

New Richmond City Council Meeting Hours

Beginning Tuesday, March 4, 2025:

- Open Session for public comment before Closed Session will begin at 3:30 PM
- Regular City Council meetings will begin at 5:00 PM

An earlier starting time should allow for more focused discussions, timely decision-making, and more inclusiveness of residents who are not able to attend late meetings.

This change will take place on a trial basis for six-months beginning with the March 4, 2025, meeting. The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) permits the facility to safely handle hazardous waste. Veolia Environmental Services is at 1125 Hensley Street in Richmond, CA 94801. We encourage you to complete and return the enclosed community survey. Your response will help us plan how to communicate about the permit renewal.

Our role

DTSC is a state agency that regulates the generation, storage, treatment, and disposal of hazardous waste. We also manage environmental investigations and cleanups. Our goal is to restore and protect the environment.

Background

The facility has been in operation since 1983 under different names. They take in waste like acids, pesticides, caustics, flammables, and oxidizers. They also receive soil with petroleum waste. The facility classifies, packs, and stores the waste for up to one year. They transfer the waste to a treatment or disposal facility. They recycle hazardous waste as a service to commercial businesses. This includes batteries, electronics, thermometers, and medications.

The operating permit is up for renewal every ten years. We issue a score for all facilities that have operating permits for hazardous waste. We review the facility's compliance history. The three tiers are acceptable, conditional, or unacceptable. For the past ten years, we issued a score of zero, which is the best score possible.

También reciben tierra con desechos de petróleo. La empresa clasifica, empaca y almacena los desechos por hasta un año. Transferen los desechos a una fábrica de tratamiento o disposición. Reciclan desperdicios peligrosos como un servicio para negocios comerciales. Esto incluye pilas, electrónicos, termómetros y medicamentos.

El permiso de operación debe renovarse cada diez años. Emítimos una puntuación para todas las empresas que tienen permisos de operación para desperdicios peligrosos. Revisamos el historial de cumplimiento de la empresa. Los tres niveles son aceptable, condicional o inaceptable. Durante los últimos diez años, les emitimos una puntuación de cero, que es la mejor puntuación posible.










Sewer Lateral Grant Program

The City of Richmond's Water Resource Recovery Division administers the Sewer Lateral Grant Program. The program reimburses eligible homeowners in the Richmond Municipal Sewer District (RMSD No. 1) for some of the cost to replace their sewer lateral.

The program is open and accepting applications for the Fiscal Year 2024-25 for sewer lateral work completed between 07/01/2024 – 06/30/2025.

As of 02/14/2025, 27 grants have been awarded

1. Pour cooled fats, oils and grease into a covered, disposable container and throw it into your garbage can. Never pour fats, oils or grease down sink drains or toilets. COOL IT, CAN IT, TRASH IT!
2. Soak up remaining oils and grease with an absorbent material such as paper towels, and throw it into your garbage can.
3. Before you wash dishes, scrape food scraps, fats, oils and grease into your garbage can.
4. Use sink strainers to catch any remaining food waste while washing dishes.
