




Lifeguard Job Information Day

Anyone interested is invited to attend. The minimum age to get certified is 15, but we also welcome younger kids to come ask questions too! Anyone under 18 must have a parent sign a waiver. We welcome strong swimmers who can work a minimum of one shift per week. We encourage attendees to try the lifeguard pre-course skills, so bring your suit, towel, and goggles. 4. **City Manager's Chronicles**

Meetings and events of note in the past week include the following:

- Met with the City Manager's Office and Finance staff to continue reviewing and refining the Fiscal Year 21-22 Mid-Year presentation to ensure accuracy
- Continued discussions about the Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) Program with Interim City Attorney Dave Aleshire, Interim Deputy City Manager Anil Comelo, and Fire Chief Angel Montoya
- Participated in a tour of the City's recreational facilities along with Interim Director of Library and Community Services LaShonda White, and Community Services Deputy Director Ranjana Maharaj
- Along with City staff members, I participated in a meeting with Charles River and Associates to discuss the preliminary draft of the analysis report
- Participated in meeting with Mayor Butt, City staff, and CalTrans staff to discuss the status of the current CalTrans properties and to work collaboratively with our state and local partners to improve the built environment
- I met with Katrinka Ruk, Executive Director of Council of Business & Industries to discuss several items of mutual interest

- Reviewed and discussed the Risk Management budget with colleagues from the City Attorney's Office and Human Resources Department

I continued one-on-one weekly meetings with members of the City Council, community members, Management Leadership Team, and met with Department Heads in our one-on-one check-ins and continued working on the City Council agenda packet with the City Clerk's Office, City Attorney's Office, and various City staff members.

5. **Fire Department**

Castro Encampment Update

The Fire Prevention Division assisted with the recent abatement within the Castro encampment. Parking Enforcement assisted in the removal of non-operational vehicles. Public Works assisted with removal of trash debris; Contra Costa Environmental Health and Civicorps assisted with the removal of 186 tires within the encampment, for a total of 325 total tires removed within the last two weeks. Richmond Pacific Railroad Corporation assisted with the rearrangement and placement of K-rails within encampment.

Fire Marshal Govan had seven fire extinguishers serviced and returned to the residents. Additionally, he was able to review the fire safety elements of cooking safety and how to use a fire extinguisher properly.





City of Richmond, Pogo Park Awarded \$10 million in Clean California Local Grant Program Funds

The City of Richmond received two grants totaling \$10 million from the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) Clean California Local Grant Program. The program provides funds to local and regional public agencies, transit agencies, tribal governments, and nonprofits to clean and beautify public spaces, including local streets and roads, tribal lands, parks, pathways, and transit centers.

The competitive program received 329 applications totaling \$758.5 million in requests. 105 proposals were awarded funding from the \$296 million available. Please read below for the descriptions of the two awards.



Richmond Communities Clean Collaborative: \$5,000,000

Richmond Communities Clean Collaborative consists of two infrastructure projects: the Boorman Park Revitalization Project and the 7th Street Connection Project. The Boorman Park project will reconstruct an existing park and change the site layout for safety and ease of maintenance. The 7th Street project consists of a sidewalk and bicycle facility gap closure and the transformation of an unpaved alley on 7th Street into a plaza area with permeable pavers and trees.

The Clean Collaborative also includes multiple projects concentrated in a cluster of neighborhoods in the heart of the City of Richmond: the Iron Triangle, Atchison Village, Richmore Village/Metro Square, Belding Woods, Cortez/Stege, Coronado, and Santa Fe. Youth, individuals impacted by the social justice system, unhoused neighbors, and other residents will be engaged through partnerships and programs.

Yellow Brick Road: Clean, Green & Beautiful \$4,999,995

Yellow Brick Road®: Clean, Green, and Beautiful is Phase 3 of the Yellow Brick Road Project (YBR) in Richmond's Iron Triangle neighborhood. While Phase 1 constructed pedestrian-friendly street infrastructure and Phase 2 will add plants and trees, Phase 3 will install human-scale street lighting, litter abatement facilities, wayfinding and placemaking signage, and public art elements on 8th Street and Pennsylvania Avenue in Richmond.

The Project also proposes decorative fencing at Harbour-8 Park as well as public art and a litter abatement campaign for residents who live within a 1/4-mile of the project site. The Yellow Brick Road project will clean and beautify city streets and parks and will provide place-making elements to actualize the community's vision to create a clean, green and safe street for biking and walking in the Iron Triangle neighborhood.

Eligibility:

- Parcels served by the City of Richmond Sanitary Municipal Sewer District.
- Sewer lateral replacement must be completed **BEFORE** applying for the Sewer Lateral Grant Program.
- A full line replacement must be completed.
- If you have previously received a Sewer Lateral Grant reimbursement, you will not be eligible to apply.

Required Documents:

- Only Lateral Grant Applications dated 6/30/2021 or newer will be accepted.
- Contractor's final paid in full invoice.
- Proof of payment (copy of canceled check, credit card receipt, or bank statement are accepted).
- Certificate of Lateral Compliance (issued by the City after encroachment permit inspections are approved).
- Grant Deed (change of ownership takes place within last 3 months and/or if property is under a Trust).
- Tax-exempt organizations must submit proof of tax-exempt status.


Amount Limits:

- Each fiscal year the City allocates sewer lateral grant funds to be awarded for private sewer lateral replacement.
- This program can be suspended at any time without prior or advanced notification or posting.
- Property owner(s) are eligible for **ONE (1)** sewer lateral grant reimbursement award in a lifetime on a first come, first served basis until all sewer lateral funds are exhausted.
- Starting July 1, 2021 and ending June 30, 2022, the complete sewer lateral grant reimbursement amount is \$1,000 per application.
- Incomplete applications will **NOT** be accepted.
- Applications will be accepted via email and mail at this time. This is subject to change.
- No applications will be accepted after the sewer lateral grant funds are exhausted.
- Reimbursement may take approximately 5 weeks from the date the completed application is received and approved by the City.

High Priority Critical Improvements Projects

The improvements were identified through previous planning efforts, including the 2010 WWTP Master Plan and the 2016 WWTP Facility Plan, to construct the following elements of the WWTP Critical Improvements Projects: (1) New screening and grit removal facilities; (2) Aeration upgrades; and (3) Demolition of existing facilities and site clearing in preparation for future WWTP Facilities. The projects are expected to take approximately 2 ½ years to complete.

Shimmick continued working on the Pista Grit structure, erecting the wall forms and installing the reinforcing steel. Shimmick also continued working on the blower building by placing the concrete on the north half of the foundation slab and continuing construction of electrical duct banks to power the future equipment; they also continued working on the Aeration Basins doing concrete crack repairs, installing blanking plates and forming the wall and columns for the future slide gate.



First Street Relief Sewer Project

The First Street Relief Sewer and Pipeline Rehabilitation Project is the final of four design projects from the comprehensive 2016 Collection System Design Project, which also included the construction of the Cutting/Carlson and Hoffman Project (originally two projects), and the Macdonald and Virginia Wet Weather Improvement Project. The Project consists of approximately 3,743 lineal feet of open cut replacement of existing 6-inch sewer, approximately 1,696 lineal feet of open cut replacement of existing 8-inch sewer, approximately 631 lineal feet of open cut replacement of existing 10-inch sewer, and approximately 125 lineal feet of open cut replacement of existing 18-in sewer. This project began in July 2021 and is expected to be completed well ahead of the Baykeeper due date of July 2023.

To date, D'Arcy & Harty Construction has completed replacement of the entire 6,195 total lineal feet of sewer main line piping included in the project scope. Pipe replacement work was completed in December 2021. Currently, the Contractor is completing filming of the last few segments of NASSCO compliant CCTV video documenting all newly replaced pipes prior to scheduling final street restoration. The first set of post CCTV videos was provided in January 2022. Review by V.W. Housen Associates team started in February 2022. Currently, post CCTV video production and review continue.

High Priority Sewer Line Replacement Project

The High Priority Sewer Line Replacement Project replaces (8) pipelines with a combined length of around 2,700 lineal feet. Scope of work includes reconnection of existing laterals at mains, connection to existing manholes and hardscape and pavement restorations.

To date, D'Arcy & Harty Construction has completed sewer main replacement installations at Potrero and 41st, 12277 San Pablo Ave, 1903 Garvin Avenue, 311 - 341 E Richmond, Dimm Street (right of way in street) between Barrett & Humboldt and 1460 Rifle Range Road. Right of entry easement documents have been distributed for resident signatures for two (2) other segments, near 550 Key and 415 Dimm. More signatures have been gathered for the additional pipeline segment north on Key to Roosevelt. Currently, pipe replacement work is completely shut down pending action by the City Manager's office to finalize right of entry/easement access authorization letters. After access is granted, the Contractor will remobilize to complete investigational pre-CCTV, design and replace the mainline pipe and reconnect laterals on these segments.

2021 Grade 5 RAA Line Replacement Project

The 2021 Grade 5 RAA (Risk Assessment Analysis) Replacement Project replaces seven sewer pipelines with an approximate combined length of 760 lineal feet. The work includes replacement of deteriorated sewer pipe segments within the collection system using pipe bursting or open cut methods. This project was competitively bid to be

performed on a "design-build" basis: the Contractor is responsible for engaging the services of an engineering firm to issue design drawings for lines with utility conflicts and other constructability issues and also prepare final, as-built drawings.

W.R. Forde has completed installations at 21st Street and Potrero; Rheem and 23rd Street; 4925 Macdonald ("Planet Fitness"); Virginia and 22nd Streets, 1600 Chancellor and AC Transit at 21st Street between Bissell and Carlson. Their next work area is in the vicinity of 403 McLaughlin. Easement document signatures have been collected to provide access necessary behind businesses and in backyards to replace this broken line. The Contractor has completed pre-CCTV investigation and even utilized drones to locate the upstream manhole needed to finalize the design. They will return to complete line replacement and install a new manhole once the right of entry/easement access authorization letters have been approved and processed by the City Manager's Office.

Marina Bay Parkway Force Main Extension Project

The Marina Bay Parkway Force Main Extension Project extends the existing Marina Bay Parkway forcemain to a new manhole at the Intersection of Pierson Avenue and Marina Bay Parkway and installs a new gravity sewer pipeline from the Pierson/Jetty Drive intersection, across Marina Bay Parkway. This piping reconfiguration will eliminate sanitary sewer overflows that occur from depressed manholes located at the intersection of Marina Bay Parkway and Pierson Avenue. Richmond-based, local contractor W.R. Forde Associates was the lowest, responsive bidder at \$357,200.00.

The project work was initially completed in December 2021. The Contractor returned recently to install a bolt down manhole frame and cover on the new manhole at the termination of the Force Main. The material for the manhole frame and cover were a long-lead item and were installed last week. Additional scope to alleviate future SSO's by adding 991 LF of 8" gravity sewer main and three (3) new manholes with bolt down covers is being formalized.

Sodium Bisulfite (SBS) Facility Improvements Project

The City of Richmond (COR) and West County Agency (WCA) entered into a Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) on July 27, 2020 to share the design and construction costs associated with the new Sodium Bisulfite Facility construction and system upgrade. During the design of the new SBS Facility, WCA and the COR agreed to upgrade the SHS mechanical, electrical, plumbing, instrumentation and SCADA system, as well. Myers & Sons Construction, LLC is the Contractor. The SBS Facility Improvements Project includes the following major elements:

- New sodium bisulfite and sodium hypochlorite chemical metering and instrumentation systems to replace the existing chemical metering and instrumentation systems.

- Sodium bisulfite and sodium hypochlorite improvements include civil, structural, mechanical, electrical, instrumentation and SCADA system and facility improvements.
- Demolition of existing facilities for project improvements.

Myers & Sons did not work onsite last week. They worked on submittals and Method of Procedure (MOP) paperwork for future shutdowns to reroute existing utilities outside of the new building's footprint.

SCADA Upgrade Project

The SCADA project (Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition) will standardize, replace and configure the existing SCADA Network communication, the majority of which is outdated, failing and has exceeded its useful life. An upgraded SCADA system is crucial to allow for Veolia Staff at the City of Richmond's Wastewater Treatment Plant to monitor and control processes locally and at remote locations, including remote telemetry of the City's lift stations.

The contractor is Calcon Systems, Inc. The project is approximately 98% complete, and the contractor is installing roughly 300+/- field instrumentation tags throughout the WWTP facilities which correspond to SCADA system program identification labels (see photos below).

Deadline Extension: Richmond Promise Scholarship Application Submissions Now Due April 13TH!

The Richmond Promise has extended its scholarship application deadline to April 13TH - a month beyond its original March deadline.

This decision also follows the Cal Grant extension of financial aid deadlines for students attending schools within the West Contra Costa Unified School District to March 31, 2022 (meaning students have two more weeks to make sure their Free Application for Federal Student Aid and/or California Dream Acts are submitted, as is required before applying for the Richmond Promise Scholarship).

Burnout among Richmond's high school graduates continues to take an unprecedented toll on financial aid and scholarship application completion rates. For the Richmond Promise, this extension is an essential component of our commitment to ensuring that no student from Richmond gets left behind in the pursuit of their dreams, and that our Scholarship and services support as many of Richmond's youth as possible through their higher education journeys.
