



Meetings and events of note in the past week include the following:

- Attended the May 28th City Council meeting
- Collaborated with staff members to review, edit, and finalize agenda items for the June 4th Richmond City Council meeting
- Provided direction to staff on refining the Draft Fiscal Year 24-25 and 5-Year Capital Improvements budget development and discussed ways to address high priority built environment projects, including street calming, which also includes paving and enhanced sustainability

Major Bart Construction between MacArthur and 19th Street

Beginning June 22 and 23, BART will begin a project to replace 16 interlockings between MacArthur Station and 19th Street Station. Interlockings allow trains to move from line to line and are an essential part of the BART system.

Each interlocking replacement will require substituting train service with bus service between Rockridge, MacArthur, and 19th Street BART stations. Riders can expect delays of up to 40 minutes between these stations and less frequent service systemwide on work weekends. This image shows where bus bridges will operate. The City is currently looking to fill four vacancies on its Design Review Board (DRB). There is no deadline for applications, but applications will be reviewed on a first come first served basis.

To be eligible, you must live or work in the City of Richmond. Ideally, the City is looking for architects, persons from the business community, and experts in the design or construction industry. The City also encourages you to apply if you are not a design professional but have an eye for good architectural or urban design.

The DRB is seven-member body that evaluates the design of residential, commercial, and industrial development projects to promote high-quality urban environments. Members are appointed to a two-year term. The DRB meets the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month at 6:00 PM. Meetings are held in-person only at 440 Civic Center Plaza in Richmond. 
Engineering




Park Maintenance

Parks General Fund crews picked up litter at all city parks and right of ways. Crews abated weeds on city street medians on Carlson Blvd and S.37th Street to Cutting Blvd, also at Mira Flores Park, State Court Park, Crescent Park, Nicholl Park, Richmond/El Sobrante fire safety access trails, Seacliff Dr, Barrett Ave, and North Richmond Ballfield Park. Crews performed an encampment cleanup at Lucas Park underpass, and irrigation repairs at Nicholl Park. Crews also picked up trash from Pt. Richmond, Bay Trail, and Richmond Greenway. The City Tree Crew trimmed and removed dying city street trees at Huntington Park.



Marina crews edged and mowed lawns at Marina Bay Park, continued cutting tree wells and manual hand-pulled weeds from Sand Beach. Crews completed weed removal from medians on Regatta Blvd., Bayside Dr., and the trails from Rosie the Riveter Museum to the Harbor Master. Crews also mowed lawns at Lucretia Park and removed trash from all trash receptacles, replenished doggy bags throughout parks and trail in the Marina Bay District.
