## Recap: National Gun Violence Community Remembrance

Richmond held its first National Gun Violence Community Remembrance Day Friday, June 7, 2024 in the City Hall Civic Center Plaza to recognize the lives lost to gun violence and work together to end gun violence in the city.

The event highlighted the contributions of several key community partners addressing gun violence in Richmond. Councilmember Bana and staff worked collaboratively with Assemblymember Buffy Wicks' Office, the Office of Neighborhood Safety, Crime Prevention Manager Michelle Milam, the Family Justice Center, RYSE, the Latina Center and several other community organizations to plan and conduct the inaugural Day of Remembrance.

Richmond Poet Laureate Steven Sharpe recited poems and gave remarks about losing his nephew to gun violence. City officials, staff, community organizers and others spoke to the need to end gun violence through addressing the root causes of gun violence. Keyz to the Future, Ya-Neema Healing Circle and Support Services, Visions of Hope Outreach, the Police Department Chaplains and counselors from the Contra Costa County A3 Crisis Response Program were there to provide support to participants and to share information.

Thanks to a donation from the Richmond Chamber of Commerce, La Selva provided delicious tacos and grilled hotdogs donated by Richmond Wholesale Meats.

### Major Bart Construction between MacArthur and 19th Street

Beginning June 22 and 23, BART will begin a project to replace 16 interlockings between MacArthur Station and 19th Street Station. Interlockings allow trains to move from line to line and are an essential part of the BART system.

Each interlocking replacement will require substituting train service with bus service between Rockridge, MacArthur, and 19th Street BART stations. Riders can expect delays of up to 40 minutes between these stations and less frequent service systemwide on work weekends. This image shows where bus bridges will operate. The City is currently looking to fill four vacancies on its Design Review Board (DRB). There is no deadline for applications, but applications will be reviewed on a first come first served basis.

To be eligible, you must live or work in the City of Richmond. Ideally, the City is looking for architects, persons from the business community, and experts in the design or construction industry. The City also encourages you to apply if you are not a design professional but have an eye for good architectural or urban design.

The DRB is seven-member body that evaluates the design of residential, commercial, and industrial development projects to promote high-quality urban environments. Members are appointed to a two-year term. The DRB meets the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month at 6:00 PM. Meetings are held in-person only at 440 Civic Center Plaza in Richmond. The Port of Richmond tenant, CA Ventures/Outrigger Industrial, is making significant progress on the Moxion development project at Terminal 3! This week, two wall panels have been erected on Harbour Way South, completing the installation of the perimeter walls. Moxion Power Co. designs and manufactures commercial-scale mobile battery energy storage systems (BESS) to replace fossil fuel-burning generators. Headquartered and made in Richmond, Moxion is spearheading the deployment and commercialization of innovative technology that aims to decarbonize the mobile power sector and significantly reduce emissions associated with conventional diesel-based portable power generation. This project will not only bring local manufacturing jobs to the community but also build on Richmond's legacy and leadership in energy, manufacturing, and technology.





### Recap: Richmond Fire Department Full Scale Medical Response and Surge Exercise

On June 12, 2024, the Richmond Fire Department and the Contra Costa County Health Hazardous Materials (HAZMAT) Team participated in a county-wide exercise simulating mass casualty and hazardous materials response. The goal of the exercise was to test protocols during medical surges and maintain readiness during HAZMAT incidents. Participating agencies performed patient contact, resource coordination, chemical identification, and decontamination of patients/crew. Agencies that participated and observed the exercise included the El Cerrito Fire Department, The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), Contra Costa Emergency Medical Services (EMS), Redwood Empire Air Care Helicopter (REACH) Air Medical Service, American Medical Response (AMR), Royal Ambulance, Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) volunteers, and the California Department of Public Health.





## Abatement

In collaboration with Republic Services and Sims Metal, Abatement crews participated in the Pullman Neighborhood Clean-up. Crews assisted 28 seniors and disabled citizens, collected seven dumpsters of debris and two dumpsters of metal, abated tons of debris from around homeless encampments, abated weeds from Richmond Parkway, city-owned lots and alleyways, abated illegally dumped debris, and removed graffiti from various locations throughout the city.

## Building Maintenance

Building Maintenance crews cleaned and removed debris from inside and outside of 440 and 450 Civic Center Plaza. This week at the Booker T. Anderson Community Center, staff deep cleaned and sealed all the floors, cleaned the windows, power washed the quad area and surrounding seating sections. Staff also provided maintenance service for 27 city-owned buildings.

Electrical staff continued working with outside contractors to complete the installation of solar lights in the Management Leadership Team parking lot. The parking lot had no lights and no viable method of getting power for lights. The solar lights are part of a pilot program by the city for these types of areas. Staff provided power for a water heater at Booker T. Anderson Park. Another replacement street light pole was installed on Robert H. Miller Dr. near San Pablo Ave. to complete the replacement of knocked down streetlights in that area.

Stationary Engineers performed daily pool inspections and maintenance, performed daily inspections of the boiler's, circulating pumps and sump pumps at the Civic Center Plaza; repaired the ADA button on the second floor of 440 Community Service Building. Staff replaced the dishwasher at Fire Station 64, replaced restroom faucet in the Battalion Chief's quarters and installed a water bottle rack on the second floor of 450 City Hall. They repaired the condensate pump to the indoor pool at the Richmond Swim Center, repaired the chlorine pump at the Plunge and cleared a clogged urinal on the third floor of the Community Service Building.

## Engineering

the engineering construction inspector performed a field inspection on the public right-of-way. The Pacific Gas & Electric (PG&E) power crew did repair work on the utility pole on Ohio Ave at South 17th St.



## Santa Rita Road Stabilization Project

As of the week of June 4, 2024, this project is 97% completed. The installation of the soldier pile wall, tie backs, curb & gutter and rock/boulders have been fully completed. The guardrail and fence installation, erosion control blanket and preparation of willow stick installation will be completed next week. The Design Team and Construction Management have noticed additional work is required to protect the City's property. So, an additional wall segment is under review for installation in the next couple of weeks. The construction project is scheduled to be completed before the end of June.



## Park Maintenance

The Parks General Fund crews conducted litter collection at all City Parks and public right-of-ways. They also carried out weed abatement activities along the Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zones (VHFSZ) fire access trails, the medians of Cutting Ave from S.37th St. to S.49th St., Carlson Blvd medians from S.37th St. to S.43rd St., as well as at various parks including Humphrey Park, LaMoine Park, State Court Park, Fire Training Center, Nevin Park, Pt. Richmond, and Booker T. Anderson Park in preparation for the grand opening of the community center. Furthermore, Park Crews undertook a homeless encampment abatement at Barrett Ave. underpass and 18th St., performed irrigation repairs at Nicholl Park, and initiated the replacement of the irrigation backflow meter at Judge Carroll Park. They also collected trash in Pt. Richmond, the Bay Trail, and Richmond Greenway. The Tree Crew pruned and removed dying city street trees from inside Baxter Creek and Booker T. Anderson Park.

Homeless Camp Abatement

The Marina District crews continued cutting weeds along the San Francisco Bay Trail behind homes. They manually pulled weeds from inside shrubs, string trimmed weeds from around roses and landscaped areas next to the cement beach. Crews also cut weeds at Shimada Park behind homes and around the parking lot. They manually removed weeds from ice plants, repaired a broken irrigation valve on the San Francisco Bay Trail, and continued with irrigation startups. Additionally, crews cut overgrowth of trees along Marina Bay Trail and removed all trash from trash receptacles throughout the district.

The Hilltop District crews completed the following tasks: Turf mowing at Country Club Vista Park, Vista Del Mar Park, and Bay Vista Park, weed abatement on the Richmond Parkway (between the causeway and Lakeside Road), irrigation repair at Country Club Vista Park, Bay Vista Park, Hilltop Drive, and Hillview.

## Street Maintenance

The Pavement Maintenance crew resurfaced Leona Ave from Harry Ells Place to the end, installed a new speed hump on South 55th St. between Highland Ave. and Santa Clara St. as part of Traffic Control Measure #12, posted barricades for the Richmond Police Activities League (RPAL) Carnival special event, and worked from the outstanding pothole/hot mix list.

Traffic Signs and Lines crews replaced faded street name signs on San Pablo Ave, installed approach lines, chevrons, and signs for new speed humps on South 55th St, installed new striping on Leona Ave, refreshed STOP messages in Parchester Village, refreshed school zone markings and crosswalk on Garvin Ave at 24th St, and made repairs to several other signs throughout the city.
