### Night Bike Lane Closure for Scheduled Maintenance on Richmond – San Rafael Bridge along I-580

Caltrans is scheduled to close the bike lane on the Richmond-San Rafael Bridge (I-580) on Sunday, December 15 from 9:00 P.M. until 5:00 A.M. the following morning to perform sweeping and general maintenance work.

Shuttle services will be provided at the Stenmark Drive Bridge entrance and at Vista Point in San Rafael for those impacted by the closure.

Speed limit signs will be posted as 40 mph in construction areas.

## City Showcases Progress on Measure X Fuel Reduction Efforts

The City of Richmond is excited to share a new interactive map highlighting our ongoing efforts to reduce fire hazards on City-owned parcels through the Measure X Fuel Reduction Program. This initiative, supported by funding from Measure X, aims to enhance community safety by managing vegetation and mitigating fire risks across high-priority areas. The map provides a clear visual of parcels that have been completed, approved for treatment, or are currently under review, offering residents a transparent view of the program's progress.

Residents are encouraged to explore the map and learn more about the City's commitment to fire safety. ## **ALERT: Beware of East Bay Municipal Utility District agency imposters**

The East Bay Municipal Utility District (EBMUD) has received reports from customers who received visits at their homes by individuals pretending to be EBMUD representatives, saying they need to test their tap water. These are not EBMUD employees.

EBMUD wants you to know:

1. EBMUD maintenance employees will never ask to enter your home. EBMUD workers repairing pipelines in your neighborhood may knock on your door to notify you about work in the area but will never ask to enter your home.
2. EBMUD employees will schedule visits. Plumbing inspections, water conservation audits, or tap water tests are always pre-arranged with customers. If this visit is not scheduled or if you are suspicious, do not open the door.
3. EBMUD employees always carry identification with their name, photo and employee number visible. Many, but not all, are uniformed. All maintenance vehicles are marked with the EBMUD logo.
4. Your EBMUD drinking water quality surpassed every state and federal requirement that safeguards public health. See [//ebmud.com/waterquality](http://ebmud.com/waterquality) for more information.

EBMUD recommends the following actions:

1. If an EBMUD employee is at your door and asks to come in, ask to see their identification and ask them the purpose of the visit.
2. If you suspect an individual is impersonating a water worker, call EBMUD at 1-866-403-2683 to confirm their identity.









## Water Resource Recovery

### Sewer Lateral Grant Program

The City of Richmond's Water Resource Recovery Division administers the Sewer Lateral Grant Program. The program reimburses eligible homeowners in the Richmond Municipal Sewer District (RMSD No. 1) for some of the cost to replace their sewer lateral. The program will reimburse applicants up to \$1,800 of the cost of a full sewer line replacement.

The program is open and accepting applications for the Fiscal Year 2024-25 for sewer lateral work completed between 07/01/2024 – 06/30/2025.

## Fats Oils & Grease (FOG)


