

Kaiser Health Care Program for the Community – Apply by January 31, 2024

This month, Kaiser Permanente launched the **Community Health Care Program (CHCP)** in California for people who do not have access to any other health coverage. Individuals do not need to be U.S. citizens to qualify.

CHCP members will get the Kaiser Permanente Platinum 90 HMO plan. Monthly premiums for comprehensive coverage are subsidized, and members do not have to pay copays for out-of-pocket costs for most care.

The deadline to apply for CHCP is January 31, 2024, and space is limited. Information about eligibility, how to apply, and a [list of organizations](#) helping individuals to apply can also be found [online](#) or by calling 1-800-464-4000 (TTY 711).



Great coverage is now within your reach

If you're a California resident without access to other health coverage, you can get high-quality health care through Kaiser Permanente's Community Health Care Program.

Choose your doctor based on location, specialty, language preference, and more – and you can change your doctor at any time.

Do I qualify?

The Community Health Care Program is for California residents living within Kaiser Permanente service areas. You don't have to be a U.S. citizen to qualify – residents of any status are welcome to apply.

Other requirements:

- You must live in a household with an income no more than 3 times the federal poverty level (for example, up to \$43,740 for a single person or \$92,000 for a family of 4 in 2023).
- You must not have access to other health coverage – including Medi-Cal, Medicare, a job-based health plan, or coverage through Covered California.

Otros requisitos:

- Debe vivir en un hogar cuyo ingreso no sea mayor a 3 veces el nivel federal de pobreza (por ejemplo, hasta \$43,740 para una sola persona o \$92,000 para una familia de 4 miembros, en 2023).

- No debe tener acceso a otra cobertura de salud, incluidos Medi-Cal, Medicare, un plan de salud patrocinado por el empleador o una cobertura por medio de Covered California.

Reporting Complaints to CalTrans

The City Manager's Office, Economic Development encourages residents to use Caltrans' Customer Service Reporting to notify Caltrans of illegal dumping, trash, missing or damaged fencing, or graffiti on State highways, bridges, and right-of-ways.

Reporting Options:



1. "CT Service" Smartphone App: When first opening the app, exit out of the pop-up window to report without registering.

7. Community Development

The Building Division is one of the four divisions within the Community Development Department. The Building Division is the lead in ensuring construction conforms to the California Building Standards Code, as adopted by the City. This includes reviewing construction plans prior to issuance of a building permit and conducting required inspections on construction projects after the building permit has been issued to ensure compliance with the code and the approved plans. Building Division staff also investigate habitability complaints and other building code violations, including work without permits. The primary focus of this division is protecting public health and safety.

Below is a summary of the Building Division's Activities for the month of November 2023:

- 414 Plan Checks Completed
- 283 Permits Issued
- 1195 Inspections Completed
- 34 Building Code Enforcement cases opened and followed up on.
- 20 Building Code Enforcement cases closed.

The 2024 East Bay Innovation Awards Nominees

Moxion Power and Liquefied Juicery from Richmond are finalist for the 11th annual [East Bay Innovation Awards](#). Often referred to as the “Academy Awards of the East Bay,” the Innovation Awards is the premier program of its kind that celebrates and honors the extraordinary companies and organizations that contribute to the East Bay’s legacy of innovation. The nomination period for the 2024 event saw nearly 200 submissions from Alameda and Contra Costa Counties in 10 competitive award categories, including Advanced Manufacturing, Arts & Culture, Built Environment, Clean Tech, Community Impact, Education, Engineering & Design, Food, Life Sciences, and Technology. Of these submissions, 77 nominees have advanced to the next stage.

Of the nominees, two businesses are from Richmond: **Moxion Power**, nominated in the Clean Tech category; and **Liquified Juicery**, nominated in the Food category.

Judging Day for nominations happened on Friday December 1, 2023, these two Richmond businesses have made it to the top 20 finalists. The winners will be revealed at the 2024 event ceremony, which will be held at the historic Oakland Scottish Rite Center on Thursday, March 28, 2024. City of Richmond's Minimum Wage increases to \$17.20 Per Hour

Effective January 1, 2024

The minimum wage requirement set forth in the Richmond Minimum Wage Ordinance 11-14 N.S., codified in Richmond Municipal Code Chapter 7.108, applies to adult and minor employees who work two (2) or more hours a week for a covered Employer.

Richmond Minimum Wage

Effective January 1, 2024

\$17.20 Per Hour

The minimum wage requirement set forth in the Richmond Minimum Wage Ordinance 11-14 N.S., codified in Richmond Municipal Code Chapter 7.108, applies to adult and minor employees who work two (2) or more hours a week for a covered Employer. Each year, the City will adjust the minimum wage as stated in the Minimum Wage Ordinance until January 1, 2019, when it will increase to \$15 per hour. However, beginning on January 1, 2020 and each year thereafter, the minimum wage shall increase by an amount corresponding to the prior year's increase according to the Department of Labor's Regional Consumer Price Index.

Under the Ordinance, employees who assert their rights to receive the City's minimum wage are protected from retaliation. Employees may file a civil lawsuit against their employers for any violation of the Ordinance or may file a complaint with the Employment and Training Department. The City will investigate possible violations, will have access to payroll records, and will enforce violations of the minimum wage requirements.

Please note, the City Council amended the ordinance in July 2017 and eliminated certain exemptions relating to intermediate wages, small businesses, government grants and businesses that deliver goods and services outside of Richmond. 

Richmond Moves is part of California Transit Investments (CTI), a statewide initiative to improve transit service and reduce greenhouse gas emissions, improve air quality, and improve public health and the environment in partnership with local transit agencies.

What is Richmond Moves?
Richmond Moves works like a shared shuttle that comes when you want, where you want. Book trips straight from your phone, get picked up in minutes, and drop off at BART, SFO, and the ferry terminal without needing a car.

When can I ride?
Service runs from Monday through Friday, 7am-7pm.

How much do rides cost?
A single ride costs \$2. Students and seniors ride for free.

Can I pay in cash?
We accept cash or mobile cards, when you must upload to your account. Head to the Register Mobile app in the app menu to add a card or the Riders app, who will pay with cash on their ride voucher at City Hall.

Can I book a ride in advance?
Richmond Moves is an on-demand service, meaning you should book a ride a few minutes before you're ready to leave. We'll provide you with an "A" brand car in the app.

How do I book a ride?
You can book your ride using our mobile app or by calling 510-437-3657. Head to the back side of this pamphlet for more info on using the app.

Why do I have to wait to meet my driver?
Richmond Moves is a shared ride service, meaning passengers might be getting picked up and dropped off throughout your ride. In order to keep things moving as quickly and efficiently as possible, we usually ask you to meet us at a nearby corner instead of right outside the address you entered. That way, the driver doesn't have to make any detours that could slow things down.

Are wheelchair accessible vehicles available?
Yes! Let us know you need a WAV by toggling the wheelchair icon in the app. You can also get us on a call.

ABATEMENT

The Streets Maintenance Division will provide two self-fill sandbag stations. One station is located at 10 Harbour Way at the back gate to the Corp Yard, and the second station is located in the parking lot for the Bayview Library at 5100 Hartnett Avenue.

Seniors or disabled citizens can call Public Works at (510) 231-3011 for assistance with delivery. Sandbags are limited to 10 bags per person.
