

Contra Costa Health Services, along with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) and other agencies, are monitoring a growing outbreak of Monkeypox (MPX) cases in the United States and California. While it is good to stay alert about any emerging public health outbreaks, the current risk of getting MPX in the public is very low, outside of certain activities that increase the chance of exposure.




Save the Date: Senior Information & Health Faire

3rd of July Fireworks



Feedback Needed! PG&E's Wildfire Mitigation Plan (WMP)

The City Manager's Office, Economic Development Department encourages residents to submit comments and feedback on PG&E's Wildfire Mitigation Plan (WMP) filed on March 27, 2023, with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC). This is the opportunity for community members to communicate priority areas in Richmond that need to be addressed in the WMP.

In compliance with California SB 901, AB 1054, and guidelines from the Office of Energy Infrastructure Safety (Energy Safety), the 2023-2025 WMP addresses PG&E's wildfire safety programs and initiatives focused on reducing the potential for catastrophic wildfires related to electrical equipment, reducing the potential for fires to spread, and containing the customer impact of EPSS/PSPS events.

Prestigious Preservation Award for Richmond

This past Thursday, April 20, 2023, , Rooted in Richmond App was recognized at the 2023 [California Preservation Awards](#) as the winner for the 2023 Preservation Design Award for Cultural Heritage, Intangible Assets.

About “Rooted in Richmond”

The Rooted in Richmond App is a collection of 16 historic sites – tangible and intangible – located along the Richmond Greenway. This multimedia walking and biking tour (made possible by a Certified Local Government Grant and a volunteer project management team) allows visitors to hear from Richmond residents, historians, and notable civic leaders. The Android and Apple-based app is also accessible on the web for people to learn about the diverse sites associated with Richmond in the 20th century. The tour also includes a narrated Spanish version.

The tour features exclusive audio interviews, 3D models of Richmond’s historical artifacts, and dozens of vivid historical images. Stops automatically trigger as you pass by, including Pre-WWII Japanese rose nurseries; the Pullman Palace Car factory; Social Justice and Civil Rights in Richmond; a WPA-era mural rediscovered in a post office basement; Ohlone shell mounds; and much more.

The tour is six miles in length and can be completed all at once, or in three equal segments of two miles each.





Sewer Lateral Grant Program Application Guidelines

Application and copies of the required documents listed below must be submitted to:

The City of Richmond recommends obtaining estimates from at least three (3) contractors.

Eligibility:

- ◆ Parcels served by the City of Richmond Sanitary Municipal Sewer District.
- ◆ Sewer lateral replacement must be completed **BEFORE** applying for the Sewer Lateral Grant Program.
- ◆ A full line replacement must be completed.
- ◆ If you have previously received a Sewer Lateral Grant reimbursement, you will not be eligible to apply.

Required Documents:

- ◆ Only Lateral Grant Applications dated 6/30/2022 or newer will be accepted.
- ◆ Contractor's final paid in full invoice.
- ◆ Proof of payment (copy of canceled check, credit card receipt, or bank statement are accepted).
- ◆ Certificate of Lateral Compliance (issued by the City after encroachment permit inspections are approved).
- ◆ Grant Deed (change of ownership taken place within last 3 months and/or if property is under a Trust).
- ◆ Tax-exempt organizations must submit proof of tax-exempt status.

Award Limits:

- Each fiscal year the City allocates sewer lateral grant funds to be awarded for private sewer lateral replacement.
- This program can be suspended at any time without prior or advanced notification or posting.
- Property owner(s) are eligible for **ONE (1)** sewer lateral grant reimbursement award in a lifetime on a first come, first served basis until all sewer lateral funds are exhausted.
- Starting July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023, the complete sewer lateral grant reimbursement amount is \$1,800 per application.
- Incomplete applications will **NOT** be accepted.
- Applications will be accepted via email and mail at this time. This is subject to change.
- No applications will be accepted after the sewer lateral grant funds are exhausted.
- Reimbursement may take approximately 6 weeks from the date the completed application is received and approved by the City.

High Priority Critical Improvements Projects
Location: Wastewater Treatment Plant – 601 Canal Blvd.

Update: During the last two weeks, Shimmick drained basin 1 to clean and work on that basin. They started to set up pipe supports and installed the 30” air piping segments to work towards completing the installation from the blower building into the 3 aeration basins. At the Fine Screening/Pista Grit area, Shimmick’s carpenters continued stripping the edge and blockout forms while their ironworkers continued installing hand railing and tread plates. Shimmick also completed the installation of the forms and rebar and poured the concrete stair landing pads.

2022-23 Grade 5 RAA Line Replacement

Location: Multiple locations to be provided at a later date

Update: Eleven prospective contractors attended the mandatory pre-bid meeting on October 26, 2022. On November 30, 2022, four bids ranging from \$1,319,500 to \$2,543,000 were received; all bids were within the engineer's estimate and budget allotted for this project. D'Arcy & Harty submitted the lowest bid. Richmond City Council approved this project during the March 21, 2023, regular Council Meeting. The Preconstruction Conference was held Wednesday April 5, 2023. Construction Activity will commence in late April 2023 and be complete by November 2023. The first two sewer main pipeline segments scheduled for replacement (from manhole to manhole) are in the vicinity of 2323 Maricopa and 634 4th Street.

Ferry Point Sewer Pump Station Replacement Project

Location: Dornan Drive and Brickyard Cove Road

Update: Thompson Builders Corporation mobilized to the site in January 2023. After temporary traffic control was established, the Contractor excavated and set three precast concrete vaults. The Contractor has verified connections for the incoming gravity sewer lines and outgoing sewer force main. Crews have installed valves, piping and supports for the three new submersible Flygt pumps in the precast wet well vault. Underground utility line installation is ongoing. Selective demolition of the south end of the building is being performed in preparation for installation of the new influent manhole. Overall project completion is anticipated in the fourth Quarter 2023.

Marina Bay Parkway Force Main Extension Project

Location: Intersection at Pierson Ave and Marina Bay Parkway

Update: The project work was initially completed in December 2021. The Contractor returned in March 2022 to install a bolt down manhole frame and cover on the new manhole at the termination of the Force Main. The material for the manhole frame and cover was a long-lead item. Additional scope to alleviate ongoing sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs) by adding 991 LF of 8" gravity sewer main and three (3) new manholes with bolt down covers along 27th Street is slated to be on the City Council agenda in the near future.

Sodium Bisulfite (SBS) Facility Improvements Project

Location: Wastewater Treatment Plant – 601 Canal Blvd.

Update: Phase I is complete; the new SBS Facility is now in operation. Phase II began this period, and Myers & Sons has remobilized to the site. Phase II consists of the generator installation, as well as the replacement of the mixing system at the Chlorine Contact Basins and the updated instrumentation work at West County's metering vault.



Myers & Sons started working on West County's metering vault. They are excavating for the new sidewalk and some electrical conduit installation.



Myers & Sons is working on the structural modifications for the installation of the new chemical induction mixer at the chlorine contact basins.



Myers & Sons is working on the installation of the initial and final sample pumps at the disinfection room.

Trash Capture Project, Bayview (currently in design)

Update: Design has reached 80% completion. The “End of the Pipe” location at the Bayview outfall has been determined to be the most feasible location for the new double chambered CDS units. Geotechnical drilling investigation (Miller Pacific); additional soil sampling (Questa) and Environmental field studies were completed in August 2022. Multiple coordination meetings with CalTrans ROW Program Managers and Regional Maintenance Managers have been conducted to address easement, encroachment and Right-Of-Way exceptions and permit coordination.

The CalTrans encroachment permit application and additional project information package requested by CalTrans has been submitted. CalTrans assigned a project manager who met with FHWA on 3/23/23 to review desired fence and gate alignment in the project area. The team met with the CalTrans project manager on April 6th to determine the next steps. Review of environmental permit applications is ongoing. The order for the Contech CDS Units has been released. A meeting is scheduled in the field on Tuesday April 18, 2023, to address notification and relocation of unhoused residents in the project vicinity. The next Design Meeting will be April 25, 2023.
