

OFFICIAL NOTICE Richmond Minimum Wage

Effective January 1, 2026

\$19.18 Per Hour

The minimum wage requirement set forth in the Richmond Minimum Wage Ordinance 11-14 N.S., codified in Richmond Municipal Code Chapter 7.108, applies to adult and minor employees who work two (2) or more hours a week for a covered Employer. Each year, the City will adjust the minimum wage as stated in the Minimum Wage Ordinance until January 1, 2019, when it will increase to \$15 per hour. However, beginning on January 1, 2020 and each year thereafter, the minimum wage shall increase by an amount corresponding to the prior year’s increase according to the Department of Labor’s Regional Consumer Price Index.

Under the Ordinance, employees who assert their rights to receive the City’s minimum wage are protected from retaliation. Employees may file a civil lawsuit against their employers for any violation of the Ordinance or may file a complaint with the Employment and Training Department. The City will investigate possible violations, will have access to payroll records, and will enforce violations of the minimum wage requirements.

The City Council amended the ordinance in July 2017 and eliminated certain exemptions relating to intermediate wages, small businesses, government grants and businesses that deliver goods and services outside of Richmond. The amended ordinance is available online at www.richmondworks.org.

Reliance upon this notice does not provide safe harbor to employers who otherwise violate the City’s minimum wage ordinance. If you have any questions or suspect violations of the City’s minimum wage ordinance, please contact Employment and Training Department.





Automated Transit Network Feasibility Study

The City of Richmond is preparing to launch a study to determine if an Automated Transit Network (ATN) is the right solution to improve mobility in and around the City. The City is working to address a unique set of transportation challenges shaped by its location, existing roadway network, transit network, and diverse community.

Although Richmond is served by six transit operators: BART, Amtrak/Capitol Corridor, AC Transit, WestCAT, Golden Gate Transit, and the San Francisco Bay Ferry – limited connections between and to these services can make traveling across the city and region difficult.

To help solve these challenges, the City is exploring the idea of this modern system to fill service gaps and make it easier for people to connect to transit. Your feedback will help us identify community priorities and identify potential solutions. The public poll is expected to be available for feedback in early December.

Traffic Calming Program

The City's contractor, Saint Francis Electric, is preparing updated striping and other improvements at two of the remaining four sites included in the traffic-calming package of 18 locations. Construction is expected to begin soon and be completed in December 2025.

At 15th Street and Macdonald Avenue, Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons will be installed on all four sides of the intersection to improve visibility for people walking and bicycling. Striping upgrades will also be completed.

At 37th Street and Wall Avenue, crews will install upgraded crosswalks, bike lane striping, and median infrastructure to support safer alignment and enhance visibility.





Influent Pump Station Slide Gate Replacement Project

Located at: 601 Canal Blvd (Wastewater Treatment Plant)

- None of the existing slide gates are operable, as they are likely original from the 1950s and have exceeded their useful life.
- The pump station has four influent pumps, each with a slide gate to isolate the pump for removal and maintenance.
- Without functioning slide gates, it is impossible to safely remove pumps for maintenance.
- Without these pumps, the City would be unable to process wastewater from the community.
- This project includes installation of new slide gates and actuators.




Cutting Boulevard & Harbour Way South Sanitary Sewer Relief

- This project was born out of a sanitary sewer capacity issue.
- The corridor within Cutting Boulevard between South 23rd Street and Harbour Way South has been problematic resulting in sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs) due to insufficient capacity.
- This project is meant to provide relief to the existing infrastructure and potentially mitigate SSOs in the area.
- The relief sewer will divert surcharged flow at upstream manholes during peak wet weather flow events.
- The project replaces approximately 3,700 linear feet of new 30-inch diameter relief sewer within Cutting Boulevard installed via open cut trench
- The contractor has completed approximately 500 linear feet of the estimated 3,700 linear feet of the project, which is roughly 14% of the project.





Keller Beach Feasibility Study

- Property owners from the Point Richmond neighborhood attended a community outreach meeting hosted by City staff, consultants Kearns and West, and BKF Engineering.
- The purpose of the meeting was to provide information on the Keller Beach Sanitary Sewer Line Feasibility Study and discuss potential interim and long-term options for the area.
- The meeting was well attended and offered an opportunity for community members, including engineers and environmental specialists, to share valuable feedback and express their concerns.

Next Steps:

- Technical Community Meeting:
 - A follow-up meeting focusing on technical information will be scheduled.
 - Kearns and West (City consultant) will coordinate the timing and prepare the agenda. Date to be determined.
- Community Workshop:
 - Kearns and West will host another public workshop in January 2026 to share design progress and gather additional community input.
 - Invitations will be mailed to all Point Richmond residents. (Date to be determined)

 - This joint training supports the City's compliance with waste discharge requirements and strengthens our coordinated response capabilities during wastewater emergencies.
- California Water Environment Association News:
 - The Pretreatment, Pollution Prevention, and Stormwater (P3S) Committee has released its new grant application, offering up to \$6,000 for projects that advance pollution prevention, pretreatment, and stormwater (P3S) initiatives, support environmental protection, and engage or educate the public—especially youth—in environmental stewardship.
 - Applications are due December 12, 2025, and staff are encouraging local partners and schools to apply.

This service is free and available 24/7, year-round.



Sewer Lateral Grant Program

The City of Richmond's Water Resource Recovery Division administers the Sewer Lateral Grant Program. The program reimburses eligible homeowners in the Richmond Municipal Sewer District (RMSD No. 1) for some of the cost to replace their sewer lateral.

Before you have your sanitary sewer lateral replaced, we strongly encourage you to obtain more than one bid. You can find more information on our website:



Fats, Oils & Grease (FOG)

DO NOT POUR GREASE DOWN THE DRAIN! Grease continues to be a problem in the sanitary sewer system and at the Richmond Wastewater Treatment Plant. Grease clogs pipes and can be detrimental to the function of the plant. It can also lead to sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs).
