The public has an opportunity to comment on a third-party consultant report on of the Root Cause Analysis of the Chevron Richmond Refinery’s 2021 Wharf Oil Spill. The 45-day comment period is opening on July 13, 2023, and will close on August 28, 2023. **A public meeting will be held at the Richmond Convention Center Bermuda Room at 403 Civic Center Plaza on July 17, 2023, from 6:30 PM to 8:30 PM. At this meeting, Contra Costa Health’s Hazardous Materials Programs will discuss the findings from the evaluation and receive comments about the report. A copy of the report can be found at the following link:

On February 9, 2021, the Chevron Richmond Refinery released approximately 18.4 barrels of hydrocarbons to the Bay. The County working with an Oversight Committee, hired AcuTech to perform an evaluation of the Incident Investigation performed by the refinery. The Oversight Committee included members of the community, the City of Richmond, United Steel Workers, and Contra Costa Health Hazardous Materials Program. The evaluation by AcuTech includes a review of the findings and recommendations from the Incident Investigation and Root Cause Analysis as well as a review of the implementation of these actions by Chevron.

PG&E Low Income Program – Save with PG&E’s CARE Program

The City Manager’s Office, Economic Development, Environmental and Health Initiatives Division encourages Richmond residents to reduce their energy bill through PG&E’s low-income assistance programs. CARE and FERA are PG&E discount programs that help eligible customers pay their energy bills. **Over 1.4 million customers are receiving a bill discount through these two programs.** Simply complete the online CARE/FERA enrollment form and PG&E will let you know if you're eligible.

- **California Alternate Rates for Energy Program (CARE).** A monthly discount of 20% or more on gas and electricity. Participants qualify through income guidelines or if enrolled in certain public assistance programs.
- **Family Electric Rate Assistance Program (FERA).** A monthly discount of 18% on electricity only. Must be a household with three or more people. Participants qualify through income guidelines.

To qualify for CARE:

- The PG&E bill must be in your name. (For sub-metered tenants, the energy bill from your landlord must be in your name.)
- You must live at the address to which the discount applies.
- Another person (besides your spouse) can't claim you as a dependent on an income tax return.
- You must not share an energy meter with another home.
- You must account for all sources of qualifying household income and meet the program income guidelines.
- You must notify PG&E if your household no longer qualifies for the CARE discount.
- After you enroll, you may need to provide proof of qualifying household income. You may also be required to participate in the Energy Savings Assistance Program.
- Your monthly electric usage must not exceed six times the Tier 1 allowance. This is the lowest-priced rate tier within PG&E’s standard Tiered Base Plan.
- You must renew your eligibility every two years (or every four years if you’re on a fixed income).
- Qualification is based on the total income of everyone living in the home or participation in qualifying public assistance programs.



Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP).

A recent update to the federal Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) provides financial assistance to low-income Californians to help manage their residential water utility costs. Established by Congress in December 2020, this federally funded program helps low-income households pay down their outstanding residential water or wastewater bills. California has been allocated \$116 million in one-time funding to provide LIHWAP assistance.

The Department of Community Services and Development (CSD) is the designated administering agency for LIHWAP in California. Through LIHWAP, CSD works with a network of community-based local service providers to help low-income households pay down their outstanding residential water and wastewater



utility bills.

For more information about how LIHWAP can help your household pay down your past due water or wastewater bills and how to apply visit LIHWAP Find Assistance.

If you qualify for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) you may also qualify for up to **\$15,000** in assistance to pay your overdue water and wastewater bill under the Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP). To be eligible:

- Your water and/or wastewater provider (such as EBMUD and ACWD) must be a LIHWAP participant.



10. **Rent Program**

Rent Board Adopts 2023 Annual General Adjustment in the Amount of 3.0% (Effective 09/01/2023)

At their meeting on June 26, 2023, the Rent Board adopted [Regulation 612](#), establishing the 2023 Annual General Adjustment (AGA) rent increase for Controlled Rental Units in the amount of 3.0%. Rent increases for the 2023 Annual General Adjustment may not take effect prior to September 1, 2023.

The 2023 AGA may only be applied to tenancies in effect prior to September 1, 2022. In addition, to apply the 2023 Annual General Adjustment rent increase of up to 3.0%, Landlords must comply with State law requirements and file a notice of rent increase with the Rent Board within ten (10) business days after service on the Tenant, in accordance with the [Rent Increase Procedure](#) on the Rent Program website (www.richmondrent.org).

What's the Annual General Adjustment?

The Annual General Adjustment (AGA) is an annual rent increase for Controlled Rental Units permitted by the Richmond Fair Rent, Just Cause for Eviction, and Homeowner Protection Ordinance. The Annual General Adjustment equals 3% or 60% of the Consumer Price Index (inflation rate) of the Bar Area (San Francisco, Oakland, and San Jose), whichever is less.
