2. **Upcoming Events**

PG&E Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) and Fire Season

Currently, we are in the midst of fire season until November 2019. To prevent potential wildland fires such as 2018's Camp Fire in Butte County and the 2017 Northern California Wine Country Fires, Pacific Gas & Electric Company (PG&E) is educating the public on the potential for Public Safety Power Shutoffs.

What is a Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS)?

As part of PG&E's Community Wildfire Safety Program, PSPS are precautionary measures to help reduce the risk of wildfires. If gusty winds and dry conditions, combined with a heightened fire risk, threaten a portion of the electric system service our community, it may be necessary for PG&E to turn off electricity in the interest of public safety.

Criteria for determining a public safety power shutoff:

While no single factor will drive a Public Safety Power Shutoff, some factors include:

 <p>A RED FLAG WARNING declared by the National Weather Service</p>	 <p>LOW HUMIDITY LEVELS generally 20% and below</p>
 <p>FORECASTED SUSTAINED WINDS GENERALLY ABOVE 25 MPH AND WIND GUSTS IN EXCESS OF APPROXIMATELY 45 MPH, depending on location and site-specific conditions such as temperature, terrain and local climate</p>	
 <p>CONDITION OF DRY FUEL on the ground and live vegetation (moisture content)</p>	 <p>ON-THE-GROUND, REAL-TIME OBSERVATIONS from PG&E's WSOC and field observations from PG&E crews</p>

When the above criteria are met, PG&E will provide notification to power customers of a power shutoff:

- Forty-eight (48) hours prior to shut-off.
- Twenty-four (24) hours prior to the event
- One-hour (1) hour prior to a power shutoff event.

The reason for multiple notifications is due to rapidly changing conditions that may change the location of a power shutoff event.

How do you prepare for a PSPS?

California energy companies created a website our community can visit to learn how to prepare for power shutoffs, visit: [PrepareforPowerDown website](#) in which information is available in English, Spanish, Chinese, Vietnamese and Korean.

Preparedness steps include:

- Update your contact information with PG&E (pge.com/mywildfirealerts or call 1-866-743-6589)
- Plan for any medical needs
- Keep a hard copy of emergency phone numbers on hand
- Know how to manually open your garage door
- Build or restock your emergency kit
- Ensure any backup generators are ready to safely operate
- Designate an emergency meeting location
- Consider stay with a friend or relative, if necessary, during an outage.





Consider Voting By Mail

The Contra Costa County Elections Division is reaching out to voters who are currently registered as polling place voters. They are encouraging voters to consider the merits of requesting their ballot at home, as this may be a more convenient option for you. Part of the reason they are reaching out is that there is a new state law that took effect beginning this year that no longer requires postage for return ballot envelopes. Contra Costa County also has close to 40 ballot drop off boxes available countywide, including a dozen that will be available on a 24/7 basis. A permanent ballot drop off box will be located at Richmond City Hall - 450 Civic Center Plaza nearest the City Council Chambers parking lot.

Receiving your ballot by mail provides individuals with more flexibility than having to go to your set neighborhood polling place on just one day. It also allows individuals

to vote comfortably wherever they choose and gives them more time to study the issues on increasingly-complex ballots at their leisure. There are a variety of ways to return a completed ballot envelope, including dropping it off at neighborhood polling place on Election Day.

Please include your Name, Date of Birth, Residential Address and Mailing Address in the body of the email. You can also call the Contra Costa County Elections Division at (925) 335-7800 to make your request over the phone.

5. **City Manager's Chronicles**

In last week's edition, I described the City's need to reorganize itself and noted that the matter would be heard by the City Council at its Tuesday meeting. Well, the Council *did* hear the item and largely encouraged the City Manager's Office to go ahead with the plan as drafted and consolidate the city's organization into eight departments. The support from the City Council for the program was gratifying, as has been the support from management and union leaders. So now the work begins!

As a starting point, we'll need eight department heads. Some of those positions, namely Police, Fire, Information Technology, are already occupied. Five other department head positions, however, are not and will need appointments. To fill those jobs, the City will conduct an internal recruitment wherein any employee can apply. The final selection will be made by the City Manager.

The positions that will be open in the internal recruitment are:

- Deputy City Manager for Economic Development
- Deputy City Manager for Internal Services
- Director of Library and Community Services
- Director of Public Works
- Community Development Director

The recruitment will open next Wednesday, October 30th and close on Thursday, November 14th. Employees interested in applying must complete an **Internal Job**

Application Form which is available from Donna Newton in the Human Resources Department. Interviews for the positions will take place in late November, with the goal to announce appointments before the year-end holidays.

City of Richmond and Gotcha Mobility announce Richmond's First Bike Share Program

With support from Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) funds, the City of Richmond's Transportation Division and Gotcha Mobility will launch the first public bike share system in Richmond. Bike share is a service that provides bicycles for short term-use for a fee. Richmond residents and visitors will have access to 250 electric assist bikes at 25 stations within the city, available for 24/7 use.

Launching later this year, the bike share system in Richmond will provide a seamless addition to the local and regional transportation network connecting residents, businesses, visitors to jobs, services, and the community. Bike share will enhance public access to destinations; expand mobility options for low income residents, especially with the provision of subsidized memberships for income-eligible residents; improve public health through increased physical activity and reduced greenhouse gas emissions and other pollutants; and support community growth through safer, more vibrant streets.

Gotcha Mobility is a mobility-as-a-service (MaaS) company offering sustainable micro-transit products –100% electric ride share, bike share, electric scooters, and trikes. Gotcha helps communities lead happier, more productive lives through alternative forms of transportation and is committed to being the City of Richmond's mobility partner. The Richmond Area Community Based Transportation Plan (CBTP) is an opportunity to improve transportation options and quality of life for neighborhoods in parts of Richmond, San Pablo, and El Cerrito.

The Plan will bring residents, community organizations and transportation agencies together to identify transportation challenges and develop workable solutions. The CBTP will evaluate transportation gaps and barriers identified by the community, develop solutions & projects to address challenges, and identify possible funding sources to pay for these solutions & projects.

RAPID (R-Transit with Lyft) Workshop

The City of Richmond's R-Transit program provides safe and reliable transportation to persons with disabilities and seniors (age 55 and older).

Service area: Program registrants can travel to any destination between the cities of Richmond, El Sobrante, San Pablo, North Richmond, Kensington, and Pinole. The cost of a one-way trip booked in advance is \$4.00, and same-day reservations are \$5.00 one way.

To qualify for R-Transit, applicants must meet two eligibility requirements:

1. Residency: applicant must be a resident of any of the following cities: Richmond, Kensington, El Sobrante, unincorporated communities of East Richmond Heights, Hasford Heights, Rollingwood, or North Richmond.
2. Age/disability: applicant is age 55 or older OR between the ages of 18-54 and has a disability.

RAPID: R-Transit with Lyft offers R-Transit clients a subsidy to use Lyft in the service area.

The R-Transit program's newest addition, RAPID, offers R-Transit clients a subsidy to use Lyft (24/7) for on demand trips in the R-Transit service area. RAPID also offers a subsidy to travel to and from the Contra Costa Regional Medical Center and Veterans hospital in Martinez, CA. R-Transit clients pay the first \$3.00 of each one way trip in the service area, and the subsidy will cover the next \$17.00 of the trip. If the total cost of the trip exceeds \$20.00, the client is responsible for the overage.

To use the RAPID service, you must first [complete an application for R-Transit service](#); have a smart phone, credit/debit card, and a registration and waiver of liability form on file.

R-Transit will host RAPID workshops the 3rd Monday of each month for the remainder of 2019. Workshops will be held at the Richmond Senior Center located at 2525 Macdonald Avenue, Richmond from 9:00 A.M. to 12:00 NOON. The workshops will provide in depth information about the new service and one-on-one assistance with downloading the Lyft mobile application, setting up an account, and requesting rides.




Residential Permit Parking Available

The Neighborhood Permit Parking (NPP) program was created in Richmond to reduce traffic in residential areas, to protect those areas from the environmental impacts of commuting, and to allow parking access to properties. Non-permit holders may continue to park daily on a time restricted basis within the NPP areas.

Emergency Operations Shelter Training

Over the past several months, Richmond Fire Emergency Services Manager Genevieve Pastor-Cohen has been coordinating emergency shelter training for Community Services Department staff. This training is a necessary component to ensure that the city is operationally ready to respond to disasters.

On Friday, October 18, 2019, American Red Cross staff conducted a shelter management exercise with 22 Community Service Department (CSD) staff members. The training was designed to simulate the experience of opening an emergency shelter in conjunction with the Red Cross. Activities included:

- Meeting American Red Cross volunteers and discussing strategies for successful shelter opening
- Conducting a facility survey to assess the condition of the facility
- Setting up, operating and demobilizing a dormitory, registration area, and information/feeding techniques station.

Red Cross volunteers assisted and coached CSD staff throughout each step of the sheltering exercise. We extend our appreciation to the Red Cross team: Patricia Nichols, Peter Liddell and volunteers.

Over the past year, the Red Cross has provided three additional training sessions on sheltering, including Shelter Workers, Shelter Management & Operations, and the hands-on shelter management exercise.

Ranjanah Maharaj, CSD Manager, Patricia Nichols, Red Cross, and Genevieve Pastor-Cohen, Richmond Fire Office of Emergency Services Manager, will be convening to develop a shelter plan for each of the 6 designated Richmond shelter locations.







It's an integrated system that sends alerts and information during large fires, chemical accidents, and earthquakes. You can sign up for voice, text, or email notifications. To sign up, visit www.cococws.us and click register. It only takes a few seconds and will deliver time-sensitive and potentially life-saving information.

An Integrated System for all Emergencies



LARGE FIRES

In the event of a large fire, emergency crews can use the Community Warning System to communicate with each other, with the public, with county officials, and with members of the media to keep everyone informed.



CHEMICAL ACCIDENTS

During a chemical accident, the Community Warning System is used to notify emergency centers throughout the county. The system simultaneously notifies emergency crews, the media and local schools and hospitals. Safety sirens near the accident site are also activated to immediately warn local residents to "Shelter, Shut & Listen."



EARTH QUAKES

After an earthquake, the Community Warning System's television, radio and media links can be used to provide residents with up-to-date local status reports regarding the availability of services, road conditions and resources throughout the county.



COMMUNITY WARNING SYSTEM

Together, these make up an all-hazard Community Warning System. Sirens are activated in the event of a chemical accident; the digital and radio communication links tie our county's emergency services together to form one of the most sophisticated safety systems in the United States.

The City of Richmond's Water Resource Recovery Department administers the Sewer Lateral Grant Program. The program reimburses eligible homeowners in the Richmond Municipal Sewer District (RMSD No. 1) for some of the cost to replace their sewer lateral.

The program is open and accepting applications for the 2019-2020 Fiscal Year.

Counter Hours: Monday - Friday 8:30am-4pm

The City of Richmond recommends obtaining estimates from at least three (3) contractors.

Eligibility:

- ◆ Parties served by the City of Richmond Sanitary Municipal Sewer District.
- ◆ Sewer lateral replacement must be completed **BEFORE** applying for the Sewer Lateral Grant Program.
- ◆ A full line replacement must be completed during the fiscal year July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020.
- ◆ If you have previously received a Sewer Lateral Grant reimbursement, you will not be eligible to apply.

Required Documents:

- ◆ Only Lateral Grant Applications dated 6/03/2019 or newer will be accepted.
- ◆ Contractor's final paid in full invoice.
- ◆ Proof of payment (copy of canceled check, credit card receipt, or bank statement are accepted).
- ◆ Certificate of Lateral Compliance (issued by the City after encroachment permit inspections are approved).
- ◆ Grant Deed (change of ownership taken place within last 3 months and/or if property is under a Trust).
- ◆ Tax-exempt organizations must submit proof of tax-exempt status.

Award Limits:

- Each fiscal year the City allocates sewer lateral grant funds to be awarded for private sewer lateral replacement.
- This program can be suspended at any time without prior or advanced notification or posting.
- Property owner(s) are eligible for **ONE (1)** sewer lateral grant reimbursement award in a lifetime on a first come first serve basis until all sewer lateral funds are exhausted.
- Starting July 1, 2019 and ending June 30, 2020, the complete sewer lateral grant reimbursement amount is \$1,800 per application.
- Incomplete applications will **NOT** be accepted.
- All applications **MUST** be submitted in person. Any applications submitted via email or mail will **NOT** be accepted.
- No applications will be accepted after the sewer lateral grant funds are exhausted.




