


Richmond Police Department (RPD) Connect: Saturday, July 22nd





EPA Announces Launch of \$20 Billion in Grant Competitions to Advance Clean Technology Projects in Communities | Public Information Webinars Available

On July 14th, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announced the launch of two Notices of Funding Opportunity (NOFOs) for **\$20 billion across two grant competitions** under the historic \$27 billion Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund, an Inflation Reduction Act program central to President Biden’s Investing in America Agenda and environmental justice goals. **The EPA is seeking applications to two Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund competitions to advance clean technology projects in communities across the country.** Please find [EPA’s press release on the announcement here](#) and the [White House’s fact sheet on the announcement here](#). The **\$14 billion National Clean Investment Fund** will provide grants to support two to three national clean financing institutions, enabling them to partner with the private sector to provide accessible, affordable financing for tens of thousands of clean technology projects nationwide. The **\$6 billion Clean Communities Investment Accelerator** will provide grants to support up to seven hub nonprofit organizations, enabling them to provide funding and technical assistance to public, quasi-public, not-for-profit, and non-profit community lenders working in communities with environmental justice concerns—supporting the goal that every community in the country has access to the resources they need to fund clean technology projects. PG&E Low Income Program – Save with PG&E’s CARE Program

The City Manager’s Office, Economic Development, Environmental and Health Initiatives Division encourages Richmond residents to reduce their energy bill through PG&E’s low-income assistance programs. CARE and FERA are PG&E discount programs that help eligible customers pay their energy bills. **Over 1.4 million customers are receiving a bill discount through these two programs.** Simply complete the online CARE/FERA enrollment form and PG&E will let you know if you're eligible.

- **California Alternate Rates for Energy Program (CARE).** A monthly discount of 20% or more on gas and electricity. Participants qualify through income guidelines or if enrolled in certain public assistance programs.
- **Family Electric Rate Assistance Program (FERA).** A monthly discount of 18% on electricity only. Must be a household with three or more people. Participants qualify through income guidelines.

To qualify for CARE:

- The PG&E bill must be in your name. (For sub-metered tenants, the energy bill from your landlord must be in your name.)
- You must live at the address to which the discount applies.
- Another person (besides your spouse) can't claim you as a dependent on an income tax return.
- You must not share an energy meter with another home.
- You must account for all sources of qualifying household income and meet the program income guidelines.
- You must notify PG&E if your household no longer qualifies for the CARE discount.
- After you enroll, you may need to provide proof of qualifying household income. You may also be required to participate in the Energy Savings Assistance Program.
- Your monthly electric usage must not exceed six times the Tier 1 allowance. This is the lowest-priced rate tier within PG&E’s standard Tiered Base Plan.
- You must renew your eligibility every two years (or every four years if you’re on a fixed income).
- Qualification is based on the total income of everyone living in the home or participation in qualifying public assistance programs.

9. **Public Works**

Abatement

In collaboration with Republic Services and Sims Metal, Abatement crews hosted the Richmond Annex Dumpster Day. They collected four dumpsters of debris and assisted 32 seniors and disabled citizens from the neighborhood, abated weeds from City alleyways and public right of ways, abated illegally dumped debris and removed graffiti from various locations throughout the City.

Building Maintenance

Stationary Engineers performed daily pool inspections and maintenance, performed daily inspections of the boilers, circulating pumps and sump pumps at the Civic Center Plaza; repaired the front entry door handle at 450 City Hall, replaced contactors, replaced fuses and contactors to the electric water heater located in the Auditorium basement, repaired a toilet at the Parks Yard, repaired two (2) ovens at Fire Station 68 by replacing both thermocouples, repaired a faucet at the Plunge by replacing the actuator metering valve, repaired a toilet in the women's restroom at the Recreation Complex by installing a complete flushometer kit.

Electric shop staff replaced streetlight pole covers along Barrett, Nevin, 24th and 25th streets. The crew repaired dimmer switches in the senior center and replaced lighting covers at the day care facility at the Recreation Center. Lighting in the hall of the Recreation Center was also upgraded from fluorescent to LED. This provides much brighter lighting.



10. **Rent Program**

Rent Board Adopts 2023 Annual General Adjustment in the Amount of 3.0% (Effective 09/01/2023)

At their meeting on June 26, 2023, the Rent Board adopted [Regulation 612](#), establishing the 2023 Annual General Adjustment (AGA) rent increase for Controlled Rental Units in the amount of 3.0%. Rent increases for the 2023 Annual General Adjustment may not take effect prior to September 1, 2023.

The 2023 AGA may only be applied to tenancies in effect prior to September 1, 2022. In addition, to apply the 2023 Annual General Adjustment rent increase of up to 3.0%, Landlords must comply with State law requirements and file a notice of rent increase with the Rent Board within ten (10) business days after service on the Tenant, in accordance with the [Rent Increase Procedure](#) on the Rent Program website (www.richmondrent.org).

What's the Annual General Adjustment?

The Annual General Adjustment (AGA) is an annual rent increase for Controlled Rental Units permitted by the Richmond Fair Rent, Just Cause for Eviction, and Homeowner Protection Ordinance. The Annual General Adjustment equals 3% or 60% of the Consumer Price Index (inflation rate) of the Bar Area (San Francisco, Oakland, and San Jose), whichever is less.
