Recap: National Gun Violence Community Remembrance

Richmond held its first National Gun Violence Community Remembrance Day on Friday, June 7, 2024 in the City Hall Civic Center Plaza to recognize the lives lost to gun violence and work together to end gun violence in the city.

The event highlighted the contributions of several key community partners addressing gun violence in Richmond. Councilmember Bana and staff worked collaboratively with Assemblymember Buffy Wicks' Office, the Office of Neighborhood Safety, Crime Prevention Manager Michelle Milam, the Family Justice Center, RYSE, the Latina Center and several other community organizations to plan and conduct the inaugural Day of Remembrance.

Richmond Poet Laureate Steven Sharpe recited poems and gave remarks about losing his nephew to gun violence. City officials, staff, community organizers and others spoke to the need to end gun violence through addressing the root causes of gun violence. Keyz to the Future, Ya-Neema Healing Circle and Support Services, Visions of Hope Outreach, the Police Department Chaplains and counselors from the Contra Costa County A3 Crisis Response Program were there to provide support to participants and to share information.

Thanks to a donation from the Richmond Chamber of Commerce, La Selva provided delicious tacos and grilled hotdogs donated by Richmond Wholesale Meats.

Major BART Construction between MacArthur and 19th Street

Beginning June 22 and 23, BART will begin a project to replace 16 interlockings between MacArthur Station and 19th Street Station. Interlockings allow trains to move from line to line and are an essential part of the BART system.

Each interlocking replacement will require substituting train service with bus service between Rockridge, MacArthur, and 19th Street BART stations. Riders can expect delays of up to 40 minutes between these stations and less frequent service systemwide on work weekends. This image shows where bus bridges will operate. Apply for Richmond's Design Review Board!

The City is currently looking to fill four vacancies on its Design Review Board (DRB). There is no deadline for applications, but applications will be reviewed on a first come first served basis.

To be eligible, you must live or work in the City of Richmond. Ideally, the City is looking for architects, persons from the business community, and experts in the design or construction industry. The City also encourages you to apply if you are not a design professional but have an eye for good architectural or urban design.

The DRB is seven-member body that evaluates the design of residential, commercial, and industrial development projects to promote high-quality urban environments. Members are appointed to a two-year term. The DRB meets the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month at 6:00 PM. Meetings are held in-person only at 440 Civic Center Plaza in Richmond.



HOMEOWNERS – HELP REDUCE HARMFUL AIR POLLUTION IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD

Apply for funding to reduce the cost of replacing a wood stove or wood-burning fireplace insert with an electric heat pump!

\$2M in Clean HEET funding is available. Individual awards range from \$3,000–\$10,500 for one stove/insert, and \$6,000–\$13,500 for two stoves/inserts.

All Bay Area homeowners are eligible to apply. Homeowners in the communities of West Oakland, East Oakland, Richmond-San Pablo, and Bayview Hunters Point/Southeast San Francisco are especially encouraged to apply.

Requirements:

Existing wood-burning devices must:


- Be operational and used only for indoor heating (not cooking).
- Be made inoperable and scrapped. For projects replacing fireplace inserts, the fireplace must also be rendered inoperable.

Applicants/Participants must:

- Apply for and receive approval from the Air District prior to starting any work. Funding is not available retroactively if any work has been started.
- Be the legal owner of the home and provide a completed W-9 form.
- Obtain all permits required by local City or County for project work.
- Hire a licensed contractor for all project work.





Public Works

Abatement

In collaboration with Republic Services, and Sims Metal, Abatement crews participated in the Park Plaza and Cortez Stege Neighborhoods Clean-up. Crews assisted 48 seniors and disabled citizens, collected five dumpsters of debris and one dumpster of metal, abated several tons of debris from around homeless encampments, abated city owned lots and alleyways, abated illegally dumped debris, and removed graffiti from various locations throughout the city.

Building Maintenance

Building Maintenance Workers cleaned and removed debris from inside and outside of 440 and 450 Civic Center Plaza. Staff removed unwanted and broken desk and furniture from the office areas of the Richmond Recreation Complex and finished with deep cleaning the office spaces. Staff also provides maintenance services for 27 City owned buildings.



The Electric Crew repaired a traffic cabinet on Carlson Blvd. across from the Pullman Apartments. The cabinet housed controls for two flashing beacons marking the pedestrian crossing and was knocked down in an auto accident. Crews repaired underground electrical pull boxes that had been vandalized by wire thieves, and responded to a complaint of a broken streetlight that was collecting leaves and dirt.

Stationary Engineers performed daily pool inspections and maintenance, performed daily inspections of the boilers, circulating pumps and sump pumps at the Civic Center Plaza; replaced the operating thermostat to the heating system at Fire Station 64, repaired a flushometer to a urinal in the Recreational Complex. Staff installed a new dishwasher at the Annex Senior Center, repaired a chlorine line injector connector at the Plunge, replaced the Auditorium condensate pump seal, snaked a clogged drain at 440 Community Service Building and repaired the ½" Teflon line coming out of the chlorine tank at the Swim Center.

The engineering construction inspectors performed field inspection for projects taking place in the public right-of-way. The homeowner at 2919 Garvin Ave had their sewer lateral replaced and a backflow stopper installed to meet the city's required standards.

Santa Rita Road Stabilization Project

During the week of June 11, 2024, the project is nearing completion at 98%. The installation of the soldier pile wall, tie backs, curb & gutter, and rock/boulders is fully finished. Erosion control blankets have been installed, and preparation for willow stick installation will be completed next week. The design team and construction management have identified the need for additional work to protect the City's property. Therefore, an additional wall segment is currently under review for installation within the next few weeks. The construction project is slated for completion by the end of June 2024.





Cutting/Hoffman & Harbour Way South Bikeway Project

During the week of June 11, 2024, the project stands at 95% completion. The slurry seal operation on Hoffman Ave and segments of Harbour Way South, along with traffic signal modifications at several intersections, have been finalized. Striping of the travel lanes and bike lanes is currently in progress. The construction is expected to conclude by June 30, 2024.




Park Maintenance

General Fund crews collected litter at all City parks and public right-of-ways. They also carried out weed abatement activities along the fire access trails, the rights-of-ways of Cutting Ave from S.37th St. to S.49th St., Richmond Annex/Carlson Blvd., street median from Tehama Ave to San Jose St., 19th St. center medians, Main Library courtyard, The DPRC center as well as at various parks including Wendell Park, Humboldt Park, and Martin Luther King Park. Additionally, park crews addressed homeless encampment issues and repaired the irrigation system at Nicholl Park, and initiated the removal of graffiti at Tiller Park. They also collected trash at Pt. Richmond, Bay Trail, and Richmond Greenway. The tree crew pruned city street trees at 2706 Garvin Ave.

The Marina crews continued their efforts to maintain the Marina Bay Trail by cutting weeds, which helped to eliminate fire hazards and hand-pulled weeds from shrubs and plants. Crews carried out irrigation fixes and startups in parks, removed several graffiti tags from restrooms and signs, and mowed an empty lot to clear it of weeds. They also began the process of removing fennel next to the restaurant, hand-pulled weeds at the Moody underpass, and started removing weeds at the Marina Bay Business Park. Furthermore, they cut and edged the lawn at the Marina Bay Park and picnic area and made sure to remove all the trash from the receptacles throughout the Marina district.
