineal feet. Scope of work includes reconnection of existing laterals at main sewer laterals, connection to existing manholes and hardscape and pavement restorations.

To date, D’Arcy & Harty Construction has completed sewer main replacement installations at Potrero and 41st, 12277 San Pablo Ave, 1903 Garvin Avenue, 311 - 341

E Richmond, Dimm Street (right of way in street) between Barrett & Humboldt and 1460 Rifle Range Road. Right of entry easement documents have been distributed for resident signatures for two other segments, near 550 Key and 415 Dimm streets. More signatures will be required for an additional pipeline segment North on Key to Roosevelt.

2021 Grade 5 RAA Line Replacement Project

The 2021 Grade 5 RAA (Risk Assessment Analysis) Replacement Project replaces seven sewer pipelines with an approximate combined length of 760 lineal feet. The work includes replacement of deteriorated sewer pipe segments within the collection system using pipe bursting or open cut methods. This project was competitively bid to be performed on a "design-build" basis: the Contractor is responsible for engaging the services of an engineering firm to issue design drawings for lines with utility conflicts and other constructability issues and prepare final, as-built drawings.

W.R. Forde has completed installations at 21st Street and Potrero; Rheem and 23rd Street; 4925 Macdonald ("Planet Fitness"); Virginia and 22nd Streets, 1600 Chancellor and AC Transit at 21st Street between Bissell and Carlson. Their next work area is in the vicinity of 403 McLaughlin. Easement document signatures have been collected to provide access necessary behind businesses and in backyards to replace this broken line. The Contractor is continuing Pre-CCTV investigation as well as utilizing drones to locate the upstream manhole needed to finalize the design.

Sodium Bisulfite (SBS) Facility Improvement Project

The City of Richmond (COR) and West County Agency (WCA) entered into a Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) on July 27, 2020, to share the design and construction costs associated with the new Sodium Bisulfite Facility construction and system upgrade. During the design of the new SBS Facility, WCA and the COR agreed to upgrade the SHS mechanical, electrical, plumbing, instrumentation, and SCADA system, as well. Myers & Sons Construction, LLC is the Contractor. The SBS Facility Improvements Project includes the following major elements:

- New sodium bisulfite and sodium hypochlorite chemical metering and instrumentation systems to replace the existing chemical metering and instrumentation systems.
- Sodium bisulfite and sodium hypochlorite improvements include civil, structural, mechanical, electrical, instrumentation and SCADA system and facility improvements.
- Demolition of existing facilities for project improvements.

Myers & Sons continued excavating for the new structure and exposed the existing utilities to be rerouted during construction (see photos below).



SCADA Upgrade Project

The SCADA project (an acronym for Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition) will standardize, replace and configure the existing SCADA Network communication, the majority of which is outdated, failing and has exceeded its useful life. An upgraded SCADA system is crucial to allow for Veolia Staff at the City of Richmond's Wastewater Treatment Plant to monitor and control processes locally and at remote locations, including remote telemetry of the City's lift stations.

The contractor is Calcon Systems, Inc. The project is approximately 98% complete, and the contractor is installing roughly 300+/- field instrumentation tags throughout the

WWTP facilities which correspond to SCADA system program identification labels (see photos below).
