Contra Costa Health Services, along with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) and other agencies, are monitoring a growing outbreak of Monkeypox (MPX) cases in the United States and California. Your Service Is Needed - Join the City of Richmond Personnel Board

Members of the Board shall have been qualified electors of the City of Richmond for at least three years and shall be persons sympathetic to the principles of modern personnel administration. No person shall be appointed to said Board who holds any salaried public office or employment in the service of the City of Richmond, nor is a retired city employee, nor shall any member, while a member of the board or for a period of one year after he has ceased to be a member of the board, for any reason, be eligible for appointment to any salaried office or employment in the service of the city, or for appointment to any elective office in the City.

Measure X Request for Proposal

The Department of Conservation and Development (DCD) and the Contra Costa Health Services Department, Health, Housing and Homeless Services (H3) Division, otherwise referred to as “the County”, are seeking qualified community-based providers to participate as contractors to serve people experiencing homelessness and people at risk of experiencing homelessness. The funding for this [RFP](#) includes, but is not limited to, Contra Costa County's Measure X Housing Fund.

Measure X is a voter-approved 20-year tax initiative that will provide funding for many critical services in Contra Costa County, including services for people at-risk of homelessness and experiencing homelessness. On November 16, 2021, the Board of Supervisors approved and committed a portion of Measure X funds for the creation of the Measure X Housing Fund to support the development of new affordable housing, homeless prevention services (including tenant legal services and rental assistance services), innovation/capacity building activities, and homeless crisis response services. This RFP is only soliciting responses for homeless prevention services, innovation/capacity building activities, or homeless crises response services.

Responses to this RFP may also be considered for other homeless services funding streams in addition to Measure X Housing Fund funding during the application review process. Details about the various funding streams are included in the RFP.

Holiday Tree Recycling and Disposal Options / Opciones de Reciclaje y Eliminación de Árboles durante los días festivos

The Environmental and Health Initiatives Division encourages residents to consider the several options below for disposing of holiday trees. Information about free “treecycling”, bulky item, and Household Hazardous Waste programs available to Richmond residents can be found by visiting www.richmondenvironment.org.

1. Curbside Collection / Recolección en la Acera:

On any of your regular organic waste collection days, cut your natural, unflocked Christmas tree to fit in your organic waste cart. Trees must be 6 feet or less in diameter and cut into 3-foot lengths. Remove stand and all decorations. Artificial, flocked and ornament-contaminated trees are not compostable. Cut or trim to fit in the brown or black trash cart and set out on any regular trash collection day.

On-call and “for fee” pickups must be scheduled in advance by calling 510.262.7100.

With proof of residency (driver’s license or CA ID), Republic Services customers can take trees to Golden Bear Transfer (#1 Parr Blvd., Richmond, Monday - Friday, 7 a.m. - 5 p.m. and Saturday - Sunday, 9 a.m. - 5 p.m.) through the first weekend in February at

no cost for compostable trees. There is a disposal fee for non-compostable trees or no proof of residency (approximately \$12.15 - subject to change).







Building Maintenance

Stationary Engineers performed daily pool maintenance, daily Civic Center Plaza boilers and pump inspections, replaced the sump pump at the Main Library, repaired the water leak at Riggers Loft, cleared drain at the Family Justice Center, repaired the condensate return line in the basement of the Auditorium, performed maintenance on the freestanding icemaker at the Senior Center and replaced a fan belt to exhaust fan #1 at City Hall.

Crews also assembled and delivered sandbags.

The City of Richmond recommends obtaining estimates from at least three (3) contractors.

Eligibility:

- Parcels served by the City of Richmond Sanitary Municipal Sewer District.
- Sewer lateral replacement must be completed **BEFORE** applying for the Sewer Lateral Grant Program.
- A full line replacement must be completed.
- If you have previously received a Sewer Lateral Grant reimbursement, you will not be eligible to apply.

Required Documents:

- Only Lateral Grant Applications dated 6/30/2022 or newer will be accepted.
- Contractor's final paid in full invoice.
- Proof of payment (copy of canceled check, credit card receipt, or bank statement are accepted).
- Certificate of Lateral Compliance (issued by the City after encroachment permit inspections are approved).
- Grant Deed (change of ownership taken place within last 3 months and/or if property is under a Trust).
- Tax-exempt organizations must submit proof of tax-exempt status.

Award Limits:

- Each fiscal year the City allocates sewer lateral grant funds to be awarded for private sewer lateral replacement.
- This program can be suspended at any time without prior or advanced notification or posting.
- Property owner(s) are eligible for **ONE (1)** sewer lateral grant reimbursement award in a lifetime on a first come, first served basis until all sewer lateral funds are exhausted.
- Starting July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023, the complete sewer lateral grant reimbursement amount is \$1,800 per application.
- Incomplete applications will **NOT** be accepted.
- Applications will be accepted via email and mail at this time. This is subject to change.
- No applications will be accepted after the sewer lateral grant funds are exhausted.
- Reimbursement may take approximately 6 weeks from the date the completed application is received and approved by the City.



Shelter Resources for Unhoused Individuals

The following is a list of local organizations in Contra Costa County that are available for residents experiencing homelessness or residents that are in need of shelter, food, medical, or other resources.

Coordinated Outreach Referral Program (CORE)

The Coordinated Outreach Referral Program (CORE) provides mobile services to unhoused individuals including shelter and coordinated entry referral, survival kits, connection with health, housing, and benefits services. CORE also has a team that serves unhoused youth.

Members of the public can dial 211 to be directed to CORE for assistance for themselves or an unhoused resident in Contra Costa County. There is a CORE Team that is assigned to the Richmond/San Pablo area during the weekdays. The West County CORE team provides support to Richmond after hours and on weekends.


Update on Thoughtful Transitions for Unhoused Encampments

Castro Encampment

Last week, Castro Encampment Project Manager Vanessa Calloway, along with Coordinated Outreach Referral and Engagement (CORE), and Housing Consortium of the East Bay (HCEB) were able to distribute a number of tarps and care packages provided by the city to residents at Castro Encampment. On Thursday January 19th, the reconfiguration and realignment of the Castro Encampment started by relocating a couple of trailers into the open area formerly occupied by three burnt RV's. The Public Works Department staff, SOS!, and the BNSF railroad company were able to remove debris to relocate a couple of trailers into this area. In addition, HCEB will be placing an office trailer on site to assist residents with their plans to transition from the encampment to alternative housing options.

Housing First Program

The Housing First Program contract, approved by the City Council on December 20, 2022, has been fully executed and Richmond Community Foundation (RCF Connects), was selected to administer and develop the program. The Housing First Program has two parts; first, to provide support to via emergency short term rental assistance for those in need of immediate housing. Secondly, the Housing First Program will provide as longer term rental assistance to homeless or near homeless residents with priority to former Rydin Road residents. RCF Connects, in collaboration with local partners, is in the process of hiring care managers that will be the primary point of contact for the Housing First Program.
