United Against Hate


United Against Hate is a call for local civic action to stop the hate and implicit biases that are a dangerous threat to the safety and civility of our neighborhoods, towns and cities.

United Against Hate Week emerged from a United Against Hate poster campaign created by Bay Area Cities in response to white supremacist rallies in Berkeley and San Francisco in 2017.

The original 13 communities were convened in 2018 by Not In Our Town, a national anti-hate organization and partner in the LA vs Hate campaign, and committed to an annual week of action and awareness.

Since inception, United Against Hate Week has spread to over 200+ communities including all of Los Angeles County, faith-based groups, LGBTQ and human rights organizations, and is beginning to takeoff throughout California and in communities across the U.S. United Against Hate Week is November 14-20. Let's not wait until November.




Lifeguard Job Information Day


An Evening of Poetry and Health

6. **City Manager's Office Economic Development**

In November 2020, Richmond voters approved Measure U, a business license tax calculation based on gross receipts. To ease the transition to the Measure U Business Tax Certificate Program, the City of Richmond's Finance Department has established multiple resources to assist businesses. The City has updated its website, <https://www.ci.richmond.ca.us/measureU>, to include additional resources and to make it easier to navigate, including:

- 1) Principal Business/Professional Activity Code
- 2) Tool to estimate Measure U Tax Bills
- 3) Resolutions and Administrative Rulings for Measure U

In addition, the City of Richmond has developed an online renewal process that will automatically calculate your Measure U Tax after you enter your business's NAICS code and gross receipts. To complete the online renewal process, visit <https://etrakit.ci.richmond.ca.us>. Please note, Class O and N businesses currently cannot calculate the business tax online. At a virtual Public Safety Dinner, hosted by the Richmond Kiwanis Club, the Richmond Fire Department was honored to announce Captain Ben Faulkner as Richmond Fire Department's 2021 Firefighter of the Year.

Captain Faulkner has been a devoted member of the Richmond Fire Department since 2015. He's overcome a great deal of adversity in his career path further demonstrating his dedication and unwavering commitment to this department. He has consistently demonstrated an exceptional work ethic, and a positive attitude toward his fellow firefighters and the citizens of Richmond and surrounding communities.

Captain Faulkner is an Emergency Medical Technician trainer, conducting trainings and testing for firefighters' State Emergency Medical Technician Certifications. Captain Faulkner has coordinated training sessions and multi-company drills in various rescue disciplines such as Confined Space Rescue, High Angle Rope Rescue, Low Angle Rope Rescue and Vehicle Extrication. Currently, Captain Faulkner is working to establish a Rapid Extraction Module Support Team used in large Wildland Incidents to provide firefighters a safe and efficient method of egress from an active fire-line during dangerous wildland firefighting operations.

He is deeply committed to community involvement. He actively volunteers his time to participate in public clean-up efforts run by various groups, as well as holiday and community drives and has built great relationships with the residents of Richmond.

None of these accolades are self-serving or for show. He is very humble and exemplifies the image of a Richmond firefighter. He is compassionate, committed, and courageous. His relentless pursuit to improve those around him and dedication to increasing the departments overall capabilities make him an extremely valued asset within the Richmond Fire Department.





Engineering & Capital Projects

Yellow Brick Road Pedestrian & Bicycle Improvements Project

Last week Ghilotti Bros, Inc. (GBI) continued forming and pouring the concrete curb ramps at Ripley and 8th Street. They began the remaining demo work at 7th Street and Acacia Ave to install a new curb ramp and valley gutter. The electrical subcontractor continued to work along Pennsylvania Avenue at 5th and 7th Street intersections installing traffic signal modifications. They completed the horizontal boring north of Pennsylvania Ave near Lincoln and Lucas Avenues. They also continued to install

street light boxes along 8th Street north of Barrett Ave. This week GBI is completing the curb ramps at the southeast and northeast corners of 7th Street and Pennsylvania Ave. They will also start on the concrete curb ramps and valley gutter at 7th Street and Acacia Ave. The electrical subcontractor is continuing to work along Pennsylvania at the 5th Street and 7th Street intersections to install the traffic signal modifications. They will continue installing the street light boxes along 8th Street north of Barrett Ave. They also plan on installing the remaining street light conduit along the west side of 8th Street from Nevin to Barrett Ave and along the east side of 8th Street from Macdonald Ave to Barrett Ave.

The City of Richmond recommends obtaining estimates from at least three (3) contractors.

Eligibility:

- Parcels served by the City of Richmond Sanitary Municipal Sewer District.
- Sewer lateral replacement must be completed **BEFORE** applying for the Sewer Lateral Grant Program.
- A full line replacement must be completed.
- If you have previously received a Sewer Lateral Grant reimbursement, you will not be eligible to apply.

Required Documents:

- Only Lateral Grant Applications dated 6/30/2021 or newer will be accepted.
- Contractor's final paid in full invoice.
- Proof of payment (copy of cancelled check, credit card receipt, or bank statement are accepted).
- Certificate of Lateral Compliance (issued by the City after encroachment permit inspections are approved).
- Grant Deed (change of ownership taken place within last 3 months and/or if property is under a Trust).
- Tax-exempt organizations must submit proof of tax-exempt status.

Award Limits:

- Each fiscal year the City allocates sewer lateral grant funds to be awarded for private sewer lateral replacement.
- This program can be suspended at any time without prior or advanced notification or posting.
- Property owner(s) are eligible for **ONE (1)** sewer lateral grant reimbursement award in a lifetime on a first come, first served basis until all sewer lateral funds are exhausted.
- Starting July 1, 2021 and ending June 30, 2022, the complete sewer lateral grant reimbursement amount is \$1,800 per application.
- Incomplete applications will **NOT** be accepted.
- Applications will be accepted via email and mail at this time. This is subject to change.
- No applications will be accepted after the sewer lateral grant funds are exhausted.
- Reimbursement may take approximately 3 weeks from the date the completed application is received and approved by the City.


High Priority Critical Improvements Projects

The City of Richmond and Veolia Water (Veolia) are implementing High Priority Critical Improvements Projects at the City's Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP), which is managed and operated by Veolia. The purpose of the projects is to replace aging and unreliable infrastructure, improve treatment operating efficiency, comply with future discharge regulations, and improve the functionality of the existing WWTP. The improvements were identified through previous planning efforts, including the 2010 WWTP Master Plan and the 2016 WWTP Facility Plan, to construct the following elements of the WWTP Critical Improvements Projects: (1) New screening and grit removal facilities; (2) Aeration upgrades; and (3) Demolition of existing facilities and site clearing in preparation for future WWTP Facilities. The projects are expected to take approximately 2 ½ years to complete.


Shimmick continued working on the Pista Grit structure, erecting the wall forms and installing the reinforcing steel. 

First Street Relief Sewer Project

The First Street Relief Sewer and Pipeline Rehabilitation Project is the final of four design projects from the comprehensive 2016 Collection System Design Project, which also included the construction of the Cutting/Carlson and Hoffman Project (originally two projects), and the Macdonald and Virginia Wet Weather Improvement Project. The Project consists of approximately 3,743 lineal feet of open cut replacement of existing 6-inch sewer, approximately 1,696 lineal feet of open cut replacement of existing 8-inch sewer, approximately 631 lineal feet of open cut replacement of existing 10-inch sewer, and approximately 125 lineal feet of open cut replacement of existing 18-in sewer. This project began in July 2021 and is expected to be completed well ahead of the Baykeeper due date of July 2023.

To date, D'Arcy & Harty Construction has completed replacement of the entire 6,195 total lineal feet of sewer main line piping included in the project scope. Pipe replacement work was completed in December 2021. Currently, the Contractor is completing filming of the last few segments of NASSCO compliant CCTV video documenting all newly replaced pipes prior to scheduling final street restoration. The first set of post CCTV videos was provided in January 2022. Review by V.W. Housen and Associates team started in February 2022. Currently, post CCTV video production and review continue.

High Priority Sewer Line Replacement Project

The High Priority Sewer Line Replacement Project replaces (8) pipelines with a combined length of around 2,700 lineal feet. Scope of work includes reconnection of existing laterals at mains, connection to existing manholes and hardscape and pavement restorations.

To date, D'Arcy & Harty Construction has completed sewer main replacement installations at Potrero and 41st, 12277 San Pablo Ave, 1903 Garvin Avenue, 311 - 341 E Richmond, Dimm Street (right of way in street) between Barrett & Humboldt and 1460 Rifle Range Road. Right of entry easement documents have been distributed for resident signatures for two (2) other segments, near 550 Key and 415 Dimm. More signatures have been gathered for the additional pipeline segment north on Key to Roosevelt. Currently, pipe replacement work is completely shut down pending action by the City Manager's office to finalize right of entry/easement access authorization letters. After access is granted, the Contractor will remobilize to complete investigational pre-CCTV, design and replace the mainline pipe and reconnect laterals on these segments.

2021 Grade 5 RAA Line Replacement Project

The 2021 Grade 5 RAA (Risk Assessment Analysis) Replacement Project replaces seven sewer pipelines with an approximate combined length of 760 lineal feet. The work includes replacement of deteriorated sewer pipe segments within the collection system using pipe bursting or open cut methods. This project was competitively bid to be

performed on a "design-build" basis: the Contractor is responsible for engaging the services of an engineering firm to issue design drawings for lines with utility conflicts and other constructability issues and prepare final, as-built drawings. W.R. Forde has completed installations at 21st Street and Potrero; Rheem and 23rd Street; 4925 Macdonald ("Planet Fitness"); Virginia and 22nd Streets, 1600 Chancellor and AC Transit at 21st Street between Bissell and Carlson. Currently they are replacing 278 lineal feet of failed 6" clay sewer main with new 8" High-Density Polyethylene (HDPE) pipe via the "Pipe Bursting" method in the vicinity of 403 McLaughlin.

Marina Bay Parkway Force Main Extension Project

The Marina Bay Parkway Force Main Extension Project extends the existing Marina Bay Parkway forcemain to a new manhole at the Intersection of Pierson Avenue and Marina Bay Parkway and installs a new gravity sewer pipeline from the Pierson/Jetty Drive intersection, across Marina Bay Parkway. This piping reconfiguration will eliminate sanitary sewer overflows that occur from depressed manholes located at the intersection of Marina Bay Parkway and Pierson Avenue. Richmond-based, local contractor W.R. Forde Associates, was the lowest, responsive bidder at \$357,200.00.

The project work was initially completed in December 2021. The Contractor returned recently to install a bolt down manhole frame and cover on the new manhole at the termination of the Force Main. The material for the manhole frame and cover were a long-lead item and were installed last week. Additional scope to alleviate future SSO's by adding 991 LF of 8" gravity sewer main and three (3) new manholes with bolt down covers is being formalized.

Sodium Bisulfite (SBS) Facility Improvements Project

The City of Richmond (COR) and West County Agency (WCA) entered into a Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) on July 27, 2020 to share the design and construction costs associated with the new Sodium Bisulfite Facility construction and system upgrade. During the design of the new SBS Facility, WCA and the COR agreed to upgrade the SHS mechanical, electrical, plumbing, instrumentation and SCADA system, as well. Myers & Sons Construction, LLC is the Contractor. The SBS Facility Improvements Project includes the following major elements:

- New sodium bisulfite and sodium hypochlorite chemical metering and instrumentation systems to replace the existing chemical metering and instrumentation systems.
- Sodium bisulfite and sodium hypochlorite improvements include civil, structural, mechanical, electrical, instrumentation and SCADA system and facility improvements.
- Demolition of existing facilities for project improvements.

Myers & Sons rerouted existing operational utilities outside of the footprint of the new building and potholed West County's effluent line, north of the confluence structure, to determine a good way to install the new valve and mixer.



SCADA Upgrade Project

The SCADA project (an acronym for Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition) will standardize, replace and configure the existing SCADA Network communication, the majority of which is outdated, failing and has exceeded its useful life. An upgraded SCADA system is crucial to allow for Veolia Staff at the City of Richmond's Wastewater Treatment Plant to monitor and control processes locally and at remote locations, including remote telemetry of the City's lift stations.

The contractor is Calcon Systems, Inc. The project is approximately 98% complete, and the contractor is installing roughly 300+/- field instrumentation tags throughout the WWTP facilities which correspond to SCADA system program identification labels (see photos below).
