





Emergency Water Main Repair

East Bay Municipal Utility District responded to an emergency water main break at 328 S. 8th Street on May 1, 2025. Crews arrived at approximately 2:30 PM and replaced the damaged section of the water main. Repairs were completed by 9:00 PM, and the water service was restored.



Lincoln Safe Routes to School

The contractor BuildCorp (contractor) constructed speed humps and installed rectangular rapid flashing beacon safety features to improve visibility for cyclist and pedestrian users at the Richmond Greenway.



Blue Curb Policy Development

Public Works Engineering staff began developing a comprehensive policy and standards to evaluate and approve requests for on-street blue curb parking spaces that comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Public Works has contracted with firm Fehr & Peers to help with this work. The final policy is expected to be brought to the City Council for adoption in December 2025. (continued on the following page)

The policy will include an easy-to-understand application process for residents to request spaces; criteria that staff can use to evaluate and respond to applications; design standards for ADA-compliant spaces; an appeals process for denied requests; policies for re-application and removal; and recommendations on fees for ADA parking space requests or annual budget needs to support the policy. This will help residents more easily understand how to request accessible on-street parking spaces in front of their homes, help Public Works staff provide better customer service, and install accessible parking spaces.

Exciting Improvements Underway at Shields-Reid Park

Construction at Shields-Reid Park now includes new landscaping around the Shields-Reid Community Center. Existing vegetation has been cleared to allow for soil improvement and the installation of an efficient irrigation system. Plants will be installed by Civicorps, a local nonprofit that provides valuable job training to young adults. Progress is also being made on several key features, including a new stage, prepping for rubberized play surfacing, and connecting utilities to the brand-new restroom facility. In addition, the project team met with local artists to incorporate public art into the park's design. These enhancements aim to make Shields-Reid Park a more welcoming, vibrant space for everyone in the community.





Sewer Lateral Grant Program

The City of Richmond's Water Resource Recovery Division administers the Sewer Lateral Grant Program. The program reimburses eligible homeowners in the Richmond Municipal Sewer District (RMSD No. 1) for some of the cost to replace their sewer lateral.

The program is open and accepting applications for the Fiscal Year 2024-25 for sewer lateral work completed between July 1, 2024 - June 30, 2025.


- **As of May 9, 2025, 52 grants have been awarded.**

DO NOT POUR GREASE DOWN THE DRAIN! Grease continues to be a problem in the sanitary sewer system and the Richmond Wastewater Treatment Plant. Grease clogs pipes and can be detrimental to the function of the plant. It can also lead to sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs).
