





### Sewer Lateral Grant Program

The City of Richmond's Water Resource Recovery Division administers the Sewer Lateral Grant Program. The program reimburses eligible homeowners in the Richmond Municipal Sewer District (RMSD No. 1) for some of the cost to replace their sewer lateral.

The program is open and accepting applications for the Fiscal Year 2024-25 for sewer lateral work completed between July 1, 2024 - June 30, 2025.

- **As of May 16, 2025, 54 grants have been awarded.**

The program will reimburse applicants up to \$1,800 of the cost of a full sewer line replacement. # Waste Water Capital Improvement Projects

## **FY 2024-25 Grade 5 RAA Line Replacement –**

- Phase I of this project replaces approximately 30 pipelines totaling 11,000 linear feet and adds manholes to improve access for future maintenance. Work includes pipe bursting or open cut replacement of deteriorated sewer segments, pre- and post-construction CCTV, and final as-built drawings.
- Contractor completed paving restoration on B Street and replaced the Yuba Street easement line. Additional line segments will be addressed in the coming months.

## **Cutting Blvd/Harbour Way South Wet Weather Improvement Project –**

- City Staff hosted interviews on April 25, 2025.
- Contract is scheduled to be awarded at the June 3, 2025, City Council meeting.

## **Keller Beach Sewer Line Feasibility Study –**

- Interviews with three consultants were held on April 30, 2025.
- Contract is scheduled to be awarded at the June 3, 2025, City Council Meeting.

## **Dornan Drive Tunnel Sewer Line Restoration –**

- The failed force main in the Point Richmond tunnel has been rehabilitated with an epoxy liner. Tie-ins to the upstream force main and downstream manhole have been completed, and the temporary bypass has been removed.
- Remaining work includes surface restoration and manhole rehabilitation.

## **FY 2024-25 Sewer Line Replacement Program (multiple locations) –**

- Additional sewer lines have been added to comply with Baykeeper Settlement Agreement requirements.
- City staff will request additional funding at the June 3, 2025, City Council Meeting.


## **Influent Pump Station Slide Gate Replacement Project –**

- All slide gates at the plant's influent pump station are inoperable and being replaced. Contractor successfully bypassed the pump station, completed extensive wet well cleaning, and performed field verification with the gate manufacturer to fabricate new slide gates.
