Contra Costa Health Services, along with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) and other agencies, are monitoring a growing outbreak of Monkeypox (MPX) cases in the United States and California. 

3rd of July Fireworks



Richmond-Shimada Friendship Commission hosts students from Shimada, Japan

The Richmond Shimada Friendship Commission and the City of Richmond were pleased to host a delegation of eight junior and senior high school students from Shimada, Japan from March 20th to March 28th, 2023. Each member of the delegation was hosted by a local family. During the week-long exchange, the Commission coordinated a variety of activities in Richmond and surrounding cities, including tours of local schools Washington Elementary School, El Cerrito High School, Contra Costa Community College, and more. Additionally, ambassadors visited local community centers and groups such as the NIAD Art Center, Richmond Rotary Club, and Richmond Fire Department, among others. Students also demonstrated cultural activities throughout their visits such as karate, calligraphy, and origami. This is the first people to people exchange in Richmond since the start of the pandemic. These exchanges highlight the strong friendship and sister city relationship between Richmond and Shimada, which began in 1961.

6. **City Manager's Office**

Feedback Needed! PG&E's Wildfire Mitigation Plan (WMP)

The City Manager's Office, Economic Development Department encourages residents to submit comments and feedback on PG&E's Wildfire Mitigation Plan (WMP) filed on March 27, 2023, with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC). This is the opportunity for community members to communicate priority areas in Richmond that need to be addressed in the WMP.

In compliance with California SB 901, AB 1054, and guidelines from the Office of Energy Infrastructure Safety (Energy Safety), the 2023-2025 WMP addresses PG&E's wildfire safety programs and initiatives focused on reducing the potential for catastrophic wildfires related to electrical equipment, reducing the potential for fires to spread, and containing the customer impact of EPSS/PSPS events.

- Public comments are due to the Office of Energy Infrastructure Safety by **May 26, 2023**:

- Following the public comment period, PG&E will then submit a consolidated reply by June 5, 2023.
- A draft decision on the WMP is expected to be issued in July 2023.

7. **Community Development**

Building Division

The Building Division is one of the four divisions within the Community Development Department. The Building Division is the lead in ensuring construction conforms to the California Building Standards Code, as adopted by the City. This includes reviewing construction plans prior to issuance of a building permit and conducting required inspections on construction projects after the building permit has been issued to ensure compliance with the code and the approved plans. Building Division staff also investigate habitability complaints and other building code violations, including work without permits. The primary focus of this division is protecting public health and safety.

Below is a summary of the Building Division's Activities for the month of March 2023:

- 425 Plan Checks Completed
- 355 Permits Issued
- 799 Inspections Completed
- 46 Building Code Enforcement cases opened and followed up on.
- 22 Building Code Enforcement cases closed.

3. Before you wash dishes, scrape food scraps, fats, oils and grease into your garbage can.

The City of Richmond's Water Resource Recovery Division administers the Sewer Lateral Grant Program. The program reimburses eligible homeowners in the Richmond Municipal Sewer District (RMSD No. 1) for some of the cost to replace their sewer lateral.

The program will reimburse applicants up to \$1,800 of the cost of a full sewer line replacement.

The program is open and accepting applications for the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 for sewer lateral work completed between 7/1/2022-6/30/2023.

The City of Richmond recommends obtaining estimates from at least three (3) contractors.

Eligibility:

- ↳ Parcels served by the City of Richmond Sanitary Municipal Sewer District.
- ↳ Sewer lateral replacement must be completed **BEFORE** applying for the Sewer Lateral Grant Program.
- ↳ A full line replacement must be completed.
- ↳ If you have previously received a Sewer Lateral Grant reimbursement, you will not be eligible to apply.

Required Documents:

- ↳ Only Lateral Grant Applications dated 6/30/2022 or newer will be accepted.
- ↳ Contractor's final paid in full invoice.
- ↳ Proof of payment (copy of canceled check, credit card receipt, or bank statement are accepted).
- ↳ Certificate of Lateral Compliance (issued by the City after encroachment permit inspections are approved).
- ↳ Grant Deed (change of ownership taken place within last 3 months and/or if property is under a Trust).
- ↳ Tax-exempt organizations must submit proof of tax-exempt status.

Award Limits:

- ↳ Each fiscal year the City allocates sewer lateral grant funds to be awarded for private sewer lateral replacement.
- ↳ This program can be suspended at any time without prior or advanced notification or posting.
- ↳ Property owner(s) are eligible for **ONE (1)** sewer lateral grant reimbursement award in a lifetime on a first come, first served basis until all sewer lateral funds are exhausted.
- ↳ Starting July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023, the complete sewer lateral grant reimbursement amount is \$1,800 per application.
- ↳ Incomplete applications will **NOT** be accepted.
- ↳ Applications will be accepted via email and mail at this time. This is subject to change.
- ↳ No applications will be accepted after the sewer lateral grant funds are exhausted.
- ↳ Reimbursement may take approximately 6 weeks from the date the completed application is received and approved by the City.
