**Mothers Against Toxic Housing Community Event**

On August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2023, Councilmember McLaughlin attended the Mothers Against Toxic Housing neighborhood event to inform the residents about the toxins on our shoreline near Crescent Park, which included the discussion of the toxic Zeneca site, a superfund-qualified site. The event was coordinated by Ms. Lana Bold and supported by the City of Richmond City Council, Library and Recreation Divisions.

In addition to conveying lots of important information on being good stewards to nature, the event was loads of fun, especially for the kids! We gave out 52 goodie bags to children filled with hand sanitizers, coloring books, crayons, notebooks, stickers, toothbrushes, pens, crayons, and art kits. We would like to send a special thank you to Susan White with the Richmond library for providing the art kits. The Richmond Shoreline Alliance also did an amazing job on informing the neighborhood and contributing to this event. ### **Mountain Lion Sighting at La Moine (Cheese) Park**

City officials have placed warning signs along the walkways into the park of the recent sighting. The City of Richmond encourages residents to take the following precautionary steps if they encounter the animal:

- Remain alert
- Do not approach it
- Make loud noises
- Pick up children
- Leash dogs
- Do not run

**For a limited time - get a \$1,000 Efficiency Mini-Grant to help with sustainability upgrades at your business**

Are you a Certified-Level Green Business or interested in getting certified? Do you have equipment upgrades or improvements to make at your business that will help you operate more sustainably, but are wondering how to pay for it? ## 10. **Rent Program**

### **Rent Board Adopts 2023 Annual General Adjustment in the Amount of 3.0% (Effective 09/01/2023)**

At their meeting on June 26, 2023, the Rent Board adopted [Regulation 612](#), establishing the 2023 Annual General Adjustment (AGA) rent increase for Controlled Rental Units in the amount of 3.0%. Rent increases for the 2023 Annual General Adjustment may not take effect prior to September 1, 2023.

The 2023 AGA may only be applied to tenancies in effect prior to September 1, 2022. In addition, to apply the 2023 Annual General Adjustment rent increase of up to 3.0%, Landlords must comply with State law requirements and file a notice of rent increase with the Rent Board within ten (10) business days after service on the Tenant, in accordance with the [Rent Increase Procedure](#) on the Rent Program website ([www.richmondrent.org](http://www.richmondrent.org)).

### **What's the Annual General Adjustment?**

The Annual General Adjustment (AGA) is an annual rent increase for Controlled Rental Units permitted by the Richmond Fair Rent, Just Cause for Eviction, and Homeowner Protection Ordinance. The Annual General Adjustment equals 3% or 60% of the Consumer Price Index (inflation rate) of the Bay Area (San Francisco, Oakland, and San Jose), whichever is less.
