Bike to Wherever Day


May 15, 2025 was Bike to Wherever Day, an event that celebrates bicycles as a fun and healthy way to get to work, school, do errands, visit friends and family, and get exercise. Public Works Engineering staff volunteered at the Richmond Bike to Wherever Day Energizer Station at Richmond BART, handing out snacks to people riding bicycles or scooters to BART. This year, 450 people rode bicycles or scooters to one of the six Bike to Wherever Day stations in Richmond. There were a record number of participants in West Contra Costa County, with 991 people counted bicycling at 13 stations in Richmond, El Cerrito, El Sobrante, Pinole, and San Pablo.



Lincoln Safe Routes to School

The City's Contractor, BuildCorp, installed visibility enhancements at crosswalks and intersections as part of the Lincoln Elementary Safe Routes to School Improvement.

- Enhancement included raised crossings (speed table), upgraded signage, and installation of flashing beacons to improve pedestrian and bicycle safety. The improvements are located at the intersections of 4th Street and the Richmond Greenway, and 4th Street and Chanslor Avenue.

Point Molate Bay Trail Bids

The City has partnered with the East Bay Regional Park District to lead the Point Molate Bay Trail project which traverses through various public and private lands. This project constructs a 2.5-mile-long trail segment which follows the bay from Point Molate Beach Park and Stenmark Drive south to the Richmond San Rafael Bridge. It will be a multi-use, all-weather, ADA-compliant trail that will provide new public access to the shoreline of the City of Richmond's 413-acre Point Molate property. It features spectacular views of Mt. Tamalpais, East Brother Light Station, and beyond. With the bid process complete, we look forward to beginning construction of the trail soon.

1. Pour cooled fats, oils and grease into a covered, disposable container and throw it into your garbage can. Never pour fats, oils or grease down sink drains or toilets. COOL IT, CAN IT, TRASH IT.™
2. Soak up remaining oils and grease with an absorbent material such as paper towels, and throw it into your garbage can.
3. Before you wash dishes, scrape food scraps, fats, oils and grease into your garbage can.
4. Use sink strainers to catch any remaining food waste while washing dishes.
