


Your Voice, Your Vote! – Tuesday, October 3rd

Community Event – To learn about and comment on the City of Richmond’s Proposed Public Land Policy

Join us for Arbor Day at Lucas Park for fun activities, lunch, and the opportunity to learn about and provide feedback on the City of Richmond’s proposed Public Land Policy.

A community event will be held at the Richmond [Arbor Day Festival](#) at Lucas Park at 724 10th Street, Richmond, CA 94801 on Saturday, October 21, 2023 from 9:00 AM - 1:00 PM.

The City of Richmond wants your input as it develops a Public Land Policy. This policy aligns with regional goals for the re-use of public land and complies with updated State law, under [AB 1468](#), and the [Surplus Land Act Guidelines](#) (Government Code sections 54220 –54234).

We want to hear from you.

- What is your ideal outcome for the development of affordable housing on public land?
- How do you want to be engaged in the noticing, disposition, and development process?

- What types of committee oversight should be happening on development proposals?
- Would you participate on a committee to evaluate development proposals?

Staff plans to bring forth policy options to inform both process and priorities for the use of City-owned property. These priorities may include:

1. Developing affordable housing (as required by state law) and maximizing public benefits.
2. Ensuring meaningful community engagement through a transparent process.
3. Selling or leasing land below fair market value for projects that maximize affordability to support project feasibility.

Background

Currently, the City does not have a comprehensive policy to inform both process and priorities for the use of its surplus property. The City would benefit from an established policy whereby the public and City staff have a common framework, considering Richmond resident housing needs, for how City-owned property will be utilized to achieve the public benefit.

[The Surplus Land Act](#) – updated by AB1486 in 2020 – requires that unused public land be prioritized for affordable housing while reducing cost barriers to housing development. The bill defines “surplus” as land owned by any local government agency that is not necessary for the agency’s use. The government agency must then make land available for affordable housing before selling or leasing the land for another purpose.




Richmond Moves on Demand Shuttle is Coming to a Neighborhood near you! New Service Areas will launch on October 11, 2023.

On September 12, 2023, the Richmond City Council approved the Transportation Division to accept an additional funding award from the California Climate Investments Clean Mobility Options Voucher Pilot Program (CMO) in the amount of \$500, 000. The


CMO program awarded the city \$1 million dollars to develop the on demand electric shuttle program, to hire a transit operator (Via) and to provide services for two years. Since the Richmond Moves program launch, ridership and wait times have increased from 14 rides in April 2022 with an average wait time of 6 minutes to over 3600 rides and an average wait time of 18 minutes in August 2023. The Transportation and Via teams have been working diligently to secure additional funds to improve the service efficiencies, increase ride capacity, and to extend services citywide.

The additional CMO funds will be used to add two additional plug-in hybrid electric vans to the Richmond Moves fleet, to acquire electric vehicle charging equipment to support the vans, and to expand operations to include the communities of Belding Woods, North and East, as well as the University of California Berkeley Field Station. Stay tuned for more expansion updates!

Rides can be booked with the free Richmond Moves app, or by calling (510) 937-3657 for assistance by phone. The service operates Monday through Friday from 7 am to 7 pm. Rides cost \$2 per trip and are free for seniors and students ages 13 to 18. 

What is Richmond Moves?

Richmond Moves works like a shared shuttle that comes when you want, where you want. Book trips straight from your phone, get picked up in minutes, and access local BART stops and the ferry terminal without needing a car.

When can I ride?

Service hours are Monday-Friday 7am-7pm.

How much do rides cost?

A single ride costs \$2. Students and seniors ride for free.

Can I pay in cash?

We accept credit or debit cards, which you must upload to your account. Head to the **Payment Methods** page in the app menu to add a card on file. Passengers who wish to pay with cash can buy ride vouchers at City Hall.

Can I book a ride in advance?

Richmond Moves is an on-demand service, meaning you should book a ride a few minutes before you're ready to leave. We'll provide you with an ETA in real-time in the app.

How do I book a ride?

You can book your ride using our mobile app or by calling 510-937-3657. Head to the back side of this pamphlet for more info on using the app.

Why do I have to walk to meet my driver?

Richmond Moves is a shared ride service, meaning passengers might be getting picked up and dropped off throughout your ride. In order to keep things moving as quickly and efficiently as possible, we usually ask you to meet us at a nearby corner instead of right outside the address you entered – that way, the driver doesn't have to make any detours that could slow things down.

Are wheelchair accessible vehicles available?

Yes! Let us know you need a WAV by toggling the wheelchair icon in the app. You can also just give us a call.



Engineering Construction Inspectors performed field inspections at various public right-of-way locations. The Engineering staff, along with the dedicated team at Veolia, Carollo Engineering, and Trails for Richmond Action Committee (TRAC), is in the final stages of completing an essential infrastructure upgrade – the Ferry Point Sewer Pump Station. This critical project necessitated modifications at the intersection of Dornan Drive and Brickyard Cove Road, resulting in a temporary realignment and some degradation of the Bay Trail in the vicinity. In collaboration with TRAC, we are actively engaged in enhancing the Bay Trail at this specific location to align it with the standards set by the City’s Bicycle and Pedestrian Action Plan and the Bay Trail Design Guidelines. The section of the trail under consideration has been temporarily modified to accommodate construction activities. We are diligently finalizing the design of the Bay Trail to prioritize the safety of bicyclists and pedestrians, ensuring the continued enjoyment of this treasured local amenity. We appreciate your understanding and patience as we work towards enhancing Richmond’s infrastructure and outdoor experiences.”
