Richmond Minimum Wage

Effective January 1, 2026

\$19.18 Per Hour

The minimum wage requirement set forth in the Richmond Minimum Wage Ordinance 11-14 N.S., codified in Richmond Municipal Code Chapter 7.108, applies to adult and minor employees who work two (2) or more hours a week for a covered Employer. Each year, the City will adjust the minimum wage as stated in the Minimum Wage Ordinance until January 1, 2019, when it will increase to \$15 per hour. However, beginning on January 1, 2020 and each year thereafter, the minimum wage shall increase by an amount corresponding to the prior year's increase according to the Department of Labor's Regional Consumer Price Index.

Under the Ordinance, employees who assert their rights to receive the City's minimum wage are protected from retaliation. Employees may file a civil lawsuit against their employers for any violation of the Ordinance or may file a complaint with the Employment and Training Department. The City will investigate possible violations, will have access to payroll records, and will enforce violations of the minimum wage requirements.

The City Council amended the ordinance in July 2017 and eliminated certain exemptions relating to intermediate wages, small businesses, government grants and businesses that deliver goods and services outside of Richmond. The amended ordinance is available online at www.richmondworks.org.







2025 Paving Project Update – Rubberized Cape Seal

Status: 7% Construction Complete

Crews are currently working in East Richmond performing 6-inch road base repairs as part of Phase 1 of the City's 2025 Paving Project – Rubberized Cape Seal. This first phase focuses on repairing damaged pavement areas ("dig outs") to prepare streets for the final surface treatment (Phase 2) coming Spring 2026.

Residents are reminded to stay alert for "No Parking" signs in active work areas as crews continue moving through Richmond performing these repairs. Access for emergency vehicles and people with disabilities will always be maintained.

Similar to traditional Mill & Fill overlays, these dig out base repairs provide a new asphalt layer that restores ride quality, seals the surface, and strengthens the roadway structure. This treatment extends pavement life by 5 to 15 years, and when combined with additional resurfacing methods, it can last 10 to 20 years before major rehabilitation is needed.







Is your sink draining slowly? Is water backing up into your bathtub? Are you having trouble flushing your toilet(s)?

Before you call a plumber, call the City's operator, VEOLIA WATER, at (510) 412-2001. They will come out to your home or business to ensure there is no issue with the City's sanitary sewer mainline.

There is no charge for this service. This service is available 24-hours/day, 365 days/year.



Sewer Lateral Grant Program

The City of Richmond's Water Resource Recovery Division administers the Sewer Lateral Grant Program. The program reimburses eligible homeowners in the Richmond Municipal Sewer District (RMSD No. 1) for some of the cost to replace their sewer lateral.

Before you have your sanitary sewer lateral replaced, **we strongly encourage you to obtain more than one bid**. You can find more information on our website:



Fats Oils & Grease (FOG)

DO NOT POUR GREASE DOWN THE DRAIN! Grease continues to be a problem in the sanitary sewer system and the Richmond Wastewater Treatment Plant. Grease clogs pipes and can be detrimental to the function of the plant. It can also lead to sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs).

To help residents with our "From the Pan to the Can" campaign, we will be giving out free samples of "Fry-Away" (see sample photo). This is a powder packet that, when mixed with oil, solidifies the used oil into a solid that can then be easily disposed of in waste receptacles instead of down the drain.

These packets will be available at the Public Works Counter at Richmond City Hall (450 Civic Center Plaza, second floor) for distribution. Please stop by and get your free sample and grease scraper today.

Veolia staff, working at the Richmond Wastewater Treatment Plant, located at 601 Canal Blvd, will be doing capital improvements to Richmond's Influent Pump Station for the next month.

Veolia wants to notify our neighbors that this construction will intermittently bypass flow around our Influent pump station and this could generate a risk of odors as we manipulate flows at the plant. We will have every odor control system at the site and in the collection system online and we will have protocols/staff in place to continue monitoring the flow and odors throughout the week and including the weekend.

Veolia staff and City of Richmond officials are monitoring the planning for this work as well looking for optimal weather conditions. If neighbors notice any odors during this time, we ask them to notify us at 510-412-2001 as soon as possible.

We are working to complete this activity as quickly as possible and are working to minimize the impacts to the community. We will update you if there are any changes to this work plan that may have been impossible to foresee. Our goal is to complete this project with as little disruption as possible, and we are committed to working with the City and our neighbors to reach this goal.
