Apply for Richmond's Design Review Board!

The City is currently looking to fill four vacancies on its Design Review Board (DRB). There is no deadline for applications, but applications will be reviewed on a first come first served basis.

To be eligible, you must live or work in the City of Richmond. Ideally, the City is looking for architects, persons from the business community, and experts in the design or construction industry. The City also encourages you to apply if you are not a design professional but have an eye for good architectural or urban design.

The DRB is seven-member body that evaluates the design of residential, commercial, and industrial development projects to promote high-quality urban environments. Members are appointed to a two-year term. The DRB meets the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month at 6:00 PM. Meetings are held in-person only at 440 Civic Center Plaza in Richmond.

HOMEOWNERS – HELP REDUCE HARMFUL AIR POLLUTION IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD

Apply for funding to reduce the cost of replacing a wood stove or wood-burning fireplace insert with an electric heat pump!

\$2M in Clean HEET funding is available. Individual awards range from \$3,000–\$10,500 for one stove/insert, and \$6,000–\$13,500 for two stoves/inserts.

All Bay Area homeowners are eligible to apply. Homeowners in the communities of West Oakland, East Oakland, Richmond-San Pablo, and Bayview Hunters Point/Southeast San Francisco are especially encouraged to apply.

Requirements:

Existing wood-burning devices must:

- Be operational and used only for indoor heating (not cooking).
- Be made inoperable and scrapped. For projects replacing fireplace inserts; the fireplace must also be rendered inoperable.

Applicants/Participants must:

- Apply for and receive approval from the Air District prior to starting any work. Funding is not available retroactively if any work has been started.
- Be the legal owner of the home and provide a completed W-9 form.
- Obtain all permits required by local City or County for project work.
- Hire a licensed contractor for all project work.

Abatement

In collaboration with Republic Services and Sims Metal, Abatement crews participated in the Parchester Village Neighborhood Clean-up. Crews assisted 16 seniors and disabled citizens, and collected 12 dumpsters of debris, abated several tons of debris from around homeless encampments, abated city-owned lots and alleyways, abated illegally dumped debris, and removed graffiti from various locations throughout the city.

Building Maintenance

Facility maintenance workers cleaned and removed debris from inside and outside areas of 440 and 450 Civic Center Plaza. Staff assisted the Mayor's Office staff with a Juneteenth flag raising ceremony in recognition of the Juneteenth holiday. In addition, staff provided maintenance services for 27 City owned buildings.

Electricians responded to auto accidents that knocked down a street light pole and a traffic signal pole. Both required multiple team members to be dispatched to the locations where the poles had to be dismantled and disposed of. Crews also repaired multiple streetlights around the Triangle Apartments.

Stationary Engineers performed daily pool inspections and maintenance, performed daily inspections and maintenance of the boilers, circulating pumps and sump pumps at the Civic Center Plaza. Staff replaced the make-up water float switch to the Intellipak rooftop unit at 440 Community Service Building, repaired a faucet in the men's lockerroom at the Plunge and cleaned out the six strainer baskets to the outdoor pool at Kennedy Swim Center. In addition, staff repaired the dishwasher at Fire Station 62, replaced the ½" Teflon tubing coming out of the chlorine tank at the Plunge and snaked a clogged waste line to one of the restrooms sink at the Communications Center.

Engineering

Engineering construction inspector performed field inspections at a home on the 2900 block of Garvin Ave. The homeowner had their sewer lateral replaced and a backflow popper installed to meet the city's required standards.



Santa Rita Road Stabilization Project

The project is almost finished, currently at 99% completion. The soldier pile wall, tie backs, asphalt concrete, erosion control blankets, curb & gutter, guardrail, fence and rocks have all been installed. Willow sticks have not yet been installed but are expected to be placed during the first month of rainfall to ensure the plants' survivability. A punch list meeting involving the City, contractor, and inspectors is planned for the first week of July.



Park Maintenance

The Parks General Fund crews completed litter collection operations within all City parks and public rights-of-way. Additionally, they abated weeds at various locations, including the Family Justice Center, the Communications Center, street medians on Robert Miller Drive, Burg Park, Cutting Circle, Parchester Park, Monterey Park, South 51st Street, Seaport Ave, the Bay Trail, Abraham Baxton Park, Nunn Pathway, Kennedy Swim Center, and John F. Kennedy Park. Moreover, park crews performed irrigation repairs at Nicholl Park, installed new windscreens on tennis court #2 at Nicholl Park, implemented new mulch at the Nunn Soundwall, and continued the replacement of the irrigation backflow meter at Judge Carroll Park. They also participated in waste collection efforts at Pt. Richmond, Bay Trail, and Richmond Greenway. The City Tree Crew pruned city street trees on the 1400 block of Hoffman Ave, Pt. Richmond Rose Garden, Castro St, Cottage Ave, Judge Carroll Park, and Nevin Park.

Marina District


