Meetings and events of note in the past week include the following:

- Received an update from Avenu Insights and Revenue Manager Antonio Banuelos on Richmond sales tax reports for the second quarter of 2024
- Participated in the October 22 Closed Session, Special Meeting of the Richmond Housing Authority and the Regular Meeting of the City Council
- The Management Leadership Team (MLT) and I participated in a special team building activity at Civic Center Plaza, led by Public Works Project Manager Wade Finlinson. Together, we laid down cardboard, spread mulch, and cleared weeds to rejuvenate the plaza and enhance its appearance. Many thanks to Wade Finlinson and the group of Public Works colleagues that led us in this special project.
- Met with 23rd Street Merchants Association and various city staff to share information on the Mobile Vendor Program, Sidewalk Vendor Ordinance, parking enforcement, business grants, Richmond Police Department data, and draft street pole banners that will be installed in the coming weeks.
- Attended the ribbon cutting ceremony for the new Mobile Vendor Program (MVP) in the parking lot at 1401 Macdonald Avenue to support small businesses and enhance downtown. Marlon Mullen, Longtime NIAD Artist, Lands a MoMA Solo Show

Excerpt from KQED Article, written by Nastia Voynovskaya:

Richmond artist Marlon Mullen's colorful, stylized paintings have caught the eye of New York's Museum of Modern Art (MoMA), which recently announced it will host his first solo museum show. Projects: Marlon Mullen will premiere on Dec. 14, 2024 and remain on view in the museum's free, street-level Projects gallery through April 20, 2025.

Born in Richmond in 1963, Mullen is self-taught and has worked at his hometown's NIAD Art Center since 1985. The studio supports artists with developmental disabilities, and shares a mission with sister studios Creative Growth in Oakland and Creativity Explored in San Francisco. The San Francisco Museum of Modern Art selected Mullen as a prestigious SECA awardee in 2019; SFMOMA has also acquired several of Mullen's works for its collection.

What is the Community Crisis Response Program (CCRP) and the ROCK Team?
CCRP is an alternative crisis mobile response program designed to address non-violent, non-medical, low-acuity calls. CCRP calls include:
• Providing a more appropriate and effective response to mental crisis situations
• Reducing ambulance use, EMS, and Law Enforcement for non-emergencies
• Providing mobile crisis services with appropriate services and support.
After gathering community input, the chosen name is **ROCK - Reach Out with Compassion and Kindness**. The logo will be placed on the front of a website page and the center of our mobile crisis response vans.

Contest Rules: Design a logo for the ROCK team:
• You **MUST** be a Richmond resident between the ages of 13-25.

Wage & Fringe Benefits \$20.13 to \$29.52 per hour to start, depending on location, as per IBEW/NECA Collective Bargaining Agreement (as of 3/1/2024), with periodic advancement. Medical & Retirement benefits are provided per the Collective Bargaining Agreement, based on hours worked.

Characteristics of the Trade Apprentice will typically be supervised by a Sound and Communication Installer/Technician at all times. The trade requires physical effort on the part of the Apprentice to do climbing, crawling, coiling, lifting, use motorized tools and electronic test equipment, and work in cramped quarters. Wiring is frequently color-coded for connecting purposes; therefore, the worker cannot be colorblind. Mechanical ability and finger dexterity are essential. Work may be performed indoors or outdoors in new and old construction environments.

Program Scope To achieve installer status, the 3-year Apprenticeship Agreement requires the Apprentice to complete 480 classroom hours of Related Supplemental Instruction, and 6,000 hours of On-The-Job training, through exposure to the following work processes: Project Planning and Initiation, Material Handling, Establishing OSHA and Customer Safety Requirements, Railway Installation, Pre-fab and Buildout, Wire and Cable Installation, Splicing and Termination, Component Installation, Firestopping, Testing/Commissioning, and Start-Up, Maintenance, and Service.

After making a qualified application, individuals who can show that they meet the conditions listed below will be afforded an oral interview by the JATC. Once interviewed, an applicant shall remain active on the Eligible Applicant List, subject to selection, for two (2) calendar years from the interview date.

Minimum Requirements & Qualifications for Applicants

- Must have a valid driver's license issued by the D.M.V., must be 17 years of age at the time of application, 18 years of age at the time of selection and registration.
- Complete an application form, accurately responding to all questions, including statements indicating you are:
 - Physically and mentally able to safely perform or learn to safely perform essential functions of the job.
 - Able to get to and from work at job sites as assigned.
 - Able and willing to attend all Related Supplemental Instruction, as required.
 - Able to climb and work from ladders, scaffolds, poles, and towers of various heights.
 - Able to crawl and work in cramped spaces such as attics, maintenance holes, and crawlspaces.
 - Able to read, hear and understand instructions and warnings.
- Show evidence of successful completion of one full year (2 semesters) of High School Algebra or one semester of College Elementary Algebra with a minimum grade of "C" or equivalent or provide evidence of having completed the Electrical Training ALLIANCE Tech Math Course. Available on-line at <http://www.electricaltrainingalliance.org/learn/online-course/math/>. Pre-Algebra does not meet this requirement.
- Must have one of the following: a high school diploma, a G.E.D., or a two-year Associate Degree or higher.
- Provide official ("sealed") transcript(s) for high school or post-high school education and training. G.E.D. records must be submitted, if applicable. All records and transcripts must be in English.
- If a Veteran, submit form DD-214 for possible consideration of applicable military training and experience.
- Score "4" or higher on the electrical trade's aptitude test developed and validated by the American Institutes for Research. The aptitude test includes reading comprehension and introductory algebra. See website for more information <http://www.electricaltrainingalliance.org/aptitudetest/>.
- Consent to Substance Abuse Screening.





Sludge Thickener CIP Project – Construction Update

The Water Recovery Division is in the finishing stages of a \$13million upgrade at the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP), upgrading the sludge thickening facility to better meet environmental standards. Construction is progressing and on schedule to be completed by the end of the year.



Sewer Lateral Grant Program

The City of Richmond's Water Resource Recovery Division administers the Sewer Lateral Grant Program. The program reimburses eligible homeowners in the Richmond Municipal Sewer District (RMSD No. 1) for some of the cost to replace their sewer lateral.


DO NOT POUR GREASE DOWN THE DRAIN! Grease continues to be a problem in the sanitary sewer system and the Richmond Wastewater Treatment Plant. Grease clogs pipes and can be detrimental to the function of the plant. It can also lead to sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs).
