Primary election date is **Tuesday, June 7th, 2022**. Polls are open from 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM on election day! **Vote-by-Mail Drop Boxes Open May 10th**.

Every registered voter in California will receive a vote-by-mail ballot in the Primary Election. County elections officials will begin mailing vote-by-mail ballots on or before May 9th.

The City of Richmond's permanent Vote-by-Mail box is located at 450 Civic Center Plaza under the overpass just off the Council parking lot on 27th Street.

Voting Eligibility

You are eligible to register to vote if you are:

- A United States citizen,
- 18 years of age or older on Election Day,
- Not currently serving a state or federal prison term for the conviction of a felony, and
- Not currently found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law.

You need to update your registration if you:

- Move to a new residence,
- Change your name, or
- Want to change your political party affiliation.

You may have a voter registration form mailed to you by calling the Secretary of State's toll-free Voter Hotline at (800) 345-VOTE (8683). You may also pick up a voter registration form at Contra Costa County Elections Office – 555 Escobar Street, Martinez, California 94553 or Richmond City Hall – 450 Civic Center Plaza lobby.

Bay Area Health Officials Share Guidance to Navigate the U.S.' Infant Formula Shortage



There continues to be a shortage of infant formula nationwide due to supply chain issues and a recall of infant formula due to bacterial contamination in the Abbott manufacturing plant in Michigan. The federal government is currently working on strategies to increase production of formula and help families access existing stock.

Compared to other states California is faring better, but the shortages are still of concern.

Babies need the right balance of nutrients- not too much or too little of anything- to grow and be healthy. It is important for your baby's health to use products that meet federal standards to ensure the formula is safe and free of harmful bacteria.

During this challenging time, the counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Napa, San Benito, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Solano, Sonoma, and the City of Berkeley encourage parents and families to:

- **If you are currently breastfeeding, continue if possible.** We recognize this option may not be viable for everyone. If someone is partially breastfeeding, they may consider reaching out to a lactation care provider (in-person or by telehealth) to help ensure that they maintain or increase their milk supply by breastfeeding more.
- **Talk to your child's doctor about substituting formula brands.** For most babies, if their regular brand of formula is not currently available, it is OK to substitute with a similar version. Also **consult your child's pediatrician if your baby requires a specialized formula**, (therapeutic or metabolic formula for an infant with a medical condition requiring different caloric or nutrient content), before making any

substitution. Your pediatrician may recommend a milk bank referral. If you have questions about which formula is acceptable, contact your child's pediatrician or your local WIC agency. (In Contra Costa County, call (800) 414-4WIC.)

- **Avoid making your own formula at home, watering down formula to make it last longer, using expired formula, using cow, goat, or plant-based milk for formula, or giving toddler formula to infants.** Doing so can reduce the amount of nutrients a baby receives and can lead to potential serious health complications. If no other options are available to feed your baby, children over six months may be eligible for whole, pasteurized, cow's milk [r20.rs6.net], as recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics. This is not ideal and should not be done for more than one week. Talk to your pediatrician if you need to give your baby cow's milk for a week to see if this option is appropriate for your child.
- **Apply to the [WIC program \[r20.rs6.net\]](#).** About half of all births in California are in low-income families who qualify for the WIC program, and income-eligible clients can receive a WIC card and use it to purchase a limited amount of formula at participating retail stores. WIC offices are staffed by individuals with close ties to their communities. Existing WIC clients should use their benefits for formula earlier in the month in case they run into shortages near the end of their benefit period.
- **Find out what resources exist in the community** and share those resources widely. If you see infant formula in stock when you're shopping, make it known within your network.

Health officials will continue to monitor the shortage and provide updates as new information is available.

6. **Community Development**

HOME-American Rescue Plan (HOME-ARP)

Contra Costa County needs your input on homelessness needs within your community.

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 appropriated \$5 billion to assist individuals or households who are homeless, at risk of homelessness, and other vulnerable populations, by providing rental housing, rental assistance, supportive services, and non-congregate shelter, to reduce homelessness and increase housing stability. In September 2021, HUD awarded the Contra Costa County HOME Consortium (which consists of Contra Costa County and the Cities of Antioch, Concord, Pittsburg, and Walnut Creek) **\$12,090,215** in HOME-ARP funds.

We invite you to share your thoughts by taking a survey.

The HOME-ARP survey is designed to gather information from stakeholders, affordable housing developers, and community members about homelessness needs in Contra Costa County and HOME-ARP projects being planned. The survey takes approximately

10 minutes to complete and will be available until **June 1st, 2022**.

7. Fire

Richmond Fire Wildland Evacuation Drill

On May 19th, 2022, the Richmond Fire Department, with assistance from the Richmond Police Department, Contra Costa County Sheriff's Department CWS Office, and the West Contra Costa Fire Safe Council, conducted a test of the Community Warning System and a small-scale evacuation drill.

The Carriage Hills Evacuation Drill presented a unique opportunity to observe and collect data, improve communication, and find areas of needed improvement for public safety agencies and community members. The drill was structured to focus on the following objectives: public education, test of the Community Warning System, evaluation of traffic flow, readiness and resiliency of residents, and the use of the Zonehaven platform with a "Know Your Zone" campaign.

On Saturday, May 14, 2022, Richmond firefighters, in collaboration with volunteers from the 94803 Emergency Preparedness Alliance, passed out over 800 fliers to the Carriage Hills North, South and Castro Heights neighborhoods. The fliers explained details of the date and times of the drill and had information explaining how to sign up for Community Warning System Alerts, Nixle and how to log into Zonehaven. Many of these residents participated in the evacuation drill and evaluation process.

On Thursday, May 19, 2022, at 9:00 AM Residents of the Carriage Hills neighborhood received a simulated Evacuation Order via NIXLE and the Community Warning system. Residents were instructed to practice their evacuation plan by proceeding to the Temporary Evacuation Point located on the second level Macy's parking lot at 2500 Hilltop Mall Road in Richmond. In the event of a large-scale evacuation, this system will

be used to issue evacuation orders, provide incident information, and evacuation location information. The evacuation drill ended when residents reached Hilltop Mall.

Upon arrival, residents were greeted by public safety personnel, who were able to answer questions and provide information on wildfire safety and vegetation management. Residents were encouraged to sign up/register for NIXLE and Community Warning System alerts.

Following these steps will prepare you for an actual emergency:

1. Register to receive emergency alerts.

2. Save this number {925-655-0195) to your phone's contacts to prevent an emergency call being marked as "potential spam." Scan this QR to quickly load the contact card to your mobile device and save it as a known contact.




3. Text your zip code to "888777" from your mobile device to opt-in to Nixle notifications. Scan this QR code download the Nixle App.







They also began removing existing base rock from the schedule "B" planters and medians for new soil to be placed for future planting. Crosswalk stamping and coloring has been completed with the exception of Ripley and Elm Avenues at 8th Street.

The electrical subcontractor started installing streetlight poles and luminaires at 8th Street and Ohio Avenue. They will also continue to work on traffic signal modifications at 5th Street and Pennsylvania Avenue.

This week GBI is continuing to remove base rock from planters and medians, they will begin removing soil at the tree well locations in schedule "B". Their landscape subcontractor will begin placing and amending the soil at the planters and medians. GBI will complete the pavement and subgrade removal at 7th Street and will prepare to pave the area early next week.

The electrical subcontractor is continuing to stand up streetlight poles along 8th Street near Lincoln and Lucas Avenues.
