


In an effort to stay connected with the business community and offer ongoing support, the City's Business Development Division visited businesses near 23rd Street corner Garvin.





## Recap: Wildfire Safety and Preparedness Open House at Fire Station 63

On Saturday, May 17, 2025, the Richmond Fire Department teamed up with the West Contra Costa Fire Safe Council (WCCFSC) to bring the annual Wildfire Safety and Preparedness Open House event to Richmond residents, this time being held at Fire Station 63.

May is National Wildfire Awareness month and this event focused on enhancing awareness among Richmond residents – especially those living in the wildland urban interface (WUI) – about the risks of wildfires, mitigation efforts they could take and what to know about the resources provided by local partner agencies related to wildfire preparedness. In collaboration with WCCFSC, some of the partner agencies in attendance at Fire Station 63 included: PG&E, East Bay Municipal Utilities District (EBMUD), East Bay Regional Parks – Fire Department, Contra Costa Fire District – Measure X, Contra Costa County OES – Community Warning System, UC Master Gardeners, Bringing Back the Natives, United Policy Holders, among others.

Ahead of the upcoming wildfire season, much could be done individually and as a community to stay prepared and become more knowledgeable about the risks of wildfires in our vicinity. The Richmond Fire Department would like to thank WCCFSC for their continued partnership and dedication to connecting residents to resources and serving as a catalyst for promoting preparedness in West Contra Costa.



## Recap: Congratulations to our new Richmond CERT volunteers!

On Saturday, May 17, 2025, the Spring 2025 Richmond CERT Academy cohort officially concluded their 10-week commitment with a Final Drill and graduation of 35 new Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) volunteers.

In the event of a major emergency or disaster, CERT volunteers are there to provide assistance with basic life-saving skills to individuals in need. CERTs serve as a support structure to first responders who, depending on the severity of the situation, may not be able to arrive to the scene on time to assist and/or provide urgent medical aid. CERTs are taught basic skills that include suppression of small fires, identification and treatment of wounds, use of emergency radios, among other critical skills.

The Final Drill and graduation took place at the Richmond Fire Training Center and was carried out jointly with the San Pablo CERT cohort. The Fire Department through the Office of Emergency Services applauds the courage, commitment and willingness of all our new CERTs to making Richmond a more resilient community and enhancing our overall preparedness capabilities.


