**1. Meeting Notes**

### 3. Point Molate Community Visioning

Point Molate is located on the San Pablo Peninsula approximately 1.5 miles north of the Richmond-San Rafael Bridge. Beginning in 1942, Point Molate served as a U.S. Navy fuel storage and transfer facility covering approximately 413 acres. This Navy Base was officially closed on September 30, 1998, with the property then transferred to the City pursuant to the federal Base Realignment and Closure Act of 1990.

The City of Richmond is seeking community input about how to best use the land at Point Molate for the benefit of all. Over the next three months, the community will be welcome to provide input at three community workshops.

The first of these community workshops is on Saturday, June 23<sup>rd</sup>, where you can join your neighbors at the Point Molate Community Visioning Workshop and Site Tour to better understand site assets, issues and constraints and help develop a land use plan for Point Molate. 



### **Point Molate Visión Comunitaria**

Point Molate está ubicado en la península de San Pablo aproximadamente a 1.5 millas al norte del puente Richmond-San Rafael. A partir de 1942, Point Molate sirvió como una instalación de almacenamiento y transferencia de combustible de la Marina de EE. UU. Que abarca aproximadamente 413 acres. Esta Base Naval se cerró oficialmente el 30 de septiembre de 1998, y la propiedad se transfirió a la Ciudad de conformidad con la Ley federal de realineación y cierre de bases de 1990 (Base Realignment and Closure Act of 1990).

La Ciudad de Richmond está buscando opiniones de la comunidad sobre cómo usar mejor la propiedad de Point Molate para el beneficio de todos. Durante los próximos tres meses, la comunidad será bienvenida para proporcionar sus opiniones en tres talleres comunitarios.

## 5. City Manager Chronicles

I have listed below some of the topics for meetings that I attended during the past week in the hope that it provides an idea of the varied issues with which our organization deals routinely.

Meetings and events of note during the past week included:

- Met with staff from the Planning and Building Services Department (Director Richard Mitchell and Planning Manager Lina Velasco), and the City Attorney's Office (City Attorney Bruce Goodmiller and Deputy City Attorney Rachel Sommovilla) to discuss community workshops for the Pt. Molate area;
- Attended the meeting of the Richmond Housing Authority Housing Advisory Commission;
- Participated in a conference call with US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) staff to discuss the status of the Richmond Housing Authority recovery agreement, along with Senior Assistant City Attorney Carlos Privat, Finance Director Belinda Warner, and Housing Authority consultant Jon Gresley;
- Met with Capital Improvements Project Director Yader Bermudez, Senior Engineer Tawfic Halaby, and Planning Manager Lina Velasco to discuss potential additional sources of funds for the Yellow Brick Road project;
- Attended the community budget meeting hosted by the Richmond Finance Department (see item [6] below);
- Met with the Finance Department budget team to finalize proposals for closing the operating budget gap;
- Participated in a conference call with representatives from the John Stewart Company, along with Senior Assistant City Attorney Carlos Privat, Finance Director Belinda Warner, and Development Project Manager Charice Duckworth to discuss the financial closeout of the Triangle Court RAD project;
- Attended the Oakland Symphony July 3<sup>rd</sup> Concert donor recognition;
- Attended the monthly meeting of the Contra Costa city managers, together with Senior Management Analyst LaShonda White;
- Attended the annual crime-free housing breakfast, organized by Crime Prevention Specialist Michelle Milam.

These meetings were in addition to attending the regular management staff meeting, agenda planning, reviewing staff reports to the City Council, doing department head "check-ins," having discussions on various personnel matters, and having short discussions with staff, community members, members of the press, etc.

## **6. FY2018-19 Budget Development**

This past week, the Finance Department hosted a community budget meeting at which attendees received a presentation on the City's budget process, financial

trends, the current state of the City's budget, and participated in a question and answer session. The presentation was made by Budget Administrator Markisha Guillory, and was attended by the Finance staff budget team, and by Councilmember Ben Choi. Staff is compiling comments and suggestions into a report that will be transmitted to the City Council.


## **7. Final Paving Begins for Sewer Replacement Project on South 23rd Street**

The first phase of final paving is underway for the sewer replacement project on South 23<sup>rd</sup> Street between Ohio Avenue and Cutting Boulevard. Excavation of the temporary subgrade in the trench and backfilling will be completed by next Tuesday, June 19<sup>th</sup>, during daytime hours.

This will be followed by the second phase: scheduling night time work for the rubberized asphalt paving. At this time, phase two is planned to start the week of June 25<sup>th</sup>. This work has to be completed at night due to the batch asphalt plant only producing rubberized asphalt during these hours. Night time paving is expected to last 1-2 nights. Final striping will follow the final paving.

#### **8. San Pablo Avenue Complete Streets Project: Construction Continues On Schedule**

The San Pablo Avenue Complete Streets Project is a federally funded corridor enhancement project that focuses on multimodal access, safety and connection along San Pablo Avenue between Rumrill Boulevard and La Puerta Road. The project is a partnership between the cities of San Pablo and Richmond, with major funding (\$5.978 million) from a One Bay Area Grant (OBAG). The City of San Pablo is the lead agency for the project.

The project includes installation of new traffic signals at La Puerta Road and Robert Miller Drive, and installation of sidewalk, bicycle facilities, crosswalks, and lighting improvements along San Pablo Avenue from Rivers Street to La Puerta Road.

Key elements of the project include:

- Modification of the existing road section to add Class 2 bike lanes in both directions of travel;
- Sidewalk installation on the west side of San Pablo Avenue from Rivers Street to La Puerta Road (southbound), and from Rivers Street to Lancaster Drive on the east side (northbound);
- Removal of an existing slip lane into Robert H. Miller Drive and replacement of a right turn pocket;

- Installation of a new traffic signal at La Puerta Road;
- Modification of existing traffic signals at Rivers Street and Robert H. Miller Drive;
- Construction of soil nail and concrete retaining walls to allow the roadway to be widened sufficiently to accommodate the new facilities for non-motorized roadway use;

San Pablo Avenue will remain open to traffic in both directions at all times; however, for safety reasons, there will be times during construction when only one travel lane in each direction is available for vehicular traffic.

This week, the contractor finished paving the old median island between Lancaster Drive and Robert Miller Drive, and placed k-rail barriers along a portion of the northbound travel direction to prepare for construction of a soil nail wall along the hillside.

## **10. International Student Programs – Summer Excursion to China**

This coming July, 169 high school students from Richmond and surrounding communities will be travelling to China as part of on C Student Ambassador Program sponsored by West Contra Costa Unified School District (WCCUSD) and members of the Richmond-Zhoushan Sister City Commission. In addition, 34 WCCUSD teachers will be attending as chaperones.

The goal of the experience is for students to broaden their global perspectives and participate in cross-cultural exchange. This trip builds on a successful exchange trip to China by De Anza students this past April over Spring Break. Students who attended the Spring Break program reported that it was an “amazing” and “life changing” experience, and many of those students are now returning for the summer program as student leaders.

During the summer program, WCCUSD students will visit various Chinese cultural landmarks, including the Great Wall and Tiananmen Square. Contra Costa College is also part of this collaboration and is sending an instructor so that students can receive college credit for this cross-cultural learning opportunity.

Like the Spring Break trip, this summer program in China is available to all eligible students, regardless of income or ability to contribute to the cost. The program builds on other cultural exchange programs initiated through WCCUSD and our Richmond Zhoushan-Sister City Commission, such as a new Richmond-Zhoushan teacher exchange program.








St. Cornelius School Visit

Stationary Engineers performed routine pool tests, repaired front doors at the Bayview Library, repaired the ice maker at the Corporation Yard, repaired staff lockers in the Auditorium, repaired/replaced locks on Police Department lockers, installed a post for banners at the Arts Center, replaced a utility sink at the Nevin Community Center, replaced a shut-off valve an outside toilet at Sheilds-Reid, cleared a clogged toilet at the Police Department jail, cleared the main sewer back up for the Police Department, checked and replaced furnace filters at the Nevin Community Center, and replaced the water heater at the Fire Training Center.



On the page, you can also look up information on a parcel, see permits issued and look up business license information. If you have a current business license you can pay to renew it online with a credit card.
