From Contra Costa Health: How to Have a Healthy Holiday Season

We are approaching the winter holidays, which means people will be getting together with family and loved ones. It's a great time to give thanks, get gifts, spread joy – and germs.

Here are some tips for having a healthy holiday season:

- Get tested before an indoor gathering or if you feel sick. Reduce the chances of infecting someone else with COVID by finding out if you have the virus. Make sure to stock up on home test kits.
- Stay up to date on your COVID vaccinations. Upgrade your protection by getting the latest bivalent booster shot, which protects against Omicron variants. Vaccines remain your best defense against hospitalization and death from COVID. Find a COVID vaccine provider near you.
- Get your annual flu shot now. Health officials are expecting a bad flu season. Get protected now before flu season kicks into high gear. Find a flu vaccine provider near you.
- Wear high-quality masks indoors around others. Masking isn't required but wearing a good mask (K95 or N95) is still a good way to protect yourself and others from COVID.
- Stay home if you feel sick. Give gifts and thanks this holiday season, not COVID, flu or a cold.

Richmond Greenway Gap Study BRIDGE WEEK


Bridge Week is a six-day event where anyone can drop by, talk to the project team, preview the final Conceptual Design for the Greenway Bridge over 23rd Street in Richmond, – and provide input.

Over the past 18 months, a team of partners (see below) have worked together with the City of Richmond, key stakeholders, and the wider community to develop a plan to "Close the Gap" on the Greenway over 23rd Street.

The "Cadillac" version of the plan is to build an "iconic" Greenway bridge over 23rd Street that connects the eastern and western sides of the Greenway together. To create the plan to close the gap, we are fortunate to partner with famed bridge

architect Donald Macdonald who created the design for the Bay Bridge. Based on feedback from members of the Richmond community, Donald Macdonald created the Conceptual Design for the bridge.

No person shall be appointed to said Board who holds any salaried public office or employment in the service of the City of Richmond, nor is a retired city employee, nor shall any member, while a member of the board or for a period of one year after he has ceased to be a member of the board, for any reason, be eligible for appointment to any salaried office or employment in the service of the city, or for appointment to any elective office in the City.

Annual Partner Recognition Awards

Richmond Fire Administration would like to congratulate Fire Marshal Eric Govan and the Richmond Fire Department.

On November 29th, 2022, the American Red Cross held the 6th Annual Partner Recognition Awards in Pleasant Hill, CA, honoring community partners, leaders, donors, and volunteers who exemplify the best of the community. Fire Marshal Eric Govan was honored as a Special Recognition. Fire Marshal Govan has been instrumental in working with the Red Cross to bring many services to the City of Richmond. Fire Marshal Govan has led successful programs such as "Prepare with Pedro!" which

teaches first-graders fire safety tips, and the Pillowcase Project, which teaches 4th-grade students Fire Safety.

The Richmond Fire Department was also recognized with the Disaster Cycle Services Partnership Awards for its involvement in the Sound the Alarm program. Fire Marshal Eric Govan, in partnership with the American Red Cross, assisted in providing free smoke alarms to Richmond residents. This campaign reaches out to residents, including older adults, young people, and residents of neighborhoods who are vulnerable to fire deaths.

So far, the Fire Department line crews have installed over 100 smoke detectors in the City of Richmond. This program is usually held yearly, but the Richmond Fire Department is the only city to have adopted this program be held year-round.

“The Richmond Fire Department’s goal is to make an attempt to ensure every resident has a smoke alarm,” says Fire Marshal Eric Govan from the Fire Prevention Division of the Richmond Fire Department, “Our free smoke alarm program includes educating residents to have a home fire escape plan, so residents know what to do if their smoke alarm sounds.”

Abatement Divison
