Sound the Alarm Program

Home fires claim seven lives every day in the U.S. The Richmond Fire Department and the Red Cross are leading a *Sound the Alarm* free smoke alarm installation and home fire safety event on **Saturday, May 7th** as part of a national Red Cross initiative in May to install free smoke alarms in the City of Richmond. In addition to installing free smoke alarms, firefighters and volunteers will also provide home fire safety information to help residents know how to prevent and respond to home fires. In a home fire, you may have less than 2 minutes to escape. When every second counts, this community education and prevention can save a life.

Of all the ways the Richmond Fire Department protects our community, none are more important than the events at which our firefighters, professional staff, volunteers, and external partners collaborate to promote fire education and prevent tragedy.

In addition to smoke alarms installed during the May 7th event, Richmond residents who need smoke alarms can call (510) 307-8038 or email free10yearsmokealarm@ci.richmond.ca.us to schedule an appointment for a free smoke alarm installation in their home at any time. During a 20-minute home visit, Richmond Firefighters and community partners will install free smoke alarms and share information on the causes of home fires, how to prevent them, what to do if a fire starts and how to create an escape plan.

Primary Election

Primary election date is Tuesday, **June 7th, 2022**. Polls are open from 7:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M. on election day! **Vote-by-Mail Drop Boxes Open May 10th**.

Every registered voter in California will receive a vote-by-mail ballot in the Primary Election. County elections officials will begin mailing vote-by-mail ballots on or before May 9th.

The City of Richmond's permanent Vote-by-Mail box is located at 450 Civic Center Plaza under the overpass just off the Council parking lot on 27th Street.

[Register to vote online or update your current registration](#). Register to vote by May 23rd, 2022.

Voting Eligibility

You are eligible to register to vote if you are:

- A United States citizen,
- 18 years of age or older on Election Day,
- Not currently serving a state or federal prison term for the conviction of a felony, and
- Not currently found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law.

You need to update your registration if you:

- Move to a new residence,
- Change your name, or
- Want to change your political party affiliation.

You may have a voter registration form mailed to you by calling the Secretary of State's toll-free Voter Hotline at (800) 345-VOTE (8683). You may also pick up a voter registration form at Contra Costa County Elections Office – 555 Escobar Street, Martinez, California 94553 or Richmond City Hall – 450 Civic Center Plaza lobby.

4. City Manager's Chronicles

Meetings and events of note in the past week include the following:

- Met with Finance and City Manager's Office Staff to discuss the monthly financial reports for the month of March 2022;
- Participated in the Hilltop District Neighborhood Council Meeting where I introduced myself to the neighborhood residents via Zoom and provided updates on the current staffing levels, the I Heart Richmond campaign and answered questions from residents;

- Hosted the City Manager/Union Leaders meeting, where we discussed the Fiscal Year 2022-23 budget, revenue enhancements options, and Measure U implementation;
- Along with Community Development Director Lina Velasco, we continued to interview candidates for the Housing Manager position that is open in the Community Development Department;
- Met with Clifford Chan, General Manager of East Bay Municipal Utilities District (EBMUD) to discuss items of mutual interest;
- Listened to the Reimagining Public Safety Community Task Force meeting;
- Reviewed and discussed financial and budget updates with Finance and City Manager's Office staff, including the upcoming FY 2022-23 department budget hearings that will be presented at City Council;

Continued one-on-one weekly meetings with members of the City Council, community members, the Management Leadership Team, Department Heads in our one-on-one check-ins, City Attorney's Office, and various City staff members.

HOME-American Rescue Plan (HOME-ARP)

Contra Costa County needs your input on homelessness needs within your community.

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 appropriated \$5 billion to assist individuals or households who are homeless, at risk of homelessness, and other vulnerable populations, by providing rental housing, rental assistance, supportive services, and non-congregate shelter, to reduce homelessness and increase housing stability. In September 2021, HUD awarded the Contra Costa County HOME Consortium (which consists of Contra Costa County and the Cities of Antioch, Concord, Pittsburg, and Walnut Creek) **\$12,090,215** in HOME-ARP funds.

We invite you to share your thoughts by taking a survey.

The HOME-ARP survey is designed to gather information from stakeholders, affordable housing developers, and community members about homelessness needs in Contra Costa County and HOME-ARP projects being planned. The survey takes approximately 10 minutes to complete and will be available until **June 1st, 2022**.





Richmond Moves Is Officially In Service!

On April 20, 2022, Mayor Thomas Butt introduced Richmond MOVES during Richmond's Drive Electric Earth Day Event. Also in attendance was Peter Christensen, Chief of the Innovative Strategies Branch at the California Air Resources Board, Garrett Brinker, Partnerships Lead for the Western US at Via, Audrey Momoh, the District Director for Senator Skinner, and Robert Rogers, District Coordinator for the Office of County Supervisor John Gioia.

In addition to the display of eBikes, twenty-three electric vehicles including a zero emission AC Transit bus and MOTIV step truck were on display. All the vehicles on display had a combined total of 714,000 E miles driven which is the equivalent of planting over 18,000 trees and letting them grow for 10 years.

On April 25, the City of Richmond, CA and Via, the global leader in TransitTech, officially launched Richmond Moves, the city's first on-demand public shuttle service. 

Cutting Boulevard Restriping Project

Over the next couple of weeks WR Forde Associates, Inc., alongside their striping subcontractor, will be restriping Cutting Boulevard from South Garrard Boulevard to Hoffman Boulevard. This project will provide a new bicycle lane for the location listed.

Along with the striping the bikeway project will also be installing an asphalt berm along the corridor as a buffer between the bikeway and the vehicle lanes. They will be coordinating the traffic control efforts to minimize impact to the roadway while their striping operations are in progress.

Via Verdi Slope Stabilization Project

This project is nearing completion. The work here included construction of a culvert in San Pablo Creek, earthwork, utility work, reconstruction of the damaged portion of Via Verdi Drive and removal of the temporary detour road.

Ghilotti Bros, Inc. (GBI) continued to grind existing pavement and place new hot mix asphalt (HMA) pavement at the following locations: Macdonald Avenue, Barrett Avenue, Nevin Avenue and Hawthorne Avenue.

The electrical subcontractor continued to install traffic signal modifications at 5th Street and Pennsylvania Avenue and at 7th Street and Pennsylvania Avenue.
