

#### ELIGIBILITY

- Must live in Richmond, California.
- Must care about ending violence against women and girls.
- Any person of any age may submit one (1) piece of original art (hand drawn or digitally created).
- Everyone is welcome to apply, including artists, but you do not need to be a professional artist to apply! Your artwork will be finalized by a professional graphic designer (with you listed and receiving credit as the original and main artist).

#### AWARDS

- One (1) Grand Prize Winner will receive \$700.
- Three (3) Finalists will receive \$100 each.
- Awards will be determined by a panel including a representative from The Latina Center, a City of Richmond Councilmember, Community Leaders/Survivors that are part of the Ya Basta y Sin Miedo Campaign, Youth, and Local Leaders of the Arts in Richmond.
- Criteria for evaluation will include: overall impact, incorporation of message, composition, originality, artistic merit, and creativity.
- All winners will be announced the week of September 25th and awarded at the **¡Ya Basta! y Sin Miedo Benefit Concert** at Richmond Civic Center on September 30th.


## 2023 Richmond Community Survey

Every two years since 2007, the City of Richmond conducts a community survey to help evaluate services, measure resident satisfaction with current services, and to help plan for Richmond's future.



### **Building Maintenance**



## **Engineering**



## 10. Rent Program

### **Rent Board Adopts 2023 Annual General Adjustment in the Amount of 3.0% (Effective 09/01/2023)**

At their meeting on June 26, 2023, the Rent Board adopted [Regulation 612](#), establishing the 2023 Annual General Adjustment (AGA) rent increase for Controlled Rental Units in the amount of 3.0%. Rent increases for the 2023 Annual General Adjustment may not take effect prior to September 1, 2023.

The 2023 AGA may only be applied to tenancies in effect prior to September 1, 2022. In addition, to apply the 2023 Annual General Adjustment rent increase of up to 3.0%, Landlords must comply with State law requirements and file a notice of rent increase with the Rent Board within ten (10) business days after service on the Tenant, in accordance with the [Rent Increase Procedure](#) on the Rent Program website ([www.richmondrent.org](http://www.richmondrent.org)).

#### **What's the Annual General Adjustment?**

The Annual General Adjustment (AGA) is an annual rent increase for Controlled Rental Units permitted by the Richmond Fair Rent, Just Cause for Eviction, and Homeowner Protection Ordinance. The Annual General Adjustment equals 3% or 60% of the Consumer Price Index (inflation rate) of the Bar Area (San Francisco, Oakland, and San Jose), whichever is less.
