Recap: Traffic Operations and Quality of Life Enforcement Lead to 1 Arrest, 45 Traffic Citations, 90 Marked Vehicles, and More

For two days, officers conducted traffic operations and a special assignment to deter prostitution on 23rd Street and surrounding areas. As a result, 22 parking citations were issued and 90 vehicles were marked for potential parking violations. One vehicle was impounded and one arrest was made for public intoxication.

Abatement crews, in collaboration with Republic Services and Sims Metal, participated in the Panhandle/Southwest Annex Neighborhood Clean-up. Crews assisted 14 seniors and disabled citizens, and collected 6 dumpsters of debris, abated tons of debris from around homeless encampments, abated illegally dumped debris, and removed graffiti from various locations throughout the city.





Electricians continued repairs of street lighting and traffic signal poles. Vandalism continues to be a problem as more electrical boxes are broken into. Repairs were made to curbside areas where trucks damaged bollards protecting Traffic equipment.

Stationary Engineers performed daily pool inspections and maintenance, and performed daily inspections and maintenance of the boiler's, circulating pumps, and sump pumps at the Civic Center Plaza. Repaired a toilet at Fire Station 64 by installing a complete flushometer kit, replaced a toilet seat cover at Fire Station 63, replaced a compressor to the wall mount air conditioning #5 in the Seargent's restroom. Replaced the blower wheel to the dryer at Fire Station 62, cleared the floor drain in the men's restroom at Lucretia Edwards Park, and replaced the filters to the dehumidifier at the Swim Center.

Engineering

Engineering Construction Inspector doing field inspection on the public right-of-way. This was a cable wire repair by American Telephone and Telegraph (AT&T) at 100 W. Ohio Ave. The work was to repair cable wires on the utility pole that was vandalized and stolen.

Park Maintenance

The Parks General Fund crews have been busy with a variety of tasks. They collected litter at all city parks and public rights-of-way. Additionally, they conducted weed abatement activities at several locations including the Barrett Ave underpass, Richmond Greenway from Carlson Meadows to San Pablo Ave, Macdonald Ave underpass, Cutting Blvd center medians, Nevin Plaza, Carlson Blvd right of ways from S.43rd St. to S. 47th St., Berk Ave, the sound wall on S. 56th St, and Castro Ranch Rd behind Kipling Drive.

In addition to these activities, park crews completed irrigation repairs at La Moine Park. They also continued the replacement of the stolen irrigation backflow meter at North Richmond/Luckey A's ballfield, replaced exercise equipment with new handles and stickers, and repaired broken benches at John F. Kennedy Park. Other tasks included repairing the wooden sandbox at Huntington Park and removing graffiti at Humphrey Park. Trash collection efforts took place at Pt. Richmond, Bay Trail, and Richmond Greenway.

The City Tree Crew also continued its work, focusing on removing city street trees on the 1200 block of Bissell Ave.



The Marina Bay crews have been busy with a variety of tasks. They started by cutting and hauling tree limbs, weeds, and debris from the Marina Bay walking trail, working from the tennis courts towards the duck crossing. Additionally, they continued to hand-pull weeds from the Sand Beach and Regatta medians and fixed broken sprinkler heads while making irrigation adjustments on the lawn at Esplanade. They also picked up trash from all parking lots, lawn areas, and around trash receptacles, and replaced the cans with new bags. Moreover, they refilled fido stations throughout the marina, picked up and emptied all trash recycling from the Big Belly's throughout the Marina Bay trail and parks, and mowed weeds on the Marina Bay trail from the bridge, behind homes going towards Shimada Park.

Street Maintenance
