From Contra Costa Health: How to Have a Healthy Holiday Season

We are approaching the winter holidays, which means people will be getting together with family and loved ones. It's a great time to give thanks, get gifts, spread joy – and germs.

Here are some tips for having a healthy holiday season:

- Get tested before an indoor gathering or if you feel sick. Reduce the chances of infecting someone else with COVID by finding out if you have the virus. Make sure to stock up on [home test kits](#).
- Stay up to date on your COVID vaccinations. Upgrade your protection by getting [the latest bivalent booster shot](#), which protects against Omicron variants. Vaccines remain your best defense against hospitalization and death from COVID. [Find a COVID vaccine provider near you](#).
- Get your annual flu shot now. Health officials are expecting a bad flu season. Get protected now before flu season kicks into high gear. [Find a flu vaccine provider near you](#).
- Wear high-quality masks indoors around others. Masking isn't required, but wearing a [good mask \(K95 or N95\)](#) is still a good way to protect yourself and others from COVID.
- Stay home if you feel sick. Give gifts and thanks this holiday season, not COVID, flu or a cold.

Contra Costa County Monkeypox Updates

Contra Costa Health Services, along with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) and other agencies, are monitoring a growing outbreak of Monkeypox (MPX) cases in the United States and California. Visit the CDPH [MPX tracking page](#) for the latest information about confirmed or suspected cases of MPX in the county.

While it is good to stay alert about any emerging public health outbreaks, the current risk of getting MPX in the general public is very low, outside of certain activities that increase the chance of exposure.

We will be holding mobile MPX vaccine clinics at the locations and times below. Flu vaccine and COVID vaccine/boosters are also available at these clinics. Walk-ins welcome! First and second doses of Jynneos vaccine available to those eligible.

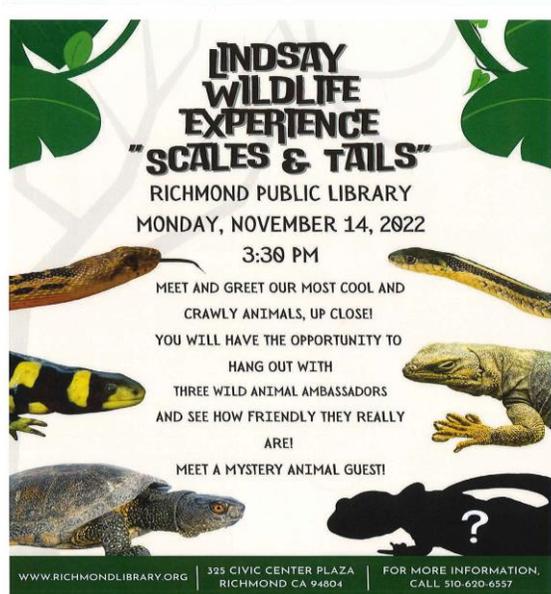

We Want to Hear from You! Join us at a Measure X Town Hall!

Measure X is a voter-approved 20-year tax initiative that will provide funding for many critical services in Contra Costa County, including services for people at-risk of homelessness and experiencing homelessness. On November 16, 2021, the Board of

Supervisors approved and committed a portion of Measure X funds for the creation of the Measure X Housing Fund to support the development of new affordable housing, housing related services (including homeless prevention services), innovation/capacity building activities, and homeless crisis response services.

Contra Costa Health Services (CHSS) and the Contra Costa Department of Conservation and Development (DCD) will be holding a series of 3 joint Town Halls to get input on what housing-related and homelessness-related services should be prioritized in the first year.

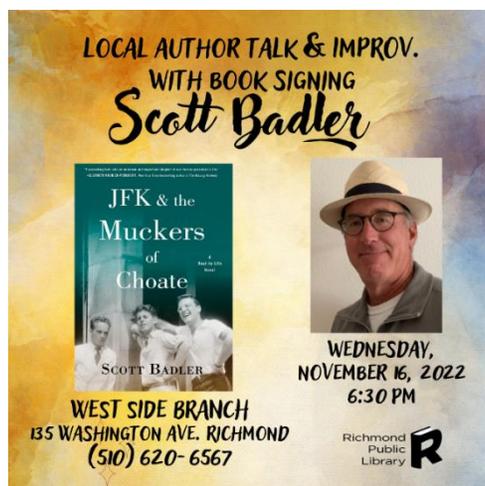

Safe Return Project Workshops Recap

Over the course of three workshops, 30 Richmond residents attended presentations about green jobs and provided feedback. Local community-based organization Safe Return Project organized and hosted the three workshops at their office in downtown Richmond. Insights from justice-involved Richmond residents were shared during the span of the workshops.

The presentations gave an overview of the Green New Deal federal initiative as well as green job projects in renewable energy, building electrification, clean transportation, recycling, food systems, and nature restoration. Attendees voted for their favorite among four Richmond Green-Blue New Deal logo options and expressed interest in particular green jobs projects. The most popular were jobs in building electrification, solar and battery manufacturing, rescuing surplus prepared food, and restoring wildlife populations.

These workshops are part of the community engagement process for the Richmond Green-Blue New Deal Workforce Development Plan project. Want more information? Community Champions Meeting #1 for the Richmond Green-Blue New Deal

On November 1, 2022, 14 people who live or work in Richmond came together to discuss catalyzing green job creation for Richmond residents. Each person brought a unique perspective and helpful input to the workshop.

Representatives of CoBiz, Council of Industries, Food Bank of Contra Costa, and Solano Counties, Life Long Medical, Marin Clean Energy, Rich City Rides, Richmond Listening Project, Richmond Main Street Initiative, Richmond Works, Rising Sun Center for Opportunity, Urban Ore, Urban Tilth, and the Watershed Project as well as a resident who works for the California Public Utilities Commission shared their thoughts.

Attendees explored overlapping interests by green jobs sector (energy, buildings, transportation, circular economy, food, nature, or brownfields) and element (training, policy, funding, and demand). The graphic above shows how much common ground we discovered during the workshop.

Attendees left the meeting feeling energized and looking forward to the next meeting. “I knew this is going to be great, but it even exceeded my expectations” shared Dan Knapp, a resident of Contra Costa County and founder of Urban Ore, a building materials salvage and sales business.

Abatement Division

In collaboration with Republic Services, Abatement crews hosted the Laurel Park Dumpster Day, assisted seniors and disabled citizens, abated weeds and removed trash along Portola Avenue and from Richmond Parkway, abated encampments from sidewalks, removed illegally dumped debris and removed graffiti from various locations throughout the City.

Building Maintenance

Stationary Engineers performed daily pool maintenance and Civic Center Plaza boilers and pump inspections, replaced the spray handle assembly on a kitchen faucet at Fire Station #64, repaired toilet and cleared a sink for the Police Department trailer, and repaired a furnace and added a shutoff valve on an ice maker at Fire Station #62.

Utility Workers assisted the Housing Authority with maintenance and removal of debris from parking lots at the Terraces at Nevin, power washed the entry way of the Employment and Training building, power washed the Transit Center and Recreation, provided assistance to carpenters with demolition of and moving of items in the new director's office, provided minor repairs in various locations and provided cleaning services for 27 City owned buildings daily.

General fund crews abated weeds, picked up trash and mowed lawns at Mira Flores Park, installed mulch at John F. Streets

Pavement maintenance crews worked from the outstanding pothole and hot mix list, surface cleaned drain inlets throughout the city, assembled and delivered sandbags to senior and/or disabled residents. A paving project has been completed on Castro Street from Hensley to Mills Streets in the westbound direction and the striping will be scheduled.

Citizens can fill sandbags at the following locations: Bayview Library on Hartnett Avenue or at the back gate of the Corporation Yard located on Harbour Way next to the Greenway. Senior or disabled citizens can call the Streets division of Public Works at (510) 231-3011 for sandbag delivery requests (limit 10 bags).

Street sweeping crews swept the following neighborhood council areas on the first Monday and second Tuesday through Thursday in: Parchester Village, Hilltop Bayview, Hilltop Green, Fairmede Hilltop, Clinton Hill II – IV and Richmond Heights. Sweeping services are not provided on November 11, 2022, in observance of Veterans Day.

Traffic signs and lines staff fabricated 18 new signs, installed, or repaired 22 signs, installed “stop” messages on Jenkins Way, repaired pavement markings on South 23rd Street at Ohio Avenue, installed street name signs on Cutting Boulevard and Marina Way South as well as multiple locations throughout the city.
