

Apply for Richmond's Design Review Board!

The City is currently looking to fill four vacancies on its Design Review Board (DRB). There is no deadline for applications, but applications will be reviewed on a first come first served basis.

To be eligible, you must live or work in the City of Richmond. Ideally, the City is looking for architects, persons from the business community, and experts in the design or construction industry. The City also encourages you to apply if you are not a design professional but have an eye for good architectural or urban design.

The DRB is seven-member body that evaluates the design of residential, commercial, and industrial development projects to promote high-quality urban environments. Members are appointed to a two-year term. The DRB meets the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month at 6:00 PM. Meetings are held in-person only at 440 Civic Center Plaza in Richmond. Applications are available on the City Clerk's website.





Abatement crews in collaboration with Republic Services and Sims Metal participated in the North and East Neighborhood Dumpster Day, crews assisted 106 seniors and disabled citizens, collected seven dumpsters of debris and two dumpsters of metal, abated weeds from Richmond Parkway Bay Trail, abated illegally dumped debris and removed graffiti from various locations throughout the city.

Engineering

The Engineering Construction Inspector performed field inspection for public right-away. Pacific Gas & Electric (PG&E) Subcontractor Pinnacle Power Services, was hired to replace the damage power pole with a new pole and replace the home services at 3003 Garvin Ave.



Santa Rita Road Stabilization Project

For the week of May 14, 2024, the project is currently at 85% completed. 90% of the tie backs have been completed and the remaining tie backs will be completed by early next week. Rocks and boulders were delivered on site for the bottom of the slope stabilization. Completion of this project is set for the first week of June.



Park Maintenance

Parks General Fund crews picked up litter at all City Parks and right-of-ways. Crews performed weed abatement at Seacliff Drive, Valley View Road right-of-ways, the Clinton Avenue soundwall, Tiller Park, Kern Park, Burg Park, John F. Kennedy Park, Ells Path, Cypress Path, and Baxter Creek. They also did fennel removal on Carlson Boulevard, Plumas Street, General fund medians, and the tennis court and playground area at Booker T. Anderson Park. They performed replacement of twelve (12) bleachers at Nicholl Park, irrigation repairs at City Hall, Mira Vista Park, and North Richmond Ball Field. Crews started the replacement of backflow at Judge Carroll Park and Nevin Park. They also picked up trash from Point Richmond, the Bay Trail, and the Richmond Greenway. The City Tree Crew trimmed city street trees at the McBryde Avenue center median.



Hilltop District crews performed weed abatement on Hilltop Drive, Country Club Vista Park, Hillview median, Hilltop Mall Road, and the Auto Plaza Monument. The turf was mowed at the Country Club Vista Park, Vista Del Mar Park, and Bay Vista Park.



Marina crews continued hand pulling weeds from Marina Bay Trail next to Shores, mowed lawns at Barbara J. Vincent Park and Shimada Park. They continued cutting tree wells and high grass from barbeque areas in Marina Bay Park, hand removed weeds and placed new mulch around bathrooms at Lucretia Edwards Park. Crews removed several graffiti tags from the playground structure at Barbara J. Vincent Park, mowed high weeds from area across from PG&E, and cut around tree wells. Removed all trash from trash receptacles from Marina Bay District and Marina Bay Trail, picked up all litter from parking lots and common areas throughout and continued with irrigation startups throughout the Marina.



Street Maintenance

The Pavement Maintenance crew resurfaced Clearfield Ave from Sweetwood Drive to the end, posted barricades for Contra Costa College graduation ceremony at the Richmond Auditorium, performed hot mix patches at various locations, and worked from the outstanding pothole/hot mix list.




