3rd of July Fireworks



Feedback Needed! PG&E's Wildfire Mitigation Plan (WMP)

The City Manager's Office, Economic Development Department encourages residents to submit comments and feedback on PG&E's Wildfire Mitigation Plan (WMP) filed on March 27, 2023, with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC). This is the opportunity for community members to communicate priority areas in Richmond that need to be addressed in the WMP.

In compliance with California SB 901, AB 1054, and guidelines from the Office of Energy Infrastructure Safety (Energy Safety), the 2023-2025 WMP addresses PG&E's wildfire safety programs and initiatives focused on reducing the potential for catastrophic wildfires related to electrical equipment, reducing the potential for fires to spread, and containing the customer impact of EPSS/PSPS events.

- PG&E's 2023-2025 WMP filing is located at pge.com/wildfiremitigationplan.

- Public comments are due to the Office of Energy Infrastructure Safety by **May 26, 2023**:
 - Comments from the public can be submitted directly to the Office of Energy Infrastructure Safety on their website at: <https://efiling.energysafety.ca.gov/EFiling/DocketInformation.aspx?docketnumber=2023-2025-WMPs>.
- Following the public comment period, PG&E will then submit a consolidated reply by June 5, 2023.
- A draft decision on the WMP is expected to be issued in July 2023.


Nystrom Village Earth Day Event

By following a few simple steps, you can help prevent sewer backups and spills:

1. Pour cooled fats, oils and grease into a covered, disposable container and throw it into your garbage can. Never pour fats, oils or grease down sink drains or toilets. **COOL IT, CAN IT, TRASH IT.**
2. Soak up remaining oils and grease with an absorbent material such as paper towels, and throw it into your garbage can.
3. Before you wash dishes, scrape food scraps, fats, oils and grease into your garbage can.
4. Use sink strainers to catch any remaining food waste while washing dishes.

Sewer Lateral Grant Program Application Guidelines

The City of Richmond recommends obtaining estimates from at least three (3) contractors.

Eligibility:

- ❖ Parcels served by the City of Richmond Sanitary Municipal Sewer District.
- ❖ Sewer lateral replacement must be completed **BEFORE** applying for the Sewer Lateral Grant Program.
- ❖ A full line replacement must be completed.
- ❖ If you have previously received a Sewer Lateral Grant reimbursement, you will not be eligible to apply.

Required Documents:

- ❖ Only Lateral Grant Applications dated 6/30/2022 or newer will be accepted.
- ❖ Contractor's final paid in full invoice.
- ❖ Proof of payment (copy of canceled check, credit card receipt, or bank statement are accepted).
- ❖ Certificate of Lateral Compliance (issued by the City after encroachment permit inspections are approved).
- ❖ Grant Deed (change of ownership taken place within last 3 months and/or if property is under a Trust).
- ❖ Tax-exempt organizations must submit proof of tax-exempt status.

Award Limits:

- Each fiscal year the City allocates sewer lateral grant funds to be awarded for private sewer lateral replacement.
- This program can be suspended at any time without prior or advanced notification or posting.
- Property owner(s) are eligible for **ONE (1)** sewer lateral grant reimbursement award in a lifetime on a first come, first served basis until all sewer lateral funds are exhausted.
- Starting July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023, the complete sewer lateral grant reimbursement amount is \$1,800 per application.
- Incomplete applications will **NOT** be accepted.
- Applications will be accepted via email and mail at this time. This is subject to change.
- No applications will be accepted after the sewer lateral grant funds are exhausted.
- Reimbursement may take approximately 6 weeks from the date the completed application is received and approved by the City.

High Priority Critical Improvements Projects

Location: Wastewater Treatment Plant – 601 Canal Blvd.


Update: During the last two weeks, Shimmick completed the installation of the 30" air piping. They also completed installation of the diffuser system in Aeration Basin 3 and started commissioning activities. This achievement represents a milestone in the project's advancement. At the Fine Screening/Pista Grit area, Shimmick took delivery of the fine screens (see photos below, p. 13) and continued installation of the slide gates. At the Biofilter, Shimmick installed the new fence at the top of the walls and started working on the membrane liner.




An aerial view of the City of Richmond's Wastewater Treatment Plant currently during construction.



Aeration Basins: Shimmick completed the installation of the 30" air piping that will distribute the oxygen from the blower building to the aeration basins.



Aeration Basin 3: Veolia, Shimmick and Xylem are witnessing the diffuser system dispersion testing, making sure that all membranes are performing as expected. Of the approximately 1,500 membranes installed only three needed replacing.



Aeration Basin 3: With water at a normal operating level, Calcon (I&C sub) and APG-Neuros (blowers manufacturer) are individually and collectively doing performance testing of the equipment to ensure that everything is communicating as it should.



Blower System: Veolia O&M is attending the classroom training by APG-Neuros (above) and the practical “all hands” session at the blower room (below). Operators, maintenance technicians and managers received training; the sessions were recorded, and there will be refresher training once each basin comes online.



Blower Building: Shimmick is installing the insulation on the air piping.



Fine Screening/Pista Grit: Shimmick continues installing “I” beams and tread plates (above), and they are also removing shoring and stripping edge forms (below).



Fine Screening: Shimmick is installing the slide gates (above) and taking delivery of the fine screens (below). This fully automatic fine screening equipment will be installed in the new channels downstream of the influent pump station and will help to remove the solids, as part of the treatment process.



Biofilter (odor control): Shimmick is installing the stainless steel angles for the membrane liner.

2022-23 Grade 5 RAA Line Replacement

Location: Multiple locations to be provided at a later date

Update: Eleven prospective contractors attended the mandatory pre-bid meeting on October 26, 2022. On November 30, 2022, four bids ranging from \$1,319,500 to \$2,543,000 were received; all bids were within the engineer's estimate and budget allotted for this project. D'Arcy & Harty submitted the lowest bid. Richmond City Council approved this project during the March 21, 2023 regular Council Meeting. The Preconstruction Conference was held April 5, 2023. Construction activity will commence in early May 2023 and expected to be completed by November 2023. The first two sewer main pipeline segments scheduled for replacement (from manhole to manhole) are in the vicinity of 2323 Maricopa and 634 4th Street.

Ferry Point Sewer Pump Station Replacement Project
Location: Dornan Drive and Brickyard Cove Road

Update: Thompson Builders Corporation mobilized to the site in January 2023. After temporary traffic control was established, the Contractor excavated and set three precast concrete vaults. The Contractor has verified connections for the incoming gravity sewer lines and outgoing sewer force main. Crews have installed valves, piping and supports for the three new submersible Flygt pumps in the precast wet well vault. Underground utility line installation is ongoing. Selective demolition of the south end of the building was performed to prepare for installation of the new influent manhole. Overall project completion is anticipated in the fourth quarter 2023.



Thompson Builders crew carefully dug the pit for the new influent sewer manhole. This is located where the south half of the building used to be.



This large trench shoring box will be placed in the manhole excavation pit to protect workers from cave-ins while they construct the new influent manhole.



In the foreground, the three new concrete precast vaults containing pumps and instrumentation are ready for connection to incoming and outgoing sewer mains.

Marina Bay Parkway Force Main Extension Project

Location: Intersection at Pierson Ave and Marina Bay Parkway

Update: The project work was initially completed in December 2021. The Contractor returned in March 2022 to install a bolt down manhole frame and cover on the new manhole at the termination of the Force Main. The material for the manhole frame and cover was a long-lead item. Additional scope to alleviate ongoing sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs) by adding 991 LF of 8" gravity sewer main and three new manholes with bolt down covers along 27th Street is slated to be on the City Council agenda in the near future.

Sodium Bisulfite (SBS) Facility Improvements Project

Location: Wastewater Treatment Plant – 601 Canal Blvd.


Update: Phase I is complete; the new SBS Facility is now in operation. Phase II continued this period. Myers & Sons installed the sample pump and chlorine analyzer in West County's metering vault, including electrical, mechanical and instrumentation elements. They also completed the bypass around the flowmeter at the SBS pump room, and they poured the new concrete sidewalk around the vault.



West County's metering vault: Myers & Sons is pouring concrete for the new sidewalk around the flowmeter's vault.



West County's metering vault: Myers is installing a new sample pump and chlorine analyzer.



West County's metering vault: Myers is working on the suction line of the new sample pump.



SBS pump room: Myers completed the installation of the bypass piping around the flowmeter.

Trash Capture Project, Bayview (currently in design)

Update: Design has reached 100% completion. The “End of the Pipe” location at the Bayview outfall has been determined to be the most feasible location for the new double chambered CDS units. Geotechnical drilling investigation (Miller Pacific); additional soil sampling (Questa) and Environmental field studies were completed in August 2022. Multiple coordination meetings with CalTrans ROW Program Managers and Regional Maintenance Managers have been conducted to address easement, encroachment and Right-Of-Way exceptions and permit coordination.

The CalTrans encroachment permit application and additional project information package requested by CalTrans were submitted. CalTrans assigned a project manager who met with FHWA on 3/23/23 to review desired fence and gate alignment in the project area. The team met with the CalTrans project manager on April 6th to determine next steps. Review of environmental permit applications is ongoing. The order for the Contech CDS units has been released. Notification and relocation of unhoused residents in the project vicinity is scheduled for May 15, 2023. The next Design meeting will be May 9, 2023.
