

The City also encourages you to apply if you are not a design professional but have an eye for good architectural or urban design.

The DRB is a seven-member body that evaluates the design of residential, commercial, and industrial development projects to promote high-quality urban environments. Members are appointed to a two-year term.

The DRB meets on the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month at 6:00 PM. Meetings are held in person only at 440 Civic Center Plaza in Richmond. Applications are available on the City Clerk's website.

The City is currently looking to fill two vacancies on its Historic Preservation Commission (HPC). There is no deadline for applications, but applications will be reviewed on a first-come first-served basis.

To be eligible, you must live or work in the city of Richmond and have a demonstrated interest, competence, or knowledge of historic preservation. Commissioners may include professionals in the disciplines of history, architecture, prehistoric and historic archaeology, folklore, cultural anthropology, conservation, urban planning, American studies, and cultural geography. Representatives from historic preservation organizations and building contractors are also encouraged to apply.

The HPC is a seven-member body that reviews major alterations to historic resources. The HPC also nominates properties for historic designation and conducts historic resource surveys and studies.

Commissioners are appointed to a four-year term. The HPC meets on the first Monday of each month at 5:30 PM. Meetings are held in person only at 450 Civic Center Plaza in Richmond. Applications are available on the City Clerk's website.





In collaboration with Republic Services, and Sims Metal, Abatement crews participated in the Laurel Park Neighborhoods Clean-up. 



Stationary Engineers performed daily pool inspections and maintenance. Performed daily inspections and maintenance of the boiler's, circulating pumps and sump pumps at the Civic Center Plaza. Replaced a push button time delay mechanism to a faucet in the men's restroom at the Plunge. Installed a new dishwasher at Fire Station 66 and snaked a clogged sink in the basement of 450 City Hall in the women's restroom. Replaced the wax ring to a toilet at Fire Station 62 and replaced the fan belt to the Exhaust Fan #1 in 440 Community Service Building. The team replaced the bearings on the supply fan to the Bermuda Room in the Auditorium.

Park Maintenance

The Parks General Fund crews have been busy with various maintenance activities. They have collected litter at all city parks and public right-of-way. In addition, they carried out weed abatement activities at specific locations, including the 24th St. and Nevin Ave sitting area, Mira Vista Park, Richmond Main Library courtyard, city-owned parking lots on 11th St. and 13th St. along Macdonald Ave, Richmond Greenway from 10th St. and Harbour Way to 14th St. and Ohio Ave, West Richmond Ave to Castro St., Carlson Blvd medians from S.47th St. to Bayview Ave., and from Bayview Ave to Imperial Ave. The park crews also performed irrigation repairs at Kennedy Swim Center and fence repairs at Nicholl Park. Additionally, they engaged in trash collection at Pt. Richmond, Bay Trail, and Richmond Greenway.

The City Tree Crew also removed city street trees on the S.55th St, S.56th St., and San Luis St. sound walls.




