## **Kaiser Health Care Program for the Community – Apply by January 31, 2024**

This month, Kaiser Permanente launched the [Community Health Care Program \(CHCP\)](#) in California for people who do not have access to any other health coverage. Individuals do not need to be U.S. citizens to qualify.

CHCP members will get the Kaiser Permanente Platinum 90 HMO plan. Monthly premiums for comprehensive coverage are subsidized, and members do not have to pay copays for out-of-pocket costs for most care.

## Reporting Complaints to CalTrans

The City Manager's Office, Economic Development encourages residents to use Caltrans' Customer Service Reporting to notify Caltrans of illegal dumping, trash, missing or damaged fencing, or graffiti on State highways, bridges, and right-of-ways.

## 7. Community Development

The Building Division is one of the four divisions within the Community Development Department. The Building Division is the lead in ensuring construction conforms to the California Building Standards Code, as adopted by the City. This includes reviewing construction plans prior to issuance of a building permit and conducting required inspections on construction projects after the building permit has been issued to ensure compliance with the code and the approved plans. Building Division staff also investigate habitability complaints and other building code violations, including work without permits. The primary focus of this division is protecting public health and safety.

Below is a summary of the Building Division's Activities for the month of November 2023:

- 414 Plan Checks Completed
- 283 Permits Issued
- 1195 Inspections Completed
- 34 Building Code Enforcement cases opened and followed up on.
- 20 Building Code Enforcement cases closed.

## The 2024 East Bay Innovation Awards Nominees

Moxion Power and Liquified Juicery from Richmond are finalist for the 11th annual [East Bay Innovation Awards](#). Often referred to as the “Academy Awards of the East Bay,” the Innovation Awards is the premier program of its kind that celebrates and honors the extraordinary companies and organizations that contribute to the East Bay’s legacy of innovation. The nomination period for the 2024 event saw nearly 200 submissions from Alameda and Contra Costa Counties in 10 competitive award categories, including Advanced Manufacturing, Arts & Culture, Built Environment, Clean Tech, Community Impact, Education, Engineering & Design, Food, Life Sciences, and Technology. Of these submissions, 77 nominees have advanced to the next stage.

Of the nominees, two businesses are from Richmond: **Moxion Power**, nominated in the Clean Tech category; and **Liquified Juicery**, nominated in the Food category.

Judging Day for nominations happened on Friday December 1, 2023, these two Richmond businesses have made it to the top 20 finalists. The winners will be revealed at the 2024 event ceremony, which will be held at the historic Oakland Scottish Rite Center on Thursday, March 28, 2024. 



Seniors or disabled citizens can call Public Works at (510) 231-3011 for assistance with delivery. Sandbags are limited to 10 bags per person.





### ABATEMENT

Abatement crews in collaboration with Republic Services and Sims Metal participated in Marina Bay's Neighborhood Clean-Up. Engineering Construction Inspector performed field inspection with V & A Consulting Engineers. They placed a temporary flow meter within the city's sanitary sewer main. There will be no excavation or construction work performed at this location.
