Student Relief Fund - During this time we will be discussing a recap of the meeting that Chair Ashlee, Co-Chair Ozmar and Finance Director Kashaf had with Richmond Promise Executive Director Jessie Stewart and College Access Manager Miguel Molina. We will be discussing the proposal that was drafted and making corrections if needed. Then discussing the next steps and follow up that is needed. Would like to give \$500 disbursements to help students with educational expenses such as books, school supplies, SATs for Richmond students, seek donors. The fund goal is \$10,000. Finalize the budget in February, solicit funding in March, April application process and grant funding in April</i></p> <p>I.
