Liaison White and Task Force member Kilian-Lobos provided a brief summary and held a discussion on the recent Community Conversations roundtable meeting held in May. Discussion ensued regarding reviewing the RFP, a potential advisory board, attending an upcoming pre-bidder's meeting, and reconnecting with attendees of the recent Community Conversations roundtable.
