Commissioners are appointed to a two-year term. The Planning Commission meets on the first and third Thursdays of each month at 6:30 P.M. Meetings are held in person at 440 Civic Center Plaza in Richmond. Applications are available on the City Clerk's website.

The City is looking to fill one vacancy on its Design Review Board (DRB). There is no deadline for applications, but applications will be reviewed on a first-come first-served basis.

To be eligible, you must live or work in the City of Richmond. Ideally, the City is looking for architects, persons from the business community, and experts in the design or construction industry. The City also encourages you to apply if you are not a design professional but have an eye for good architectural or urban design.

The DRB is a seven-member body that evaluates the design of residential, commercial, and industrial development projects to promote high-quality urban environments. Members are appointed to a two-year term.

The DRB meets on the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month at 6:00 PM. Meetings are held in person only at 440 Civic Center Plaza in Richmond. Applications are available on the City Clerk's website.

Apply for Richmond's Historic Preservation Commission!

The City is currently looking to fill two vacancies on its Historic Preservation Commission (HPC). There is no deadline for applications, but applications will be reviewed on a first-come first-served basis.

To be eligible, you must live or work in the city of Richmond and have a demonstrated interest, competence, or knowledge of historic preservation. Commissioners may include professionals in the disciplines of history, architecture, prehistoric and historic archaeology, folklore, cultural anthropology, conservation, urban planning, American studies, and cultural geography. Representatives from historic preservation organizations and building contractors are also encouraged to apply.

The HPC is a seven-member body that reviews major alterations to historic resources. The HPC also nominates properties for historic designation and conducts historic resource surveys and studies.

Commissioners are appointed to a four-year term. The HPC meets on the first Monday of each month at 5:30 P.M. Meetings are held in person only at 450 Civic Center Plaza in Richmond. Applications are available on the City Clerk's website.



Public Works

Abatement

In collaboration with Republic Services and Sims Metal, Abatement crews participated in the Iron Triangle/Atchison Village Neighborhoods Clean-up. Building Maintenance

Building Maintenance workers cleaned and removed debris from the inside and outer areas of 440 and 450 Civic Center Plaza. With assistance from the Richmond Youth Works workers, the crew cleaned the interior and exterior buildings of the Westside Library. Meanwhile, other crew members and Youth Workers removed debris from the front of the Richmond Recreation Complex. Staff also provided maintenance services for 27 City owned buildings.

Electricians replaced a swimsuit spin dryer at the Richmond Plunge. Crews responded to several traffic signal issues including Bayview and Carlson Blvd where the intersection wasn't servicing vehicles in some directions. Staff also addressed traffic signal issues at 7th Street and Pennsylvania Ave, 23rd Street and Barrett Ave and investigated vandalism of park lighting at Booker T. Anderson Park.

Stationary Engineers performed daily pool inspections and maintenance, performed daily inspections and maintenance of the boilers, circulating pumps and sump pumps at the Civic Center Plaza, repaired a shower handle in the women's locker room at the Plunge, repaired an overflowing toilet at the Police Substation on Valley View Road, replaced several relays to the A/C Intelipak units of the 440 and 450 Civic Center Plaza buildings, replaced the make-up water centrifugal pump to Boiler #5, replaced a hose bib at Parchester Community Center, and repaired the apparatus bay door to the Streets Division at the Corporation Yard.

Engineering

The Engineering Construction Inspector performed field inspection for the contractor Sonic, which placed drops for the homeowners on Bayview Ave for new internet connections.



Park Maintenance

The Parks General Fund crews collected litter at all city parks and public rights-of-way. They also carried out weed abatement activities at the Employment and Training parking lot, Castro Ranch Rd. medians, Clinton Ave. sound wall, Richmond Greenway from 10th St. and Harbour Way to 14th St. and Ohio Ave, West Richmond Ave to Castro St., Carlson Blvd medians from Broadway to Cutting Blvd. and S. 56th St. sound wall. Furthermore, Park crews undertook irrigation repairs at Kennedy Swim Center, and fence repairs at Nicholl Park. They also engaged in trash collection at Pt. Richmond, Bay Trail, and Richmond Greenway. The City Tree Crew removed city street trees on the S.55th St, S.56th St., and San Luis St. sound walls.

Marina District
